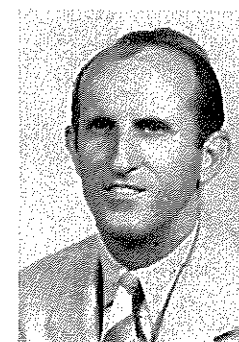


## Third meeting with Florida State

THIS third meeting with Florida State tonight, marking the 1955 home debut of Andy Gustafson's University of Miami Hurricanes, looms as the most interesting and colorful of the series to date.

FSU comes here with what stacks up as its greatest grid team in history. The school has been building for the past couple of years under the excellent tutorage of Tom Nugent, colorful coach and inventor of the "I" formation, and is bent on springing the football upset of the year.



Nugent makes no bones about it that his Seminoles are fired to their highest pitch in three years and will shoot the works through the air lanes in hopes of gaining national recognition by knocking off the nationally ranked Hurricanes.

Nugent has 24 lettermen back this fall, including an all-American candidate, flankman Tom Feamster, a 250 pound giant who towers six feet, 7 inches. Feamster is one of the main targets for Quarterback Victor Prinzi, who along with George Norman and Len Swantic will be tossing footballs all over the field tonight.

Lee Corso, the former Miami Jackson sensation, called by Nugent the greatest halfback in the state, tonight will run from the FSU left half

post. FSU followers warn that this elusive gridder is going to be hard to bowl over if he manages to wiggle into an open field.

Both Feamster and Corso were named on the State Sports Writers all-state college team last year for their brilliance in leading the Seminoles to eight triumphs.

As for the Hurricanes—they're not looking for a push-over tonight. This 1955 edition of University of Miami is made up of a larger part of the great '54 Hurricane outfit and, in manner, bears considerable semblance to the team of last year. In plain words, they don't like the bitter pill of defeat. Remember what they did to poor Alabama last year after Auburn put a small dent in their proud unbeaten record.

Miami will hit hard tonight and go to the air lanes a lot more than they did against Georgia Tech, a team the Hurricanes should have beaten by at least two touchdowns. The Hurricanes were a better ball club than Tech, but ran into every imaginable bad break that could be bestowed upon an athletic team. Tech scored two "un-earned runs" as Jack Harding, U-M athletic director put it.

Both Mario Bonofiglio and Gene Reeves are expected to fill the sky with aerial bombs tonight. Since the luckless Tech game, there has been a heavy concentration on the aerial game and the Hurricanes proved in practice sessions that they have a passing game that cannot be taken lightly by the opposition. This lad Reeves has been passing like a young demon in practice, and you can bet your boots that he will be in there tonight chunking, and chunking aplenty.

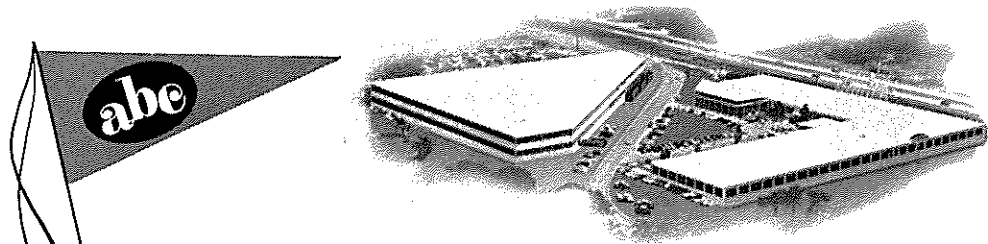
You can look for more passing from Bonofiglio, too. He has been sharpening his aerial arm since the Tech battle and will be a threat in more ways than one tonight. His receivers, Bob Nolan, Phil Bennett, John Melwid and Harry Osinga, are ready for the slingshot firing of young Gene Reeves and the firing of Mario Bonofiglio.

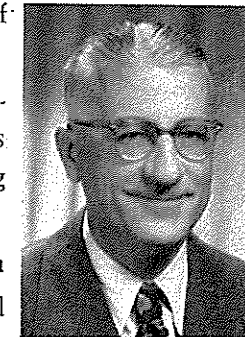
## It's About Those New Rules

THE talented and learned gentlemen who write football news in the daily prints, or discuss it with you over the air with or without the benefit of a 21-inch screen are guilty of a great disservice to you in not telling you about the changes in the football rules for 1955.

