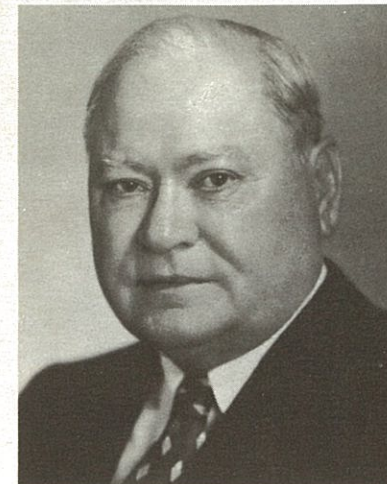




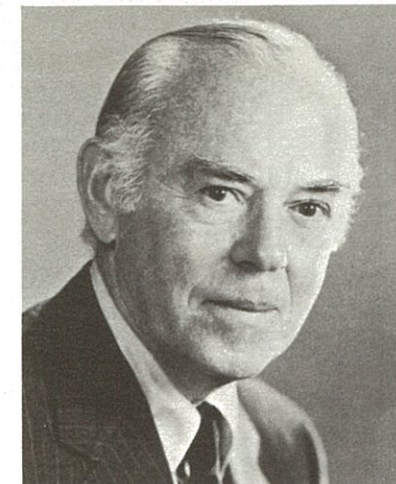


## BOARD OF REGENTS

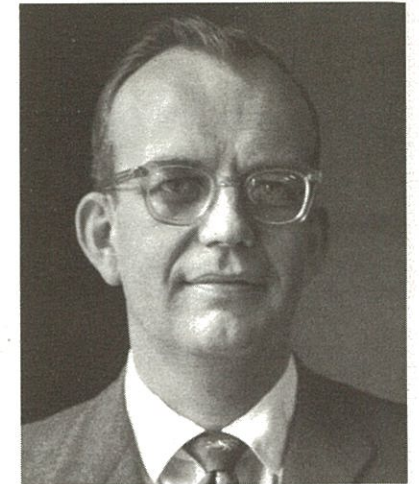

HEAD FOOTBALL COACH BILL YEOMAN

There is no doubt that Bill Yeoman, who is in his 10th season as head football coach at the University of Houston, is the most imaginative coach in the Southwest, if not the nation.

Yeoman's Cougar teams, using the often copied Houston Option and Houston Veer-T offense, have lead the nation in total offense for three of the past five seasons, averaging almost 500 yards per game during that period. The 1968 Cougar team set an all-time NCAA record for total offense of 562 yards per game, breaking the existing record by more than 80 yards a contest. Houston's ground attack was also the nation's best in 1967 and 1968.

Playing colorful, exciting, game-breaking football, Yeoman has watched his teams compile the best all-round record in the state of Texas for the past five years against the state's toughest schedules. Houston's 1969 team set a school record with nine straight wins, including a 36-7 win over Auburn in the Astro-Bluebonnet Bowl.

He has often said, "You play defense for the coaches and offense for the fans." His teams reflect this. Yeoman's University of Houston elevens have broken more than 300 school records in his nine-year tenure.

Twelve of his UH players, Ken Hebert, Warren McVea, Greg Brezina, Paul Gipson, Rich Stotter, Johnny Peacock, Royce Berry, Jim Strong, Bill Bridges, Jerry Drones, Elmo Wright, and Charlie Hall, have earned All-America honors.

The 43-year-old Yeoman came to the UH campus in December, 1961, from an eight-year stint at Michigan State University as Duffy Daugherty's top assistant. Earlier, in 1949 and 1950, he served as an assistant coach under Col. Earl "Red" Blaik at West Point.

Though he was born in Elnora, Indiana, and was an All-America center at the U.S. Military Academy at West Point in 1948, Yeoman has strong ties to the Southwest.



WILLIAM F. (BILL) YEOMAN
Head Coach

The 6-2, 200-pound son of a former college professor graduated from Glendale, Arizona, High School and attended Texas A&M as a freshman. His wife is the former Alma Jean Vance, a University of Texas graduate, of Bryan. Her father, Harold Vance, was the head of the petroleum engineering department at Texas A&M for 18 years and later a vice-president at the Bank of the Southwest in Houston.

Yeoman has an outstanding athletic background. He was an all-state football player and basketball star at Glendale High. He added letters in both sports at Texas A&M as a freshman before receiving his appointment to West Point in 1946.

A three-year letterman for Col. Blaik at Army, Yeoman captained the 1948 team and was a second-team All-America pick at center.

