TONIGHT'S GAME

It's time to circle the wagons . . . a bunch of Indians are coming to town. They are Seminoles from Tallahassee and they are bringing their highly ranked warriors to town looking for scalps. But lurking in Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium are a hungry bunch of Tigers, ready to pounce on the first thing with a pig-skin that moves.

Yes, tonight the two Metro Conference schools who began playing each other during the 1959 season, will meet once again and it should be a dandy. Florida State is sporting a 4-0 record and is currently ranked in the nation's Top 10, while the Tigers are coming off an impressive 23-13 win over Southern Mississippi in Hattiesburg. MSU is 3-1 on the season and is off to its best start since 1977.

FSU is averaging 43.0 points per game, while allowing their opponents just 15.8 points per outing. The Seminoles have rushed for over 1,155 yards in four games and have passed for 682 yards. The high-powered Seminoles are averaging 459 yards total offense per game, while allowing their opponents just 362 yards.

THE QUARTERBACKS

Memphis State quarterback Danny Sparkman has guided the Tigers through the month of September and earned Associated Press Southeastern Back of the Week honors for his play against the University of Cincinnati. Sparkman has completed 39 of 82 pass attempts for 723 yards and four touchdowns. He has been intercepted just two times.

Florida State's quarterback, Eric Thomas, is also highly touted. He has not thrown an interception in 1984. He has completed 40 of 67 passes (59.7%) for 639 yards and has connected on seven touchdown passes.

THE RUNNING BACKS

The MSU Tigers enter the Florida State game having played as many as ten running backs thus far in 1984. The well-stocked position features both power and speed, as illustrated by the balanced running

attack in the Southern Mississippi game.

James "Punkin" Williams will once again start at tailback and Rozell Clayton will man the fullback position. Williams, who rushed for a career high 148 yards against Southern, will share playing time with Jeff Womack. Womack substituted for Williams against the Golden Eagles and piled up 92 yards on 19 carries. He and Williams scored both of Memphis State's touchdowns in last weekend's victory.

Florida State is led by tailback Greg Allen. Allen, who was named to numerous All-America teams last season, is complimented by fullback Cletis Jones. Allen is currently averaging 7.1 yards per carry and has rushed for 453 yards (average of 111.5 per game). Allen has scored four rushing touchdowns. Jones is not only a blocking fullback, but can run with the ball as well. He has gained 271 yards this season and is averaging 5.9 yards per carry.

THE RECEIVERS

One of the Tigers' most pleasant surprises this season has been the play of the split ends, flankers and tight ends.

The Tigers have received superior play from flanker Jerry Harris and split end Edwin Lovelady. Enis Jackson, last year's second leading receiver, sustained an ankle injury

early in the season and is just returning to form.

Lovelady leads the team in receiving, averaging 31.6 yards per reception. He has seven catches for 221 yards and one touchdown. He is followed on the stat sheet by Harris, who has six receptions for 166 yards and one touchdown. Harris is averaging 27.7 yards per catch.

Two players, Dwight Blalock and Glenn Boyd are sharing time at the tight end position along with Ricky Sparkman. Blalock started last season and the first three games of 1984. Boyd started the Southern Mississippi game.

The Seminoles have two of the finest wide receivers in the country in Jessie Hester and Hassan Jones. Hester leads FSU in receiving with 13 catches for 240 yards and three TDs. Jones has caught 10 passes for 209 yards and four touchdowns. The tight end position is manned by Pat Carter, who has 43 yards on two catches and is an outstanding blocker.

THE LINE

Memphis State's offensive line, the biggest in the country, has played exceptionally well over the last two games.

The Tigers made several changes in the line during the open week and have apparently come up with the right combination. Quick tackle Tim

Long (6-6, 307) was moved to quick guard. The quick tackle position is now manned by David Schmidt (6-3, 270) and Rick Hechinger (6-5, 245). The remainder of the line is the same. Jeff Walker (tackle) and Jack Oliver (guard) anchor the strong side of the line and David East is at center.

The Seminole line does not have the height advantage that MSU's line has but the weight and strength are there. The FSU line features strong tackle Parrish Barwick (6-0, 270), strong guard Dan Morris (6-1, 245), center Gerald Riopelle (6-1, 250), quick guard Jamie Dukes (6-1, 270) and quick tackle John Ionato (6-3, 270).

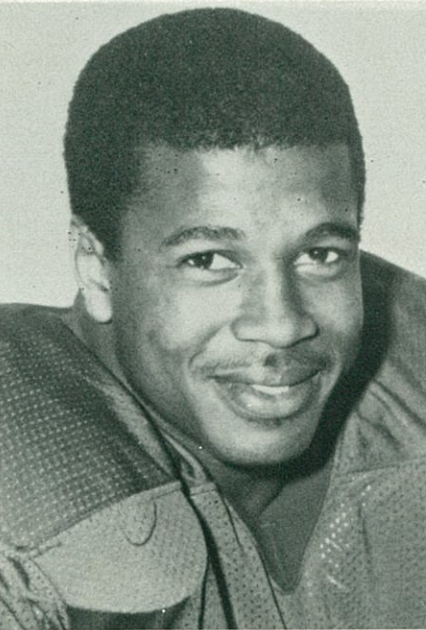
The Tiger defensive unit has played well over the last two weeks and turned in a stellar performance last Saturday night in Hattiesburg. The defensive effort was bolstered by the return of Mike MacKay.