Every year, coaches from all over the country are polled on what rule changes they have to suggest. There is a rule committee of 11 men and an advisory committee of three coaches, three commissioners and three representatives of high schools.

There are three sub committees of three members each to go into this thing seriously.

They have meetings, a lot of correspondence and all that sort of thing.



But do you know what the rule changes of 1955 are? (If you do, don't answer. You are supposed to admit that you don't. How else can we fill this page?)

No, of course you don't. Happily, we are here to do the job, to lift the veil of secrecy, to tear away the bandages of ignorance, to shatter the something or other of the iron curtain, so with no further ado, here goes:

If you wish to check our information, all you have to do is to spend \$1 for a copy of the 1955 Official Football Guide and turn to the rules section in the back. There it says that the major changes in the rules are explained on Page 42. It does not say where the minor changes are, but let us be content with what we have, so to Page 42—

Mnn, hmm, 26.....32.....36.....44— whoops, went past. Well, back to 42—ah yes, here it is—

page 42, rule 10, section 2—"becomes incomplete or if the foul is committed"—is that right? No, here it is, at the bottom,—Rule Changes—"1-4-5 Item 'f' amended to authorize the use of shoe cleats with rounded ends."

There's more to this than meets the eye. At first blush, it doesn't seem to be much. At second, however, the social significances begin to come into view and it is plain to see that severe economic displacements may result unless the proper federal subsidies and price supports are maintained.

It certainly is clear that this rule means the passing of shoe cleats with flat ends and, necessarily, a sharp decline in the production of flat headed cleats. While, conversely, it means that the production of rounded cleats will increase, it is by no means assured that the increase for the one will compensate for the decrease in the other.

Rounded cleats may last longer, thus making replacements less necessary and further depressing the manufacturer.

Furthermore, a community manufacturing flat headed cleats will have thousands of men laid off while machinery is converted to manufacture round headed cleats. By the time the conversion is completed, the market may have been lost to other manufacturers specializing in round headed cleats. There must have been somebody making them to create a demand for the rules change, anyway.

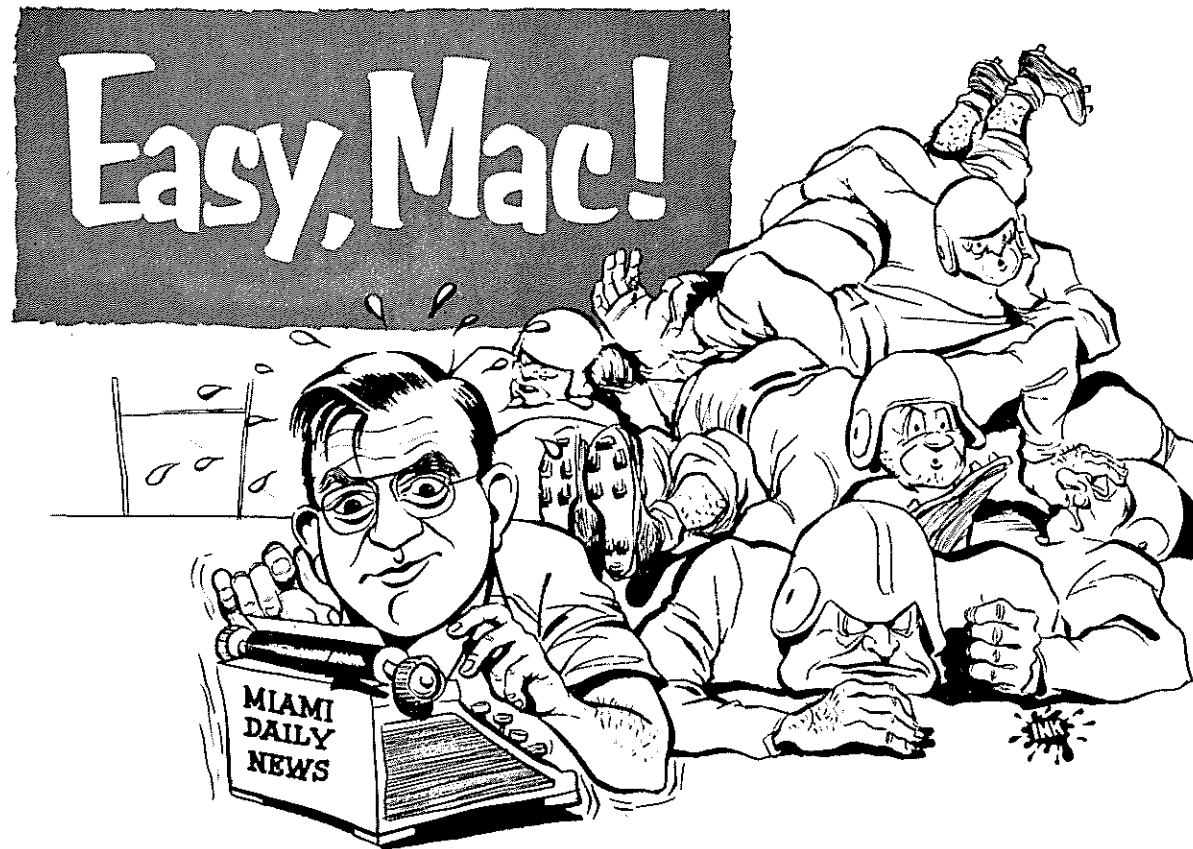
The more we think of it, the more we think a Congressional committee should investigate the matter. This may well be a Communistic inspired move to disrupt our national economy and thus destroy our way of life.

