





ROBERT MARSTON PRESIDENT



Dr. Robert Quarles Marston was born in Toano, Virginia, February 12, 1923. He earned his B.S. from Virginia Military Institute in 1943, his M.D. from Medical College of Virginia in 1947, a B.Sc. from Oxford University in 1949 where he was a Rhodes Scholar from 1947-49.

Marston received honorary degrees from the College of William and Mary, 1969; Albany Medical College, Union University, 1969. He was an intern with Johns Hopkins Hospital from 1949-50 and a resident of Vanderbilt University Hospital, 1950-51, Medical College of Virginia, 1953-54 and assistant professor of medicine in 1954.

Marston was assistant professor of bacteriology and immunology at the University of Minnesota, 1958-59 and was associate professor of medicine and assistant dean in charge of student affairs at the Medical College of Virginia, 1959-61. He was dean of the University of Mississippi School of Medicine, 1961-66, director of the Medical Center, 1961-65 and vice chancellor, 1965-66.

He served as the associate director of the division of regional medical programs at the National Institute of Health, 1966-68; administrator of Federal Health Services and Mental Health Administration, 1968. He became director of the NIH, Bethesda, Maryland in 1968 and in 1973 was elected scholar-inresidence by the faculty of the University of Virginia School of Medicine.

Marston is married to the former Ann Carter Garnett and is the father of three children—Ann, Robert and Wesley.



RAY GRAVES DIRECTOR F ATHLETICS

When Ray Graves stepped down as Head Football Coach at the University of Florida on December 30, 1969, he completed a decade unmatched by any previous Gator coach.

As Director of Athletics Graves provides the leadership to keep the UF athletic program in the position it attained during the 1960's, a period in which Gator athletic teams won a shade under 70 percent of their contests and captured the Southeastern Conference All-Sports Championship five times. His overall football mark of 70-31-4 is the best in school history.

Florida athletic teams have won two NCAA golf titles and 20 SEC crowns during Graves' 15 years as Director of Athletics.

As a coach, Graves left many contributions to the game of football in general. He is recognized as one of the originators in perfecting the shifting defense now commonly called the "Monster Defense". Graves perfected this defense while coaching the defense at Georgia Tech in the 1950's.

Graves is married to the former Opal Richardson of Tazwell, Tenn., and they have three daughters, Becky (Mrs. Bill Shaw), Kathy and Beth.

UNIVERSITY FACTS

GENERAL INFORMATION

The University of Florida, located in Gainesville, is a coeducational state university and land-grant college with a faculty of 2,500 and a student body of 27,000. The physical plant is valued at more than \$250 million and includes more than 700 buildings on 2,000 acres.

The University has conferred more than 90,000 degrees since its founding. There are 5,000 individual courses offered providing 90 areas of instructional specialization for undergraduates and more than 50 specialities for doctoral degrees.

Tracing its beginning to 1853 (founding date of the East Florida Seminary, one of six state-supported institutions consolidated in 1905 to form the University of Florida), classes on the present campus first were held in 1906.

There have been seven presidents; Dr. Andrew Sledd (1905-09), Dr. Albert A. Murphree (1909-28), Dr. John J. Tigert (1928-47), Dr. J. Hillis Miller (1947-53), Dr. J. Wayne Reitz (1955-67), Dr. Stephen C. O'Connell (1967-73) and Dr. Robert Q. Marston (1974-).

COLLEGES

Encompassing 16 colleges and two schools, the University offers programs ranging from general to highly specialized education. It is unique in that all of its colleges are located on a single campus where the professional skills represented in the various departments can combine for interdisciplinary work.

Academic divisions include the College of Agriculture, Architecture and Fine Arts, Arts and Sciences, Business Administration, Dentistry, Education, Engineering, Health Related Professions, Journalism and Communications, Law, Medicine, Nursing, Pharmacy, Physical Education, Health and Recreation, along with the University College, School of Forest Resources and Conservation and the Graduate School. A College of Veterinary Medicine is in planning stages.

SERVIC

In addition to numerous research projects in the colleges, the University has specialized laboratories carrying on continuous basic research in engineering, science, agriculture, forestry, business, public administration, architecture, building construction and other areas which make significant contributions to private industry and government agencies.

ernment agencies.

