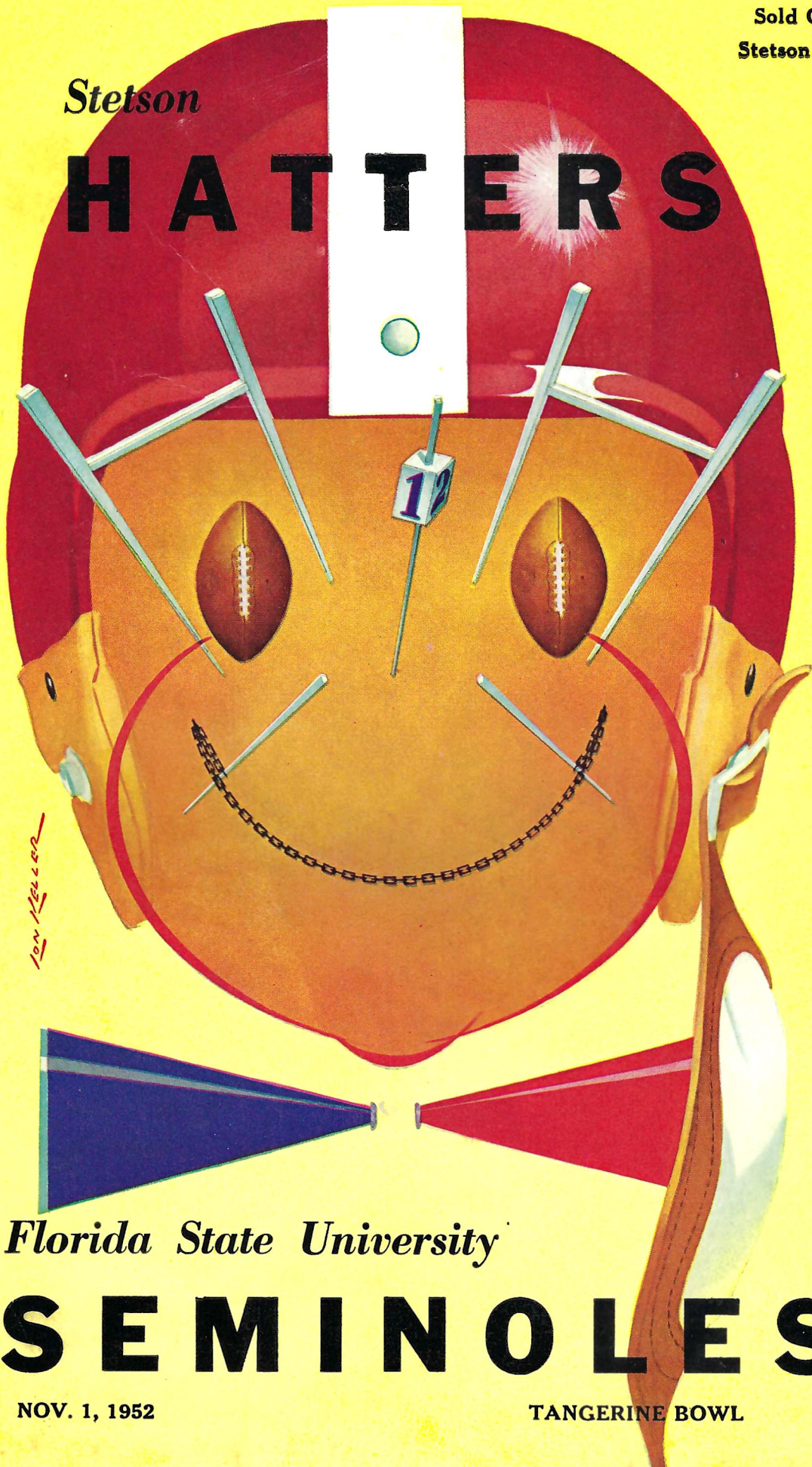

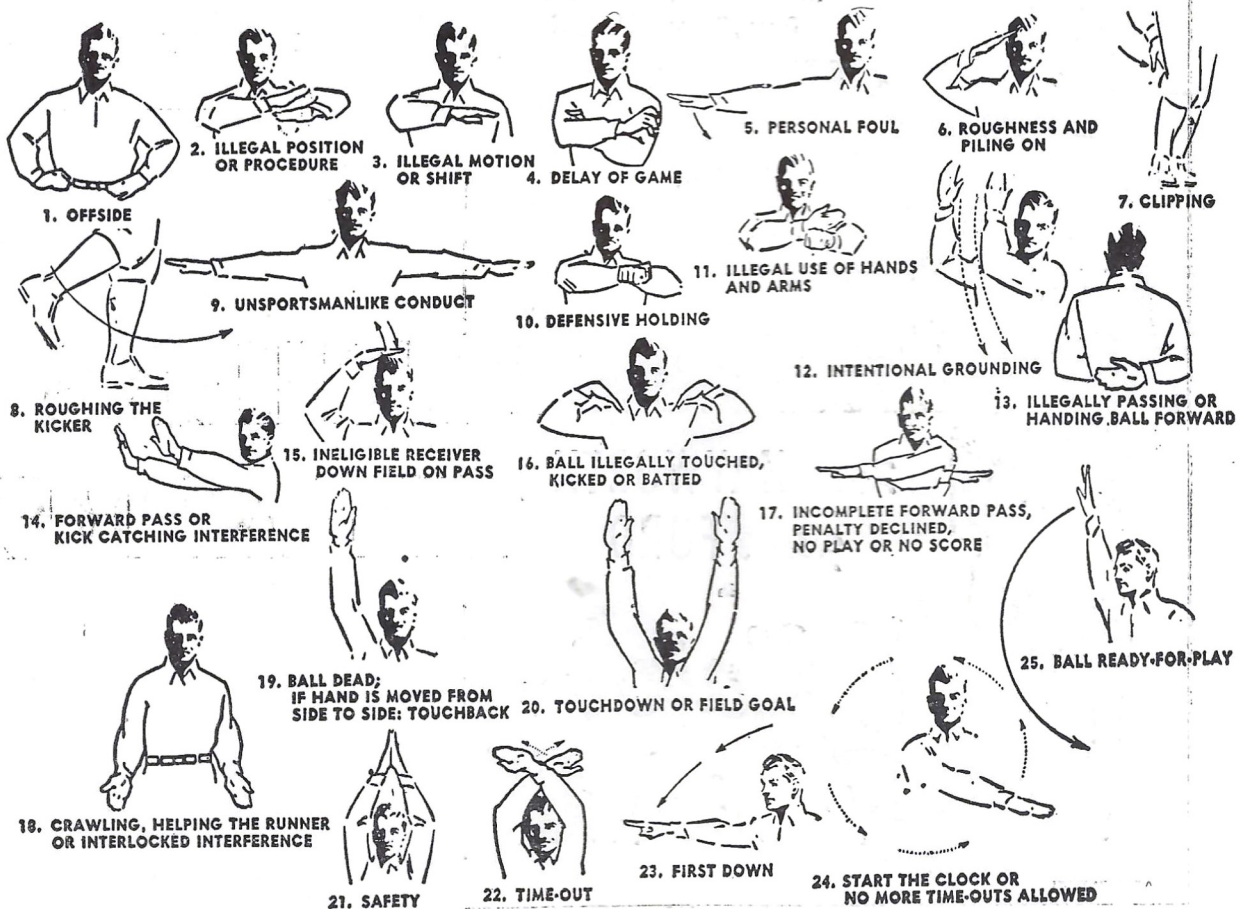

GUIDING THE 1952 HATTERS



JAY PATTEE

Coach Pattee played quarterback for Brown University in 1941, 1942 and 1943. He coached at the University of Toledo before coming to Stetson in 1950 as assistant coach. This is his first year as head coach. Pattee was the outstanding high school athlete in Rhode Island in 1939 and was honorable mention All American in 1943. In his first two years at Stetson, the Hatters won 16, lost 3 and tied 2.



W. C. COWELL

Coach Cowell came to Stetson in 1943, succeeding H. R. McQuillan as director of athletics and head football coach. He has remained director of athletics, but gave up coaching at the end of the 1949 season. He attended Kansas State Agricultural College and lettered in football, baseball and basketball. He coached at the University of Florida before coming to Stetson. His "know-how" is a great asset to athletics at Stetson.



DON HARDAGE

Coach Hardage played varsity football at Abilene Christian and was a first-string linesman on the team that became co-champions of Texas. In 1948 he coached baseball at Landon High School in Jacksonville, his home town. He was an assistant coach at Stetson in 1949 and again in 1950. Before deciding to come to Stetson this year, Hardage was to assist in football and coach cross country at Southern Methodist University.

FOOTBALL AT STETSON

Stetson University is proud of its athletic record which dates back almost to the founding of the University.

A football team wearing the Green and White of Stetson defeated the Cadets of Florida Agricultural College, now part of the University of Florida, in what the Florida Times Union in 1901 called "the beginning of intercollegiate athletics in Florida."