The other rules changes? Who cares? It still counts six points when you score a touchdown and that's all that matters—besides, they are getting ready to kick off down there, chum, so watch, don't yap!

## Notre Dame Next Week

IF YOU don't have a ticket now, be sure to make a reservation near a TV set next Friday night, otherwise you'll not get to see the Miami-Notre Dame football game. All 75,500 tickets have been sold, but you can get a look-see on TV.

The South's largest football crowd will be on hand to see Notre Dame make its first visit to Florida on a football mission, a game which must convince one and all that Miami has come of age in gridiron circles.

The 17-0 shattering of Southern Methodist by a confident, poised and hard hitting Notre Dame surprised none of the real football experts who are never fooled by any statements from South Bend that the Irish won't measure up to past standards.

The only difference between Notre Dame football teams is that some are greater than others. The flow of talent never dries up and though a whole team may graduate, a well tested, powerful unit is ready to step in and take over.

Though Notre Dame lost its 1954 line save for one man and though it suffered backfield losses which would have crippled other teams, the Irish were ready as the S.M.U. game shows.

Only possible weakness in the Notre Dame setup—and one which will disappear rapidly as the season progresses—is that the reserve units have not had enough game experience to keep the Irish attack and defense functioning in the usual flawless Notre Dame style. However, the talent is there and it is only a question of time before the Irish will be powerful and deep in every position.

Though 17 lettermen graduated, the Irish retained 18 lettermen for this year's squad and those lettermen were pretty important performers last year when Notre Dame rolled to nine victories as against one lone defeat.

Shutting out Southern Methodist for the first time in the seven games played by the two schools is sufficient proof that this Irish team may have what Notre Dame terms a "green" line—they're all lettermen—but they're using men and not boys up front. Every previous S.M.U. team has scored at least twice against Notre Dame. Last year, Notre Dame's great team could lick S.M.U. only 26-14 in a game in which S.M.U. was supposedly crippled.

The Irish are star studded in the backfield where the all America pickers who generally allot one spot to Notre Dame automatically are already eyeing Paul Hornung, the 205 pounder who looks to be a dream quarterback in the split T, even though his passing against S.M.U. was ineffective. But given a slashing fullback like Don Schaefer, who averaged 5.4 yards per carry last year to outgain Joe Heap and the rest of the Notre Dame backs; a hard hitting veteran halfback like Jim Morse and a will-o-wisp like Aubrey Lewis, one of the nation's leading sprinters and you don't have to pass very much. Behind them are four senior and junior veterans.

It'll be a well conditioned, hard hitting Notre Dame team which comes to Miami next Friday night, ready and willing to play a smashing football game.

Which is why 75,500 fans will be in the Orange Bowl because Notre Dame teams always play that kind of football.