The Florida State defense is also outstanding and features the play of Germantown's Brian McCrary in the defensive secondary.

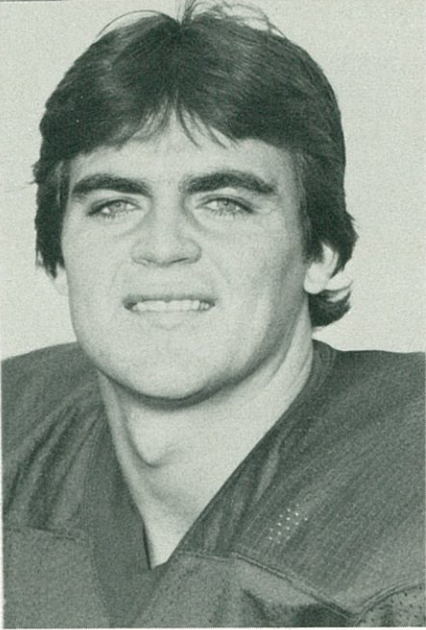
THE LINE

The MSU defensive front had a different look last weekend when nose guard Mike MacKay returned to action. MacKay, who had missed the first three games of the season with a fractured collarbone, was outstanding in Memphis State's win over Southern. In addition to MacKay, the front line was strengthened by the play of Eric Fairs. Fairs joined Dennis Borcky at the defensive end positions and added quickness to the pass rush. The Tigers have also received strong play from ends Harold Beane, Jeff Ellis, James Cribbs and Don Bramlett and nose guards Ken Balkunas and Nathan Beason.

FSU, which also sports a "50" front on defense, will start Issac Williams and Gerald Nichols at the tackles and Todd Stroud at nose guard. Williams and Nichols average 255 pounds per man and will provide

a true test for the Tiger offensive line.

THE LINEBACKERS

The Tigers have received strong play from their linebackers. All-America outside linebacker Tim Harris leads the team in tackles with 36 but is aided by back-up support from Bevin Carpenter. David Booth starts at weakside outside linebacker and shares time with David Brandon. Brandon picked off his first interception against Southern Mississippi.

The inside linebacker spots are filled by Keith Mutters and Octavian Sharp. Sharp recorded two quarterback sacks against the Golden Eagles and has played well all season. Mutters has been a regular for two years and is rotating playing time with Kurt Crain. All three inside linebackers are listed among the team's leading tacklers.

The Seminole linebacking is led by outside linebackers Darryl Gray and Brian Williams and inside backers Henry Taylor and Fred Jones. Taylor and Williams are seasoned vets who led the FSU defensive unit last year.

THE SECONDARY

Thus far during the 1984 season, the Tigers have not been affected

by the lack of depth in the secondary. Starters Donnie Elder, Derrick Burroughs, Chip Bowers and Trell Hooper have remained healthy, and have played in every game. Elder, who had two interceptions against Cincinnati and another against Southern Mississippi, is a team leader.