Following his graduation from the Academy, the Cougar coach assisted Blaik for the 1949 and 1950 seasons. After two years of active duty in Europe with the Army's Fourth Division, Yeoman received his Army discharge in December of 1953 as a first lieutenant.

He joined Daugherty's first staff at Michigan State a month later. Daugherty became acquainted with Yeoman while he was lecturing at an armed forces football clinic in Europe.

Yeoman became the M.S.U. defensive backfield coach in 1957. He took over the offensive backfield in 1959, which was his assignment at the time of his resignation at the Michigan school.

Yeoman has been nominated for "Coach of the Year" four times by the Football Writers of America Association. Aside from numerous appearances at coaching clinics, Yeoman was also the coach of the offensive unit for the winning Gray squad in the 1968 Blue-Gray game.

Yeoman and his wife have four children. They are: William, 20, Gary, 19; Kathy Ann, 16; and Carrie Lynn, 13. Gary is a member of the varsity football squad at The University of Texas (Austin).

UH NATION'S MOST EXPLOSIVE TEAM!

In talking about today's high-scoring game of college football, you must start with Houston.

Using the Veer-T option offense coach Bill Yeoman developed in 1966, Houston leads the nation's major colleges in both scoring (34.8-point average) and total offense (466.7 rushing-passing yards per regular-season game) over the last five years in a compilation by National Collegiate Sports Services.

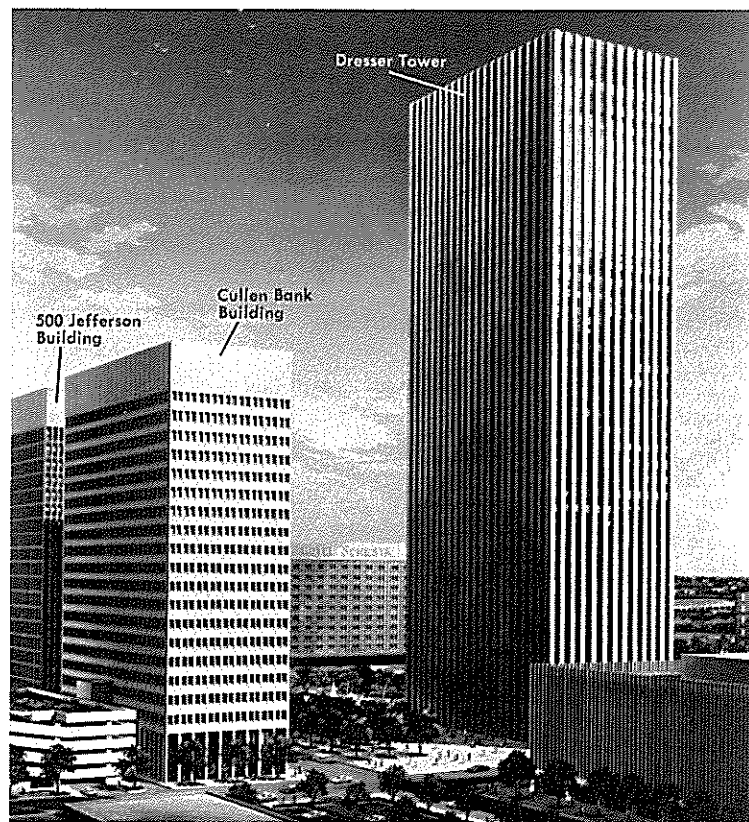
Incredibly, Houston led all major colleges in both yards per rushing play (5.3 over Texas' 4.8) and yards per pass attempt (8.1 over Notre Dame's 7.8).

The question of whether the Cougars' rushing opened things up for the passing or vice-versa is left to the purists. The result was an amazing 6.1 yards per rushing-passing play, a huge margin over runnerup Notre Dame's 5.4, (Houston ran 305 fewer plays but gained 1,338 more yards than the Irish).

Considering Houston's five-year 466.7 average historically, just four majors averaged more yards per game in any season prior to '66. Houston's highest was an all-time record of 562.0 in '68 — a remarkable 75 yards a game above the old mark. 1968 was the year Houston put together late-season, back-to-back scoring explosions of 77 and 100 points.

## HOUSTON'S DEFENSE AMONG NATION'S BEST DURING THE PAST FIVE YEARS

During the past five seasons, University of Houston defenders have been among the nation's best. In total defense, UH's "Mad Dog" 4-3 defenses held opponents to an average of 259.4 yards per game to rank 12th nationally. UH is the only Texas-based team ranking in the top 20 for the five-year period.

On the ground Houston has been double tough, allowing foes just 104.5 yards per game to rank eighth nationally. Cougar defenders are the only Texans ranked among the top 10 for the five-year period.