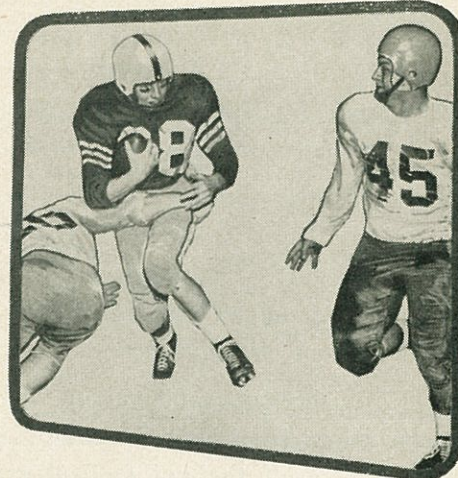

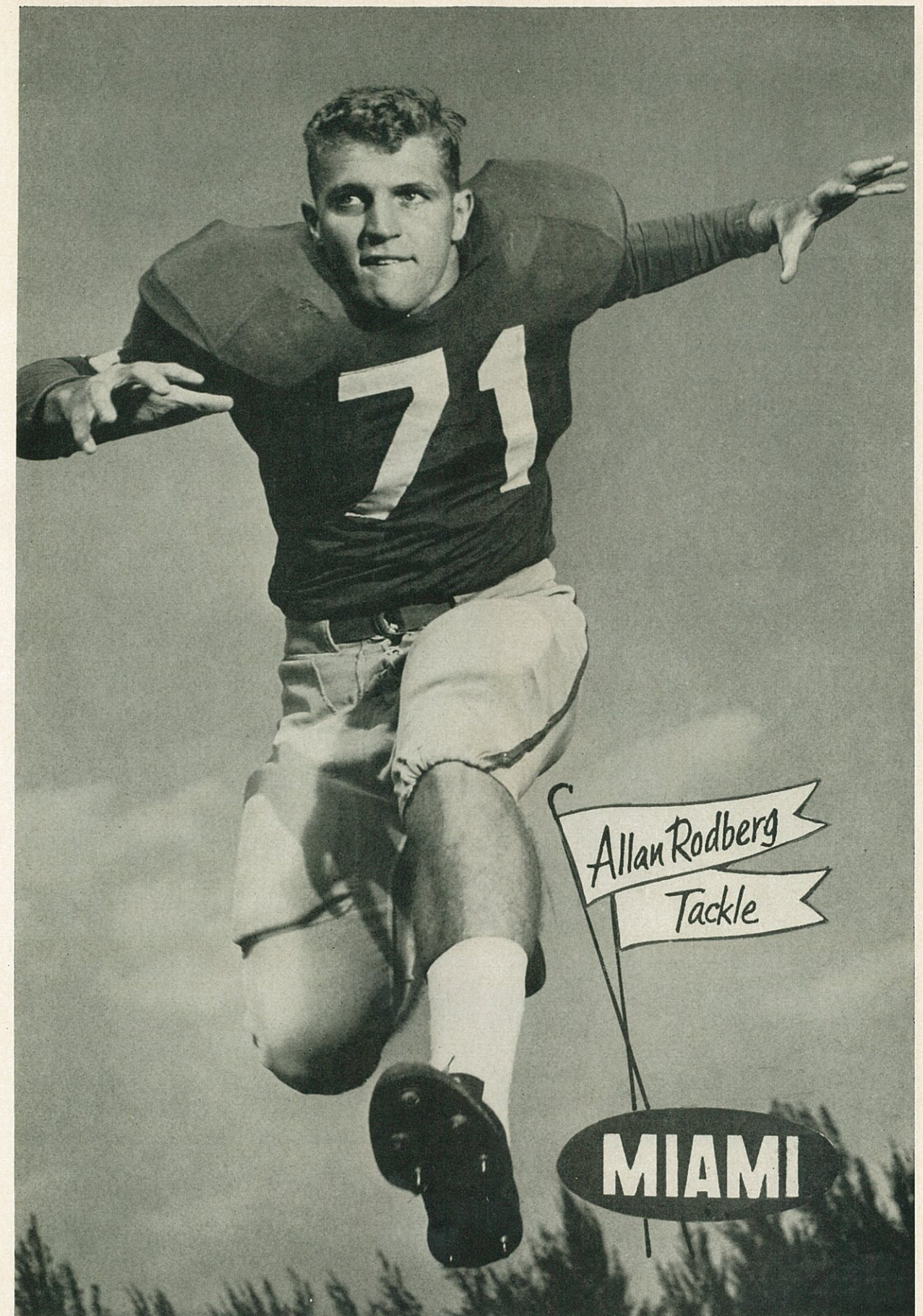

## In the Enemy Camp

RARELY if ever have U of Miami gridiron opponents opened their football seasons as impressively as the teams on Miami's 1955 slate.