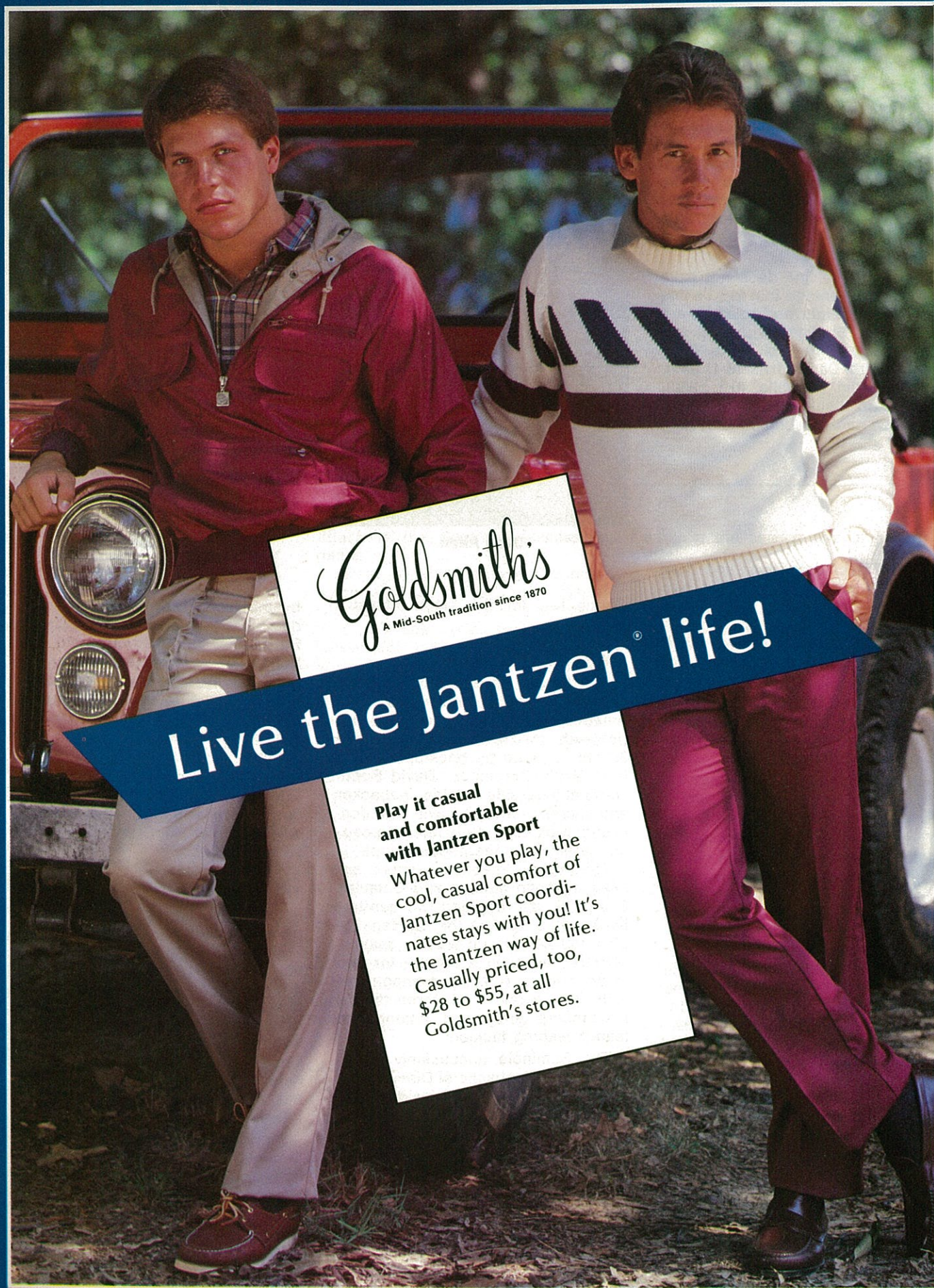
The FSU secondary has veterans Eric Riley and Eric Williams at the corners. Jerome McCoy plays strong safety, while McCrary plays free safety.

THE KICKERS

Both the Tigers and Seminoles have outstanding kicking games.

Memphis State will use Don Glosson for placement and kickoff duties and Wally Hatfield for punting chores. Glosson connected on three of three field goal attempts against Southern Mississippi and moved into second place for the most career field goals in MSU history. Hatfield has averaged 37.7 yards per punt this season.

Florida State's kicker, Derek Schmidt, is perfect on the 1984 season, having hit on 6-of-6 field goal attempts and 20-of-20 PATs. Seminole punter Louis Berry is having a great year as well, averaging 44.1 yards per punt.

MEMPHIS STATE UNIVERSITY

From the opening of its doors in 1912 as a Normal School for training teachers to its present status as a multipurpose university, Memphis State has been inevitably thrust forward by the growth of Memphis and the Mid-South. From a town oriented to a rural economy and culture in 1900, Memphis had grown into a large urban and commercial center by mid-century. And MSU, the city's public institution of higher learning, has experienced comparable growth.

Memphis State's development has been typical of other major universities coming into prominence since World War II in an emerging modern South. From Normal School with a few hundred students in 1912, to a teachers' college with a better staff and an enrollment of up to a thousand in 1941, to a state college with an expanded curriculum in liberal arts, business and graduate education for three to four thousand students, the institution finally became a full university in 1957.

The metropolitan requirements for more highly-trained university graduates have caused Memphis State to expand all of its offerings.

At MSU, searching for tomorrow's knowledge is as important as teaching today's. Meeting that challenge, MSU has established four Centers of Excellence as nationally-recognized research units designed to serve the public. The four new Centers—the Tennessee Earthquake Information Center, the School of Accountancy, the Center for Applied Psychological Research and the Center for Research and Innovative Services for the Communicatively Impaired—were funded in 1984 by the Tennessee Legislature, and designated as Centers of Excellence under Gov. Lamar Alexander's Educational Reform Bill. In addition, the fall of



1984 will also mark the beginning of MSU's innovative Five-Year Master Teacher Program through the College of Education, and the establishment of two new Chairs of Excellence in the Dr. Cecil C. Humphreys School of Law and the Department of Biology.

The developing tradition of distinguished research programs at MSU provides a solid foundation for a corresponding growth in the quality of its academic programs. New academic areas have been introduced to respond to the needs of the rapid technological advances in our society.

Average ACT scores of entering freshmen continue to rise and at the same time, student enrollment has reached an optimum level.

With a larger student body with an improved academic ability, MSU has strengthened and expanded its scholarship programs. One such program, "Early Scholars", awards full scholarships to more than 200 high school seniors whose ACT scores were above 26 and whose other qualifications excelled.