Football was first played at Stetson in 1894. C. B. Rosa, bursar emeritus, was coach of the "Forbes" team and this group arranged a seven-game schedule with another team known as the "Stetson" team. The college and academy played a 12-12 tie game in 1899.

The Hatters opened their 1952 season at Gainesville where they bowed to the Florida Gators 33 to 6. The following week, they romped back 40 to 20 over Northeast Louisiana. After a week's lay-off, they trounced Furman 25 to 14 and then played Tampa to a 6-6 tie. Last Saturday the Hatters bowed to Parris Island Marines 54 to 13.

Tonight's clash between the Stetson

Hatters and the Florida State University Seminoles is the sixth meeting of the two schools since 1947.

Running through the scores—Stetson was victorious in 1947, 14-6. The Seminoles won in 1948, 18-7, and again in 1949, 33-14. They came back in 1950 to stamp a 27-7 decision over the Hatters. Last year the Seminoles were almost swamped by the Hatters before they eked out a 13-10 victory.

Two things coincide to make this game tonight an all out affair. First, the Seminoles will be seeking their first win of the 1952 season and the Hatters will be out to avenge last year's close margin.

The Seminoles are competing in fast company this season as they have dropped their first four tilts. They lost to Louisiana Tech, 13-32; Louisville, 14-41; V. M. I. 7-28; and N. C. State 7-13.

Stetson holds a two won, two lost and one tied mark with losses to the Florida Gators and the Parris Island Marines and victories over N. E. Louisiana and Furman. The Hatters tied Tampa 6-6.