After two weeks of play, all save Alabama have won at least once and only Alabama and Florida have bowed—each while making an excellent showing.

All of which means stirring football in the Orange Bowl in the weeks to come . . . and no soft spots for the Hurricanes along the way. Most of the teams on Miami's schedule are favored to go right on winning this week, too.

Notre Dame, highly impressive as it dismembered bigger and supposedly more experienced Southern Methodist 17-0 last week, is expected to defeat Indiana for the 19th time in their 25-game series. Though the Hoosiers may bother the Irish some in the air, they have been beset with injuries this fall and came out of the Michigan State game so badly bruised that they have little chance for an upset.

Texas Christian, Miami's Oct. 21 foe, was touted as a dark horse since it returned 26 of 31 lettermen from a team which lost five games by a touchdown or less last year. The wraps were off last week as TCU mauled Texas Tech 32-0 just one week after Tech upset mighty Texas. TCU rolled to a 26-0 half time score and coasted home. A week ago, TCU ripped Kansas 47-14 and so is second only to Southern California in point scoring this year. TCU has not yet shown much passing attack, a weak spot in 1954 and this could again be fatal. This week brings a big one as the team journeys to Fayetteville to play Arkansas, 1954 Southwest league champion, and TCU is a strong favorite.

Pittsburgh, keyed high Sept. 17 to overthrow California, took 30 minutes to shake off the "let down jitters" last week but got straightened away in the final half to run away from Syracuse 22-12.

The Panthers were trying to hold back a little for Oklahoma this week and may have turned the trick. Oklahoma ran all over the field against North Carolina but blew chance after chance. They'll be mad this time. Should be quite a ball game.

Boston college, with several key men out with the virus, was only 7-0 over Brandeis in the first half, but got organized to make it 27-0 at the finish. This could be a New England championship team. The Eagles rest up this week before playing Villanova in what should be another rest.

Bucknell, rebuilding well, tripped strong Albright 25-14 and mixes with highly regarded Gettysburg this week.

Alabama, also rebuilding very well, did an amazing job in holding Rice, touted the best in the Southwest, 0-0 for three periods before bowing, 21-0. Word from the Tide camp was that the club would spring some surprises before the season ended and they nearly came up with one at the start. This is a somewhat lighter but much faster Alabama club being put together at Tuscaloosa and it is no aggregation of greenhorns.

Florida, termed Bob Woodruff's best by the Florida coach himself before the season opened, is 1-1 in the conference. The Gators tripped Mississippi State in their opener—and then saw State take Tennessee the following week to enhance Florida's rating. The Gators held Georgia Tech 7-7 until the final 3 minutes and 10 seconds of play. Florida has two things to make it dangerous—a tenacious defensive line which can stall many a goal line drive and a flock of backs who can go all the way, led by Jackie Simpson. The Gators draw another toughie this week in Auburn, traditionally a Gator jinx. Auburn loses few games at home—and this one will be played at Auburn. The Auburn club looked very bad against Chattanooga but Coach Shug Jordan was only practicing. It'll be a hum dinger with Auburn primed to avenge a 19-13 loss last year.

Georgia Tech, now 2-0, faces Southern Methodist in Atlanta and it should be Tech all the way on speed.