MSU's accreditation status was announced this past spring as being the highest in Tennessee. MSU is the only Tennessee public institution of higher education with 100 percent accreditation of its academic programs.

Now, as the enrollment settles in the 21,000-plus range, the university strives to refine its academic, research and public service programs. Only 72 years ago Memphis State was a little Normal School; today it is a regionally respected and nationally recognized university with a promising future.

MSU PRESIDENT

Dr. Thomas Glenn Carpenter, who played football at Georgia Tech University before graduating from Memphis State, has been president of his alma mater for four years since his appointment as the ninth president of the university by the State Board of Regents. Dr. Carpenter had previously been president of the University of North Florida at

Jacksonville, Fla.

Dr. Carpenter, 58, was born in Atlanta, Ga., and was educated in the public schools of Winston-Salem, N. C. He played halfback on the Georgia Tech football team before entering the Navy in 1944 during World War II. He received his bachelor of science degree in business administration from Memphis State

in 1949 and went on to receive his master's degree in economics from Baylor in 1950 and his PhD. from the University of Florida in 1963.

With 27 years of professional experience, Dr. Carpenter has served four institutions of higher education. He began his professional career in 1957 at the University of Florida as an instructor of economics and statistics and also served as the assistant director of housing.

From 1964 to 1965 he served as director of auxiliary services at Florida Atlantic University. In 1965 he went to the University of West Florida as business manager. During the next four and one half years, he held positions as dean of administration, vice president for administration services and acting vice president of academic affairs.

In 1969 he became the first president of the newly founded University of North Florida and served in that capacity for 11 years. As president of North Florida, Dr. Carpenter demonstrated his belief that a major responsibility of a university president is the promotion of the institution through active participation in community civic endeavors.

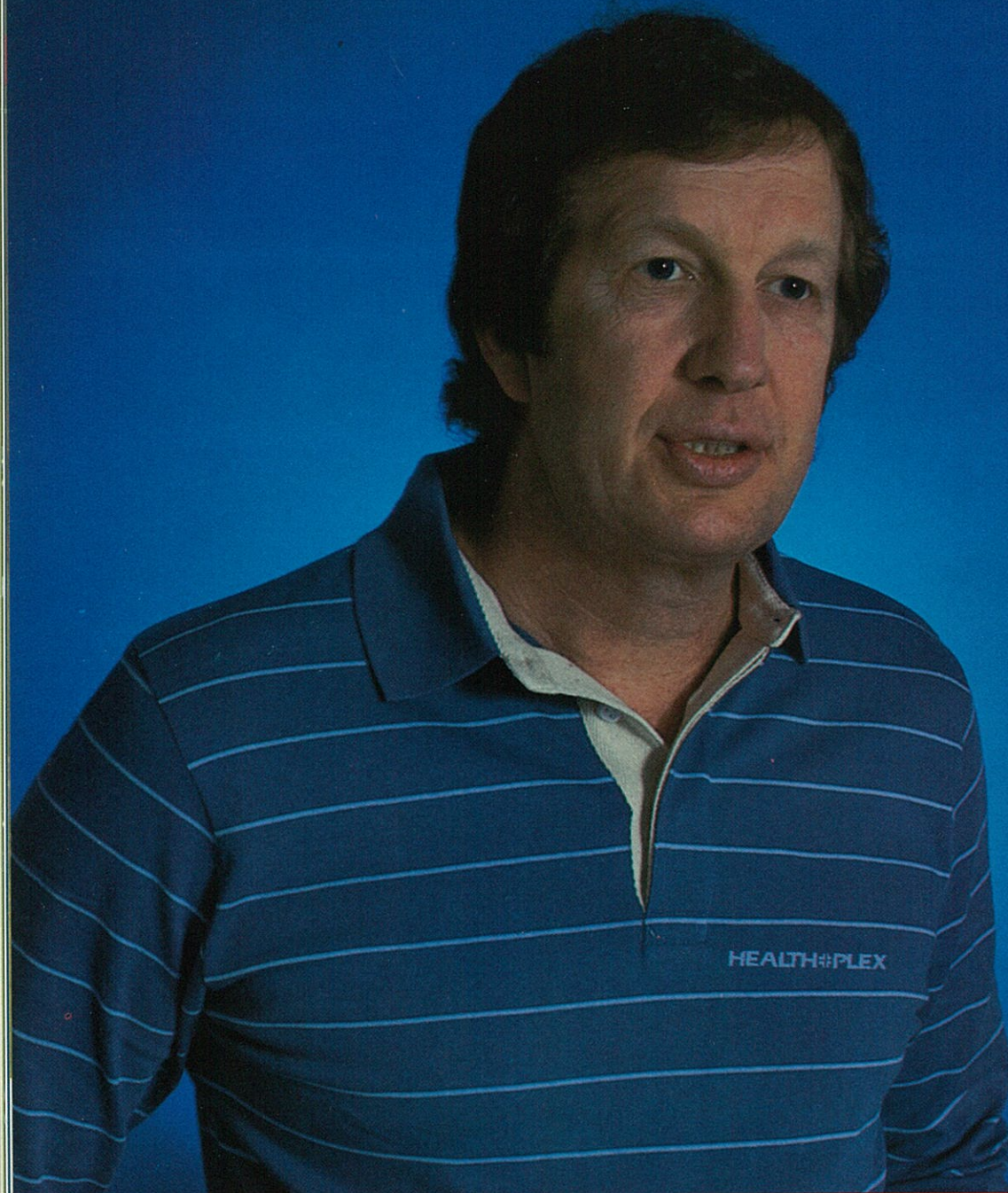
He has continued that policy at Memphis State. He is on the Board of Trustees of Le Bonheur Children's Hospital and the Memphis Community Television Foundation and the Executive Board of the Chickasaw Council for the Boy Scouts of America. He serves on the boards of the National Conference of Christians and Jews and the Mid-South Fair, Inc. He served as chairman of the Executive Committee of the Commission on Colleges for the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, and is a member of the Memphis Area Advisory Council of the Tennessee Higher Education Commission.