## TONIGHT'S GAME

Fresh from a contest with Alabama's powerful running game, Coach Bill Yeoman's Cougars must meet the challenge of one of the nation's greatest passing teams in tonight's game.

Though they outgained the 4th ranked Crimson Tide by nearly 100 yards, the Cougars gave 'Bama two chances too many and lost 34-20 in Tuscaloosa. UH's season record is now 4-2.

Florida State, tonight's foe, easily knocked off South Carolina 49-18 to push its season mark to 6-1 under first-year coach Larry Jones, the former Tennessee assistant.

Gary Huff, a junior letterman from Tampa, is the trigger man in the explosive Seminole offense. Huff tossed five touchdown passes and ran for another one in the win over South Carolina. And, this is what he has been doing all season. The 6-1, 186-pounder from Tampa is ranked among the nation's top three collegiate passers and has passed for more yards, completions and touchdowns than any other college quarterback in the country.

The Cougars will take a 7-1-2 edge in the series with FSU into this game. Houston won a nationally televised game from the Seminoles last Thanksgiving night in Tampa by a 53-21 score.

While most of the eyes have been on Florida State's high powered offense coached by former Alabama great Steve Sloan, the FSU defense coached by former Nederland, Texas, High School Coach Gene Henderson has been tremendous.

No opponent has scored more than two touchdowns in a game against the Seminoles this fall. South Carolina, in last week's losing effort 49-18, has the season high for the opposition.

Rhett Dawson, one of the nation's leaders in pass receiving, is another FSU player to watch tonight. He's already caught six touchdown passes this season, one more than he had for the entire 1970 campaign.

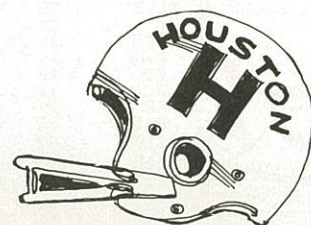
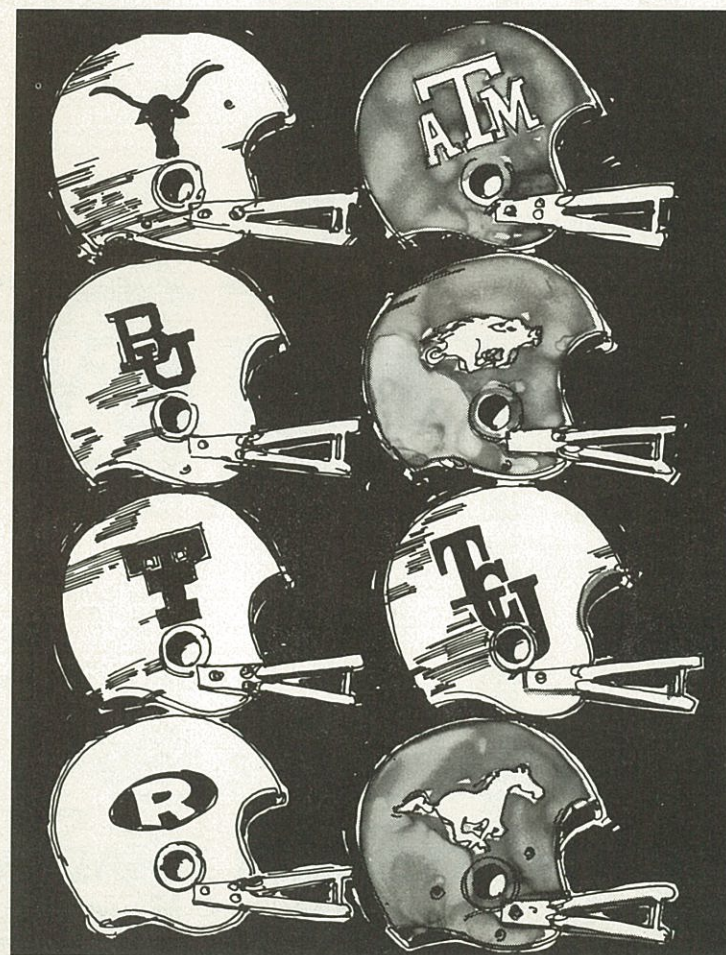
Tonight marks the 26th UH homecoming. The record stands at an even 11-11-3 to date. However, under Bill Yeoman, the Cougs are 6-2-1.

The Lombardi Award, sponsored by the Rotary Club of Houston, will go to the player chosen by a select committee of coaches and sportswriters from throughout the country.