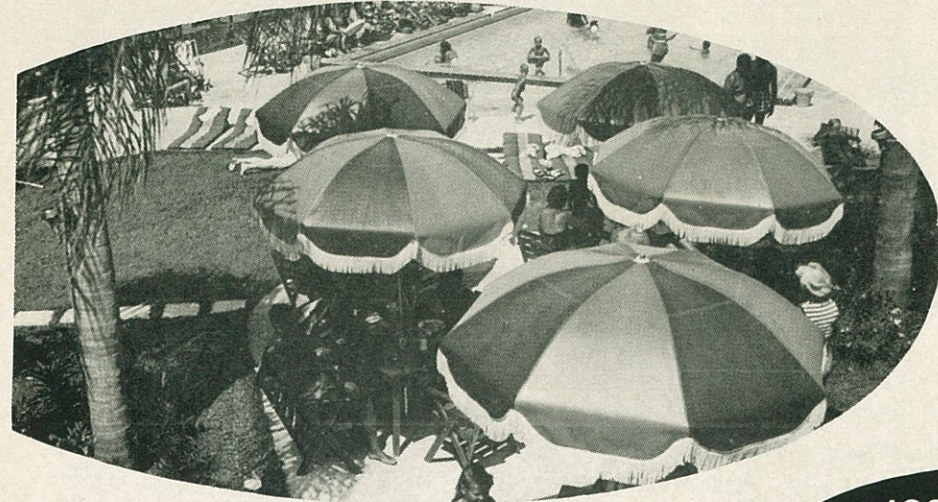

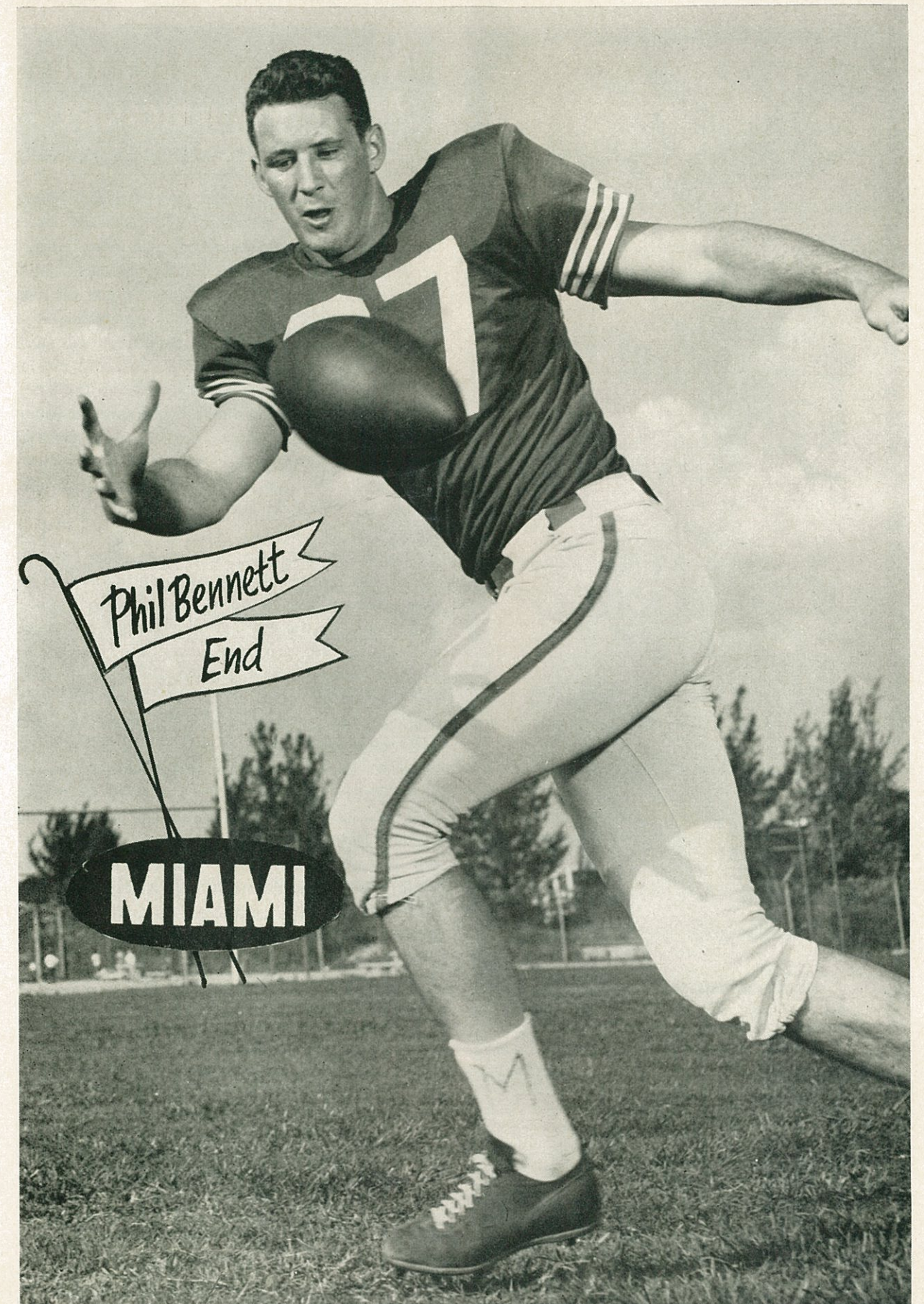

☆ JACK LOSCH, senior left halfback from Williamsport, Pa., is one of the finest defensive halfbacks in the business. In the very precise grading system used by the Hurricanes, Jack scored a 4.50 out of a possible 5 points against Georgia Tech—and since a 3.50 rating is exceptional—his defensive score against the Engineers was well nigh phenomenal. Jack is fast, smart and tackles hard. However, he has had a somewhat checkered career with the Hurricanes. On his freshman squad, he appeared to have breakaway possibilities as he turned loose several long touchdown gallops—and then went on to prove himself the fastest runner in school by becoming the 100-yard dash man on the track team. He's lettered three times in track and last year doubled on the baseball squad to win another letter as an outfielder. However, as a sophomore, he just could not get going, and wound up the year carrying the ball only once on offense, for a dismal loss. He was pretty much at the bottom of the list of halfbacks when fall practice got going a year ago. Coaches, however, just didn't figure that a 185-pound halfback with such tremendous speed should be allowed to go to seed, began working Jack in on defense and discovered they had a prize on their hands. He's one of the prime reasons the pass defense became tight after the dismal early season showing against Holy Cross. Later when Gordon Malloy was slowed and finally sidelined by injuries, it was Losch who came through on offense as well. He ran brilliantly against Florida, caught several passes and in general wound up a very good junior year. On offense against Tech, he did not show to as much advantage as the other three members of the backfield, due in all probability to the fact that he just hasn't had too much actual game experience on offense. Seventeen running plays doesn't constitute much of a running background. Chances are, he'll develop very well in this respect during the campaign now under way and will emerge almost as bright a star on offense as he is on defense. He's got the speed to get up and go all the way at any time. He has the height, 6 feet, 1 inch, to reach for high forward passes and his outfielding ability stands him in good stead to bring 'em down.