A broad program in medical education, research and patient care is carried out in the J. Hillis Miller Health Center. The expansion program underway will provide space for the College of Dentistry and accommodate more medical and health-related students.

The Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences is the University's statewide agricultural research and educational organization. Its purpose is accomplished through 18 departments and the School of Forest Resources and Conservation in Gainesville and the efforts of 22 research and education centers throughout the state.

The Division of Continuing Education enables the University to be responsive to the varied and changing needs of Florida's citizens. Last year 72,000 people obtained educational opportunities through credit, non-credit and special programs of the division.

Jimmy DuBose has made running the football right into the middle of the line an exciting, eyecatching event. He's "8.3 yards and a cloud of dust" in the Gator offense.

Well, a "cloud of dust" on fields other than the one here at Florida Field. Here that would have to be amended to read "a pile of nylon."

Anyhow, DuBose has carried the football 65 times this season, each and every time being a run up the middle, and he's gained 561 yards for that average of 8.3 yards every carry.

His touchdown run of 80 yards last week against Vanderbilt was the longest of his career, surpassing a couple of high school scoring jaunts in the mid-70 range and the 74-yard TD cruise he took against Mississippi State.

"Jimmy plays with great intensity, both in practice and in games," says Gator offensive coordinator Jimmy Dunn. "Add to that the fact he is just a super athlete in terms of ability, quickness and speed and you come up with the best fullback I've ever coached."


This year, according to Dr. Paul Hounchell, chairman of the event, the scholarship check will be doubled in amount from \$500.00 to \$1,000.00.

HEAD FOOTBALL COACH

Doug Dickey, a 1954 graduate of the University of Florida, returned to his alma mater as Head Football Coach on December 30, 1969, bringing with him credentials as one of the nation's finest football coaches.

In 11 seasons as a head coach, he has compiled a record of 77-40-5, had seven bowl teams, two Southeastern Conference championship teams and was named the league's coach of the year two times.

Dickey, 42, began his head coaching career at the University of Tennessee in 1964, and after an initial rebuilding year his teams ran up five consecutive seasons of eight or more wins, the only team in the nation to accomplish this over this period


Dickey has spent most of his life on college campuses, having been born in Vermillion, South Dakota, home of South Dakota State University, where his late father, Dallas Dickey, was a speech professor. The Dickeys later moved to Louisiana State University and then on to the University of Florida.

Dickey went to high school in Gainesville and attended the University of Florida, where he played quarterback and guided the Gators to the 1953 Gator Bowl crown.

His coaching career began in 1954 at St. Petersburg (Fla.) H.S., continued at Fort Carson, Colorado (1955-56), University of Arkansas (1957-63) and then to Tennessee and, eventually, Florida.

Dickey is active in community work. He has been state chairman for the Easter Seal Drive and the Cancer Fund Drive, as well as involvement in work with the Fellowship of Christian Athletes.

Dickey is married to the former Jo Ann Beville and they have four sons, Don 20, Danny 19, David 17 and Darrell 14, and a daughter, Jaren Ann 8.









Athlete, Coach—James A. Van Fleet

The pay for coaching football at the University of Florida in the early 1920s would not propel a man into an early and plush retirement. But the fringe benefits were excellent.

"If you can coach a football squad and command an ROTC battalion you can command an Army. That was my training for command."

So says Gen. James A. Van Fleet who, in a distinguished military and athletic career that began more than 60 years ago, has done all three of those jobs and just about everything in between.

Gen. Van Fleet, whose classmates at West Point included Dwight D. Eisenhower and Omar Bradley, was a major serving as military advisor to the ROTC unit at Florida in 1921 when then head coach W. G. Kline asked if he'd help tutor the Gators.

"I agreed," says Gen. Van Fleet. "I do not recall that I received any pay at all."

Two years later Van Fleet was the head man, making \$600 a year for bringing the university its first national football recognition.

Turned Tide on Alabama

Much of that recognition came at the expense of Alabama, which was headed for the Southern Championship before losing, 16-6, to the visiting Gators on a rain-soaked field in 1923.