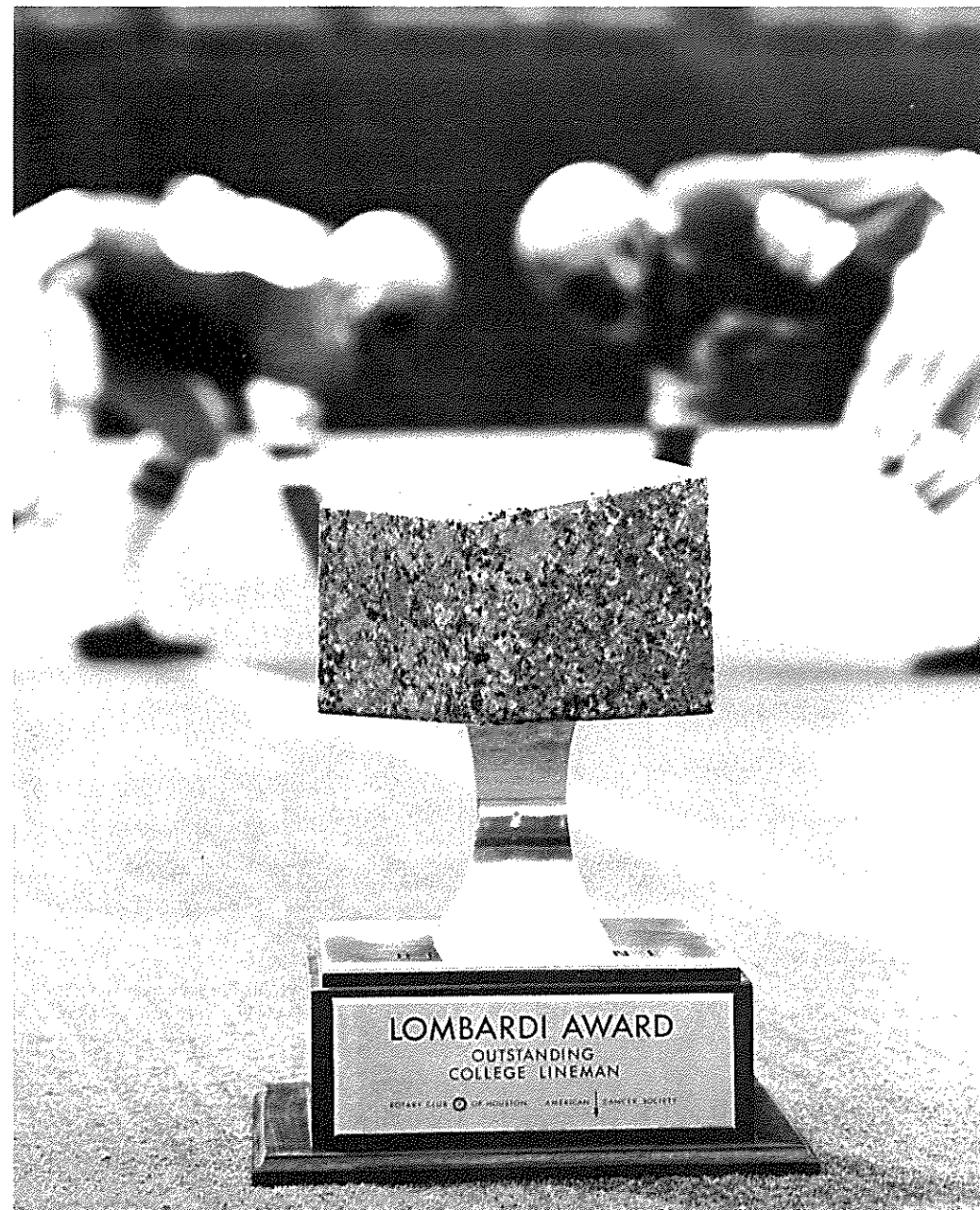
Recipient of the first Lombardi Award was Jim Stillwagon of Ohio State. He was selected from finalists including Larry Di Nardo of Notre Dame, Chip Kell of Tennessee and Rock Perdoni of Georgia Tech. All were in attendance at the first Lombardi Awards Banquet.

The Lombardi Award for linemen is unique in that a player, to be eligible, must be an offensive or defensive lineman, end-to-end, setting up no further than 10 yards to left or right of the ball; or a linebacker setting up no further than five yards deep from the line of scrimmage.

Designed by artist Mark Storm, the award is a 45-pound mounted block of granite symbolizing self-discipline, the trademark of the Lombardi style of football. Lombardi's first fame was as a member of the Fordham line that sportswriters dubbed the "Seven Blocks of Granite".