When Dr. Carpenter was appointed to the presidency of Memphis State in August of 1980, a newspaper editorial commented, "There is every reason to hope that the strong spirit of cooperation between MSU and the community will continue to grow." That spirit of cooperation is evident in Memphis State's recent growth in each of its roles: academics, research and public service.

Dr. Carpenter is married to MSU alumna Oneida Pruette of Memphis. They have two children.

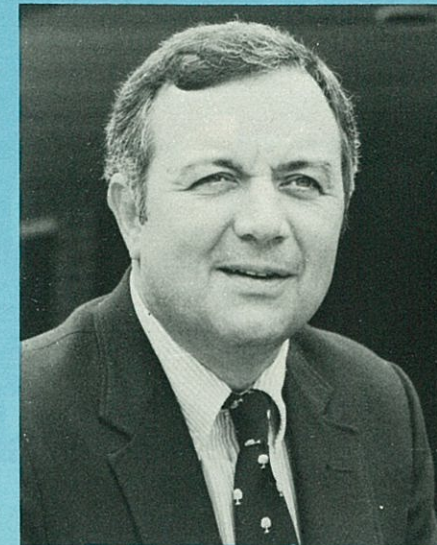
MSU ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

For Charles Cavagnaro, the athletic director's job at Memphis State University is a natural extension of his life's work. The native Memphian became MSU's director of athletics on Nov. 1, 1982 after serving *The Commercial Appeal* in several capacities related to sports and/or administration.

Cavagnaro, 43, finds working with people and a chance to demonstrate his administrative skills two of the most rewarding aspects of his current position. He has accomplished many things as athletic director at MSU.

With a realigned staff in 1983, Cavagnaro spearheaded a season football ticket drive which set a sales record at Memphis State and a marketing program which helped the university rank second in the nation in increased home attendance average.

In 1983 he also helped city and county officials lobby for state funds for the expansion of the Mid-South Coliseum. Observers felt that Cavagnaro's influence and ideas were the



catalyst for the successful conclusion of this project. And after the tragic death of MSU football coach Rex Dockery and three others in a December airplane crash, Cavagnaro received high marks for his professional approach to hiring a new coach.

MSU also received accolades in March for its excellent job of hosting the Metro Conference's men's basketball tournament and the first-and-second-round NCAA midwest basketball tournament. Cavagnaro was also the catalyst in gaining these tournaments for Memphis and MSU and planning for both.

Cavagnaro came to Memphis State from a position as assistant managing editor of *The Commercial Appeal*, Scripps-Howard's flagship newspaper. A 1966 Memphis State graduate with a degree in journalism, he worked first as a sports reporter at *The Commercial Appeal* and covered MSU football and basketball. Cavagnaro left the newspaper in 1970 to serve one year as general manager of the Memphis Pros of the American Basketball Association and then returned to work again for *The Commercial Appeal* before he accepted the athletic director's job at MSU.

He is married to the former Pat Dugan of Memphis. They have three children.