☆ BOB NOLAN, senior left end on the University of Miami football team, has always enjoyed a reputation as a fine pass catching end. In the Georgia Tech game, Bob became a fine end, period. He didn't catch a pass during the ball game—wasn't even a target save once but his defensive play was superb and his blocking par excellent. He answered the questions about what Miami was going to do about the loss of Tom Pepsin. On one beautiful effort against a perfectly executed wide thrust by the Tech team, he grabbed big and fast moving Stan Flowers with one hand and hung on to halt the 205-pound speedster for his one non-gaining try of the afternoon. Bob, from Wauconda, Ill., broke in as a varsity player in his freshman year and set a record which may never be equalled at Miami—in the Georgia game, he caught each of the eight forward passes thrown at him. Last year, he caught only two passes but were both for touchdowns. In the Maryland game, he made a sensational end zone catch for a score and later dumped a Maryland back in HIS end zone for the two points which gave Miami the margin of its 9-7 victory. In three years, he has caught 30 passes for 383 yards and three Miami touchdowns. Only three Hurricanes have ever caught more passes and only five have gained more yards for Miami in their careers and Bob is quite likely to finish his Miami pass catching chores as the second best receiver and second or third best ground gainer on passes. Frank McDonald is first in both respects.

☆ ALLAN RODBERG, senior left tackle, has manned that post ever since he entered the University of Miami. Though his weight of 206 pounds is about 15 or 20 under what the coaches would like, Rodberg has the speed and agility to carry him to success. His experience makes him even better and he's one of the nation's better tackles. He got starting assignments even as a freshman and, as soon as he learned two-way football as a sophomore, he became a fixture in the starting lineup. He averaged 45 minutes a game last year, leading all the linemen in number of minutes played last year as he took part in 660 plays. Rodberg is a home grown product, having graduated at Miami Jackson high school. His greatest 1954 game was against Baylor in which his defensive prowess wrecked the Bears and made him the Player of the Week.