The award was conceived following Mr. Lombardi's death from cancer in September, 1970. Mrs. Marie Lombardi, the coach's widow, authorized the Rotary Club of Houston and the American Cancer Society to establish the award, the only collegiate award authorized by the Lombardi family in honor of her late husband.

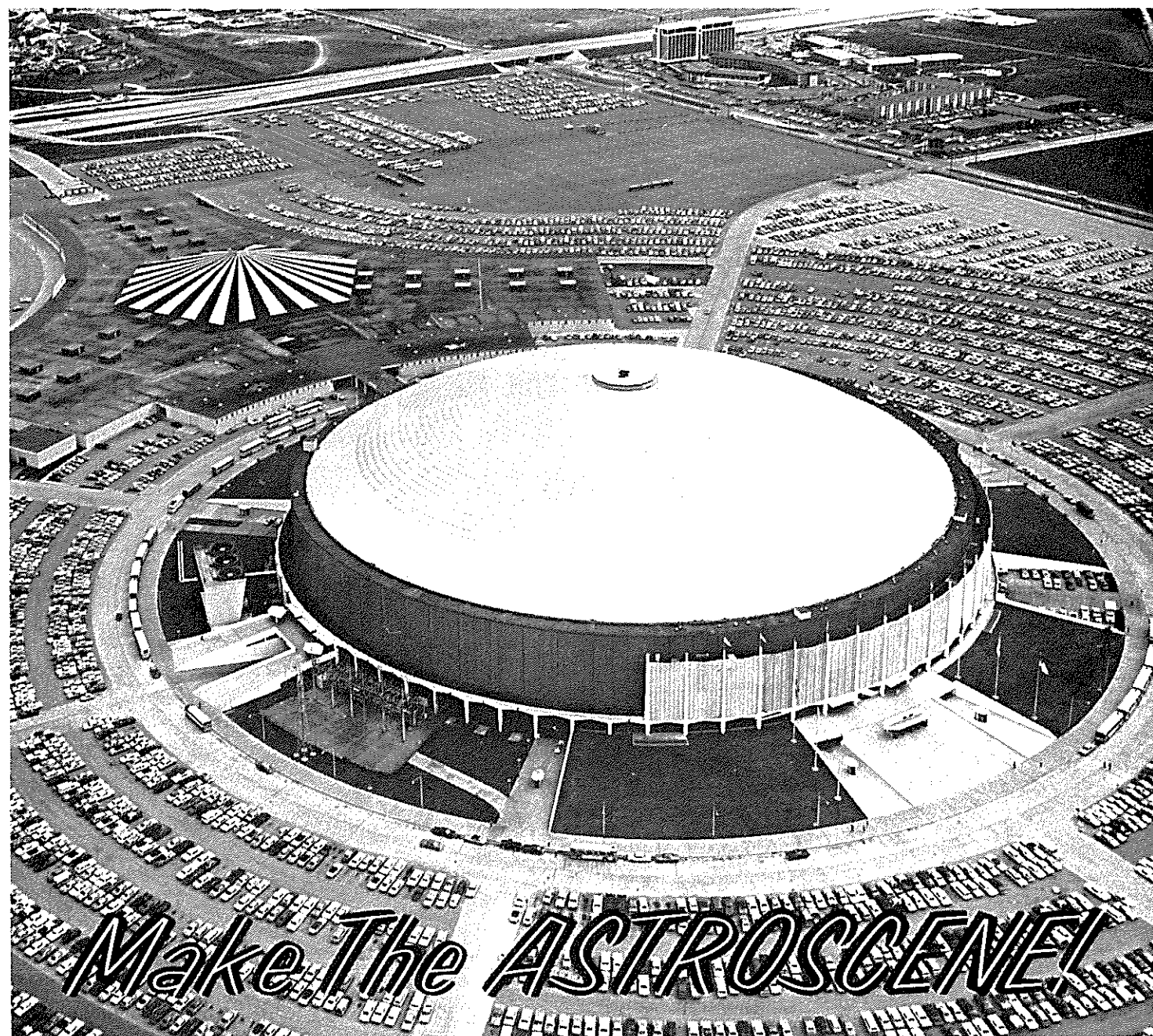

The total effect of the Cougar Marching Band, the Cougar Dolls, the flags, the twirler, the co-drum majors, both visual and aural, is Patterns of Motion.

The Band's total basses is 16. Other instruments include: 35 trombones, full sections of 12 mellophoniums, 16 baritone horns, 10 E flat trumpets, 30 saxes, 40 clarinets, and 30 flutes and piccolos. The percussion strength is at 24. It all adds up to a fantastic sound.

It is interesting to note that many bands throughout the country are performing Soundpower arrangements that were introduced and performed by the Cougar Marching Band.