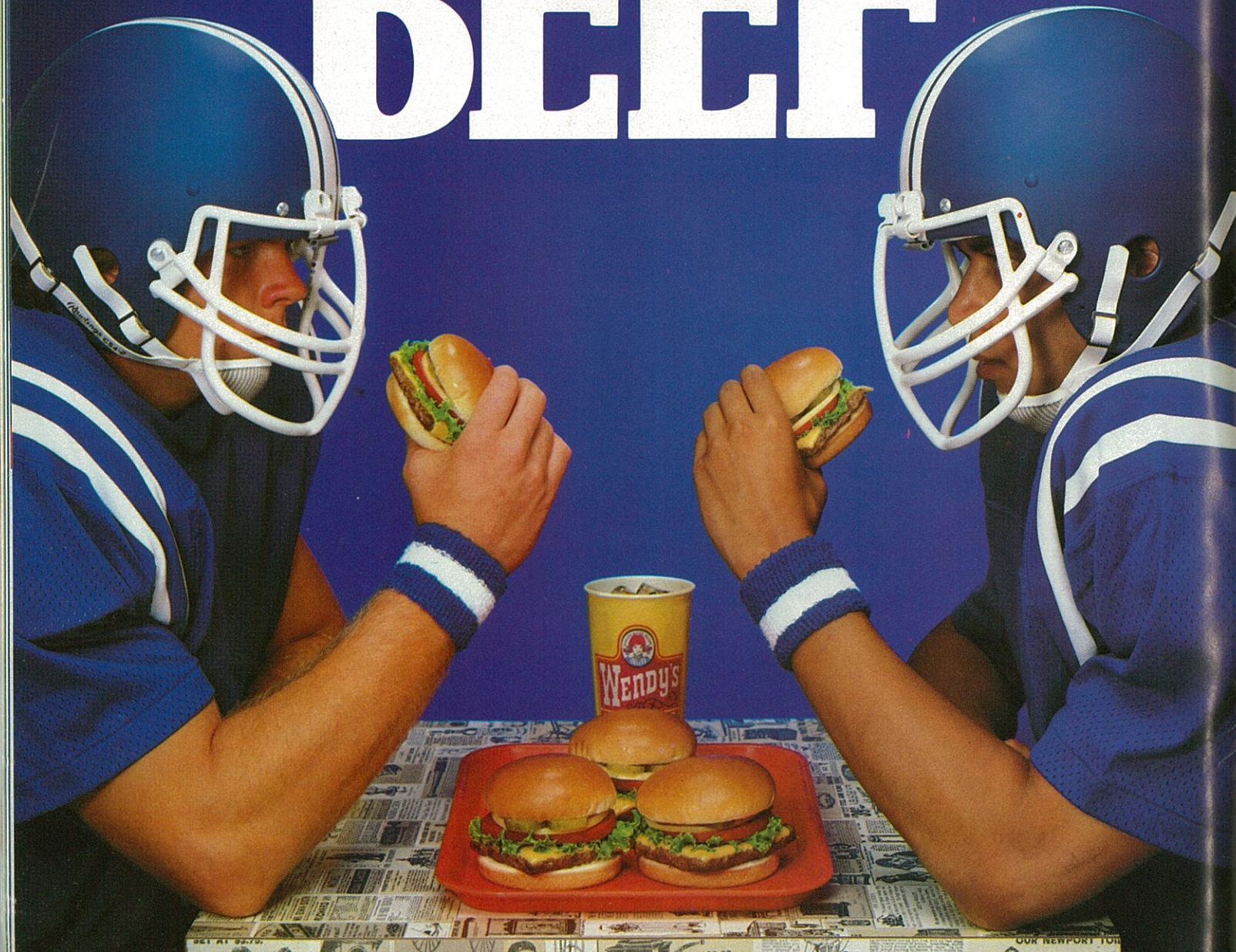

MSU HEAD COACH

Rey Dempsey, the 1983 Kodak National Coach of the Year and the Washington, D.C. Touch-down Club Coach of the Year, is the new head football coach at Memphis State University. Dempsey, who guided Southern Illinois University-Carbondale to the 1983 NCAA Division IAA National Championship, was named to the Tigers' position last December.

Dempsey, 47, is MSU's 17th head football coach.

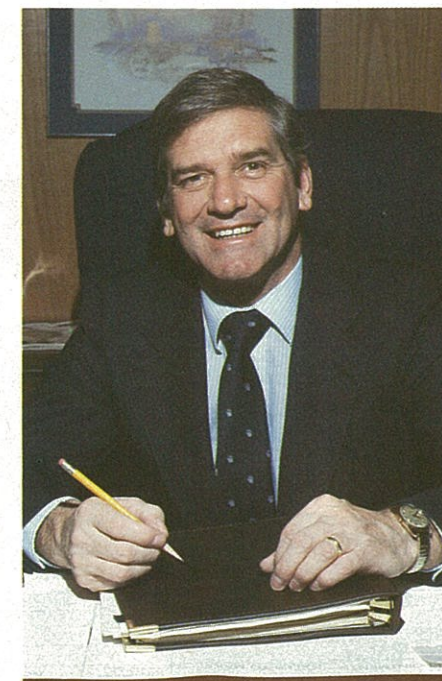
A native of East Pittsburgh, Pa., and a 1958 graduate of Geneva (Pa.) College, Dempsey has established himself in the college profession as a master of rebuilding and stabilizing football programs. When he became head coach at Southern Illinois in 1976, he inherited a program which had won seven games in four seasons and was 1-9-1 in 1975. But Dempsey's first SIU team posted a 7-4 won-lost record.

Before coming to MSU, Dempsey would produce six winning teams in his eight seasons at Southern Illinois, a school which prior to his hiring had four winning teams in 15 seasons. His 1978 team was 7-4, and his 1979 team logged the school's best won-lost record in 21 seasons (8-3).

