



#### FSU'S GRID BIRTH DATES BACK FURTHER THAN ANY FLORIDA COLLEGE

Florida State University's football history is unique to say the least.

The Seminoles' grid birth dates back further than any Florida college, yet they have played fewer games than their state brethren.

It was in 1901 that FSU started booting the pigskin around. The Tallahassee officials continued football for four years until they were forced to suspend the sport because the school "went to the girls." (FSU became a women's college in 1905 and continued to operate on that basis until 1947.)

Florida State has won 37 games, lost 17, and tied one. However, the records don't show who they played back at the turn of the century. As a matter of fact they don't even state how many games they won or lost in 1903.

In their last year before the women took over, Florida State was awarded a silver cup which signified it won the state championship. That's all we know about the "early years."

When Florida State became co-ed again in 1947 football was resumed. The results were disastrous that first year. The girls probably could have done as well.

Not only did the Seminoles fail to break into the wire column but they were limited to but 18 points. Troy State handed FSU its greatest margin of defeat that year 36-6.

Then a man by the name of Don Veller came along. The

youthful mentor guided the Seminoles to three straight Dixie Conference titles in 48, 49, and 50, rolling up 24 wins against only two losses.

Last year FSÚ took on a semi-bigtime schedule playing the University of Miami and losing, 35-13. The Seminoles still had a respectable six and two record and were represented on the Little All-American team by guard Bill Dawkins, a Miamian.

Again this year Florida State is taking on an ambitious slate, including Georgia Tech.

Probably the best FSU grid year was 1950 when the Tallahassee boys won eight and lost none. In 1949 it wasn't bad, either. That year the Seminoles lost only one game while winning nine.

Stetson is FSU's oldest and most played "known" rival. This is only because the Seminoles played the Hatters in their first game in the comeback year of 1947. Incidentally, Stetson won that game, 14-6, and hasn't beaten FSU since.

Whiting Field fell prey to Florida State's biggest scoring spree when it was trounced, 74-0, in 1949. The Seminoles rolled up their highest season total that fall, 272 points in nine games.

In its only journey to a bowl game, FSU whipped Wofford, 19-6, in the Cigar Bowl in 1949.

## Sports at Furman:..

Furman University's athletic scene has been undergoing a rebuilding program since the end of World War II. The mighty Purple Hurricane was a much feared opponent prior to the Great War, but had to abolish all collegiate athletic activity during the war.

Since the end of World War II Furman has been climbing steadily back up the ladder to the former great heights which it had held in athletics.

Furman's first big step back into the powerful collegiate circle was the basketball team of last year. That team ended its season with an 18-5 record. During this time school spirit returned to the campus which had long since acquired a "defeatist" attitude toward athletics—not understanding the hearthaches which must go with a rebuilding program.

Now, the 1952 Furman football team has caught the same spirit and is headed toward its best season since 1940. Last week the Purple Hurricane ended a 12-year drought of haphazard football and losing records as it won its fifth game of the season, while losing two and tieing one. When the Big Purple team defeated Wofford, 29-21, on November 1, it bettered any record a Furman football team has had in the last 12 years. The closest any other of their teams had come to this record was a mere three victories. Then last week the Purple got win No. 5 at the expense of Presbyterian.

The Furman teams of the past have held their own with Florida teams, with the exception of two losses to Stetson. Furman has played the University of Florida six times and has won three of the games while losing three; they have played the University of Miami two times and also split that count at one win and one loss. Stetson proved to be the

thorn in Furman's football hopes for the past two years as the Underdog Hatters have managed to win both games, with counts of 21-20 and 25-14.

The Furman grid gladiators started this season of 1952 off with a big bang as they whipped little Newberry 47-6 and then ignored pre-game predictions to upset a highly touted West Virginia Mountaineer team 22-14. The upset win over West Virginia was a costly one for the Purple Hurricane, however, as they lost the services of first string quarterback Gene Pedrick, a junior from Fitzgerald, Ga., and Russell Sutton, junior All-Southern halfback candidate from Sumter, S. C. Pedrick ranked second in the Southern Conference passing division last year by tossing for 1,001 yards and Sutton was in second place in the rushing division with 745 yards to his credit for an everage of 5.4 yards per try. Sutton was also one of Furman's leading pass catchers as he gathered in 23 passes for 281 yards.

After the Purple Hurricane lost the services of Pedrick and Sutton it went into a slump which saw them losing to South Carolina, 27-7, and Stetson, 25-14, and then tieing a third game which they should have won by deadlocking with The Citadel, 7-7. The Furman team hit its old winning ways again against Davidson by edging past with a 14-13 victory and then coming from behind two early touchdowns by Wofford to win 29-21. Then last week Presbyterian was win No. 5.


Pedrick and Sutton should be ready to go at full steam against Florida State's Seminoles and should be in the best shape since their injuries in the West Virginia game.

The Furman team realizes that homecoming affairs are dangerous business for the visiting team and will have to just sit back and try to weather the enthusiastic bursts of school spirit set up by the occasion.