The Crimson Tide led, 6-0, at halftime when Van Fleet assessed the situation and began practicing the art of command.

"We had on those old ribbed stockings," he says, "and they were carrying a couple of pounds of mud each. I had my boys take off their stockings and the regulars changed uniforms with the ones not playing.


"I waited until the last minute to take the team back out into the rain. Alabama's coach Wallace Wade, was so mad he never spoke to me again. But, as I remember, he had his boys play barelegged in the future in bad weather."

Some two decades later when Allied forces began the invasion of France, Van Fleet was a colonel commanding the Eighth infantry Regiment that led the Fourth Division assault on Utah Beach in Normandy. Within six months he was a Major General and Corps commander.

Pericles Revisited

In 1948, with Greece under heavy pressure from the Communists, Gen. Van Fleet was dispatched to that country to help bolster government resistance. His work with the Greek military led to defeat of the Communists he proudly recalls, "without the use of one American soldier."

Home from that assignment just three months, Gen. Van Fleet was sent to Korea to command the U. S. Eighth Army.




General James A. Van Fleet

His work there led President Eisenhower to ask him to tour the Far East as his special representative in 1954.

Gen. Van Fleet's own football playing career was brief but satisfying. He did not go out for the sport until his final year at West Point, but quickly became a regular and played 60 minutes as a fullback-linebacker in the Cadets' 20-0 victory over Navy in 1914.

"Football plays an important role in the collegiate structure," he says. "Whether it is an afternoon of entertainment for students, faculty and fans, a unifying force and spirit builder on the campus or the teacher of some of life's important lessons to those who play the game, it is an integral part of the academic atmosphere."

The words carry added weight when spoken by a man whose pay stubs prove he coached for the love of the game.

CONTACT LENSES:

Contact lenses were once used merely as optical aides. Now, thanks to University of Florida research. "contacts" have become a vital tool in treating injuries and diseases of the Cornea.



Contact lenses are small circles of hard plastic-methylmacrylate, or a soft plastic which is optically clear and takes up water. They sit on the front part of the eye---the cornea, and are curved in such a way that the light going into the eye through the cornea is first bent by these lenses so that it will focus more clearly on the back of the eye to give clear vision and replace spectacles. These tiny lenses can eliminate the need for glasses in some, but have their advantages and disadvan-


The regular hard contact lenses give clear vision even to people with astigmatism--an irregular shape of the cornea which is curved more in one direction than in another. They are relatively easy to take care of, but are sometimes hard to get used to, sometimes can only be worn for a limited period of time, and must be taken in and out every day.

The soft contact lenses are optically clear moist plastic shields for the front of the eye. They mold more to the shape of the eye and cannot correct astigmatism. They are more difficult to take care of than hard lenses, but are much more comfortable and usually can be worn full time from the start with little or no irritation.

The University of Florida Department of Opthamology has pioneered the use of these moist optically clear lenses as a shield to protect the cornea and to treat a variety of potentially blinding diseases. Some people make no tears, and when artificial tear drops cannot be put in the eye often enough to keep the front of the eve moist, it will become damaged, cloudy, and sometimes cause blindness. We have found that these moist protective lenses can often prevent this. They can prevent damage to the front of the eye from roughened lids and preserve vision in many people whose lids are abnormal for a variety of reasons. They can help

A large soft contact lens, serving here as a "bandage" for dry eyes.


restore vision in people with many types of corneal degenerations which cause the front surface of the cornea to become roughened or irregular giving a view like a windshield in the rain. These lenses optically smooth out these irregularities like a windshield wiper in the rain, and often restore vision even when the disease itself cannot be cured. The practical use of soft contact lenses for the treatment of disease which has been developed has achieved widespread use all over the world, and such lenses which were originally developed simply as optical aids, have become a vital tool in healing corneal injuries by acting as




A sideview of a soft contact len's ability to mold perfectly to the shape of the eye. (Arrow shows edge of lens.)

a splint, protecting the cornea, and restoring vision through pain relief and an optical improvement in cases where no other kinds of improvement is possible.