In 1981 Southern Illinois posted a 7-4 record and marked a return to the winning ways Dempsey had instilled upon his arrival in Carbondale. That squad was in contention for the Missouri Valley Conference title until the final game of the season, when it lost to Drake University in the last minute.

The 1982 SIU team opened the season with three straight wins and was ranked as high as 6th nationally in NCAA Division I-AA. The bottom appeared to have dropped out when the Salukis lost their next four games, but Dempsey rallied his team to win three of its final four games and set the stage for the 1983 championship campaign.

Southern Illinois had a "dream season" in 1983, posting a 13-1 record and winning the Missouri Valley Conference Championship and the NCAA Division I-AA Championship. The Salukis routed Western Carolina University, 43-7, in the NCAA championship game and became the first collegiate team to win 13 games in a season. In addition to his national awards, Dempsey was named the Missouri Valley Conference Coach of



the Year.

Dempsey's eight-year coaching record at Southern Illinois was 54-37 and his overall 10-year college mark stands at 66-45 . . . impressive figures considering that he also had to rebuild a program at Youngstown State University, his other stop as a college head coach.

Dempsey went to Southern Illinois after serving one year as special teams coach for the Detroit Lions of the National Football League. Prior to his stint with the Lions, Dempsey was the head football coach at Youngstown State in 1973 and 1974.

Before he accepted the position at Youngstown State, the Penguins had suffered through eight straight losing seasons. Dempsey's first Youngstown State team posted a 4-6 record

but served notice of things to come because in 1974—one year later—the Penguins were 8-2 and participated in the NCAA Division II playoffs. Dempsey received Division II Coach of the Year honors for District IV and an invitation to coach in the East-West Shrine All-Star Game in San Francisco, Calif.

He had to decline the post-season coaching invitation after accepting the assistant coaching position with the Lions.

Dempsey was raised in Pitcarin, Pa., and was an outstanding high school athlete, lettering in football, basketball and baseball. He served as captain of the football, basketball and baseball teams as a senior and was voted Pitcarin High School's most valuable athlete award.

At Geneva College, Dempsey lettered four years as a quarterback. He received his bachelor's degree in business in 1958 and his master's degree in education in 1964 (from Westminster College in New Wilmington, Pa.).

Dempsey entered the coaching profession upon graduation from Geneva College and spent 13 years as a high school assistant or head coach in Aliquippa, Pa.; East Palestine, Ohio, and Canton, Ohio, before entering the college ranks as an assistant coach at Bowling Green State University. He remained at Bowling Green for two seasons and then accepted the head coaching position at Youngstown State.

A dynamic speaker and devout Christian, Dempsey is in demand in Memphis and the Mid-South for various functions.

He is married to the former Marion Cunningham of Trafford, Pa. They have four children.

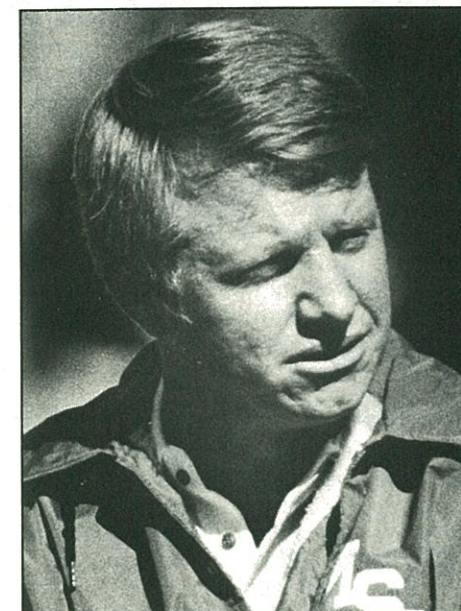

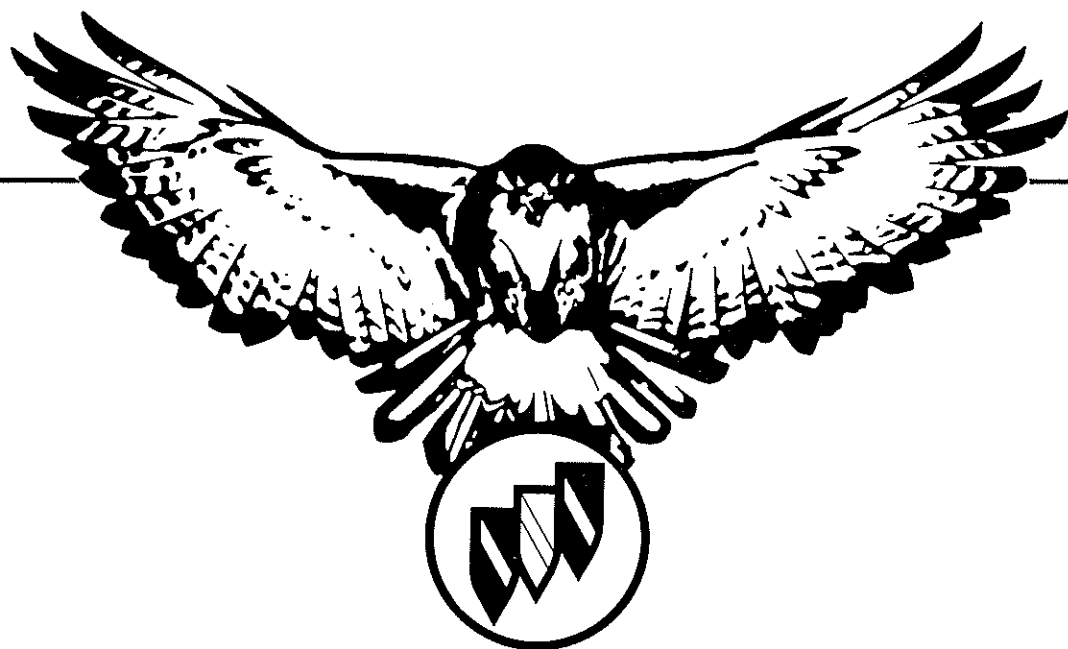

TIGER ASSISTANTS

LOU ALFORD (Middle Tennessee '65)

Lou Alford is beginning his fourth year at Memphis State. He spent his first two years as the Tigers' running back coach and served the 1983 season as an administrative assistant to Rex Dockery. He remains in the same capacity for Rey Dempsey for the 1984 season.

A native of Cleveland, Tenn., Alford played college football at Middle Tennessee State University and started three years.

After graduating from MTSU in 1965, Alford was named an assistant football coach at Bradley Central High in Cleveland. In 1967 he moved to Cleveland High as an assistant and remained there for five years before returning to Bradley Central. In 1974 he became head coach at Bradley Central and remained there until joining the Tiger staff. Alford's Bradley Central teams compiled a 55-13 won-lost record.

CARL ANGELO (Bowling Green '70)

Carl Angelo, who served for two years as defensive coordinator at Southern Illinois University under Rey Dempsey, is entering his first year in the same capacity at Memphis State.

As defensive coordinator at SIU-Carbondale, Angelo played a major role in the Salukis' drive for the 1983 NCAA Division I-AA National Championship. Under his direction, the Saluki defensive unit finished the 1983 season ranked 6th in the nation in pass defense, 12th in total defense and 13th scoring defense. Last season's national championship team led the Missouri Valley Conference in all defensive statistics. In 1982 the SIU defense led the Missouri Valley Conference in total defense.

Prior to his arrival at Southern Illinois, Angelo served three years as defensive coordinator at Howard University in Washington, D. C. The Bisons ranked first in the I-AA national stats in 1980 in pass defense.

Angelo began his college coaching career at Denison University in Granville, Ohio, where he served four years as defensive coordinator. A 1970 graduate of Bowling Green State University, he received his master's degree from Westminster College in 1973. He was an assistant coach four years at Warren Harding High in Youngstown, Ohio, his hometown, before accepting the position at Denison.

MURRAY ARMSTRONG (Tennessee '61)

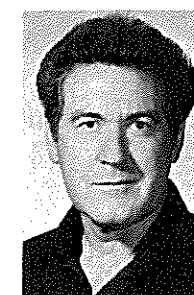
Murray Armstrong is the veteran of the Memphis State football staff, with the 1984 season marking his 21st as a Tiger assistant.

Hired originally by football coach and athletic director Billy J. Murphy, Armstrong has served under five head coaches at MSU in various capacities. His duties for 1984 will be the same as in 1983—coach of the Tiger special teams and kickers.

Joe D'Alessandris, a former college lineman, is beginning his first year at Memphis State. He will coach the Tigers' strong side offensive linemen.



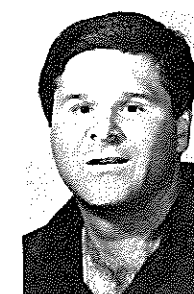

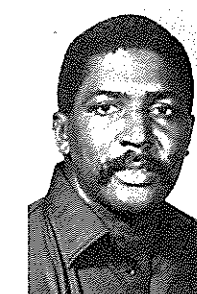

From Nanuet, N. Y., Hackett is a 1976 graduate of Tarkio (Mo.) College, where he was an outstanding line- (See page 21, column 1)

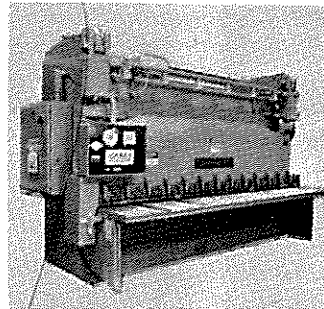

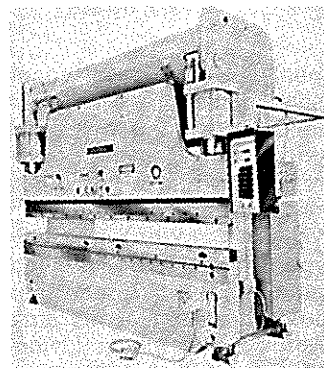

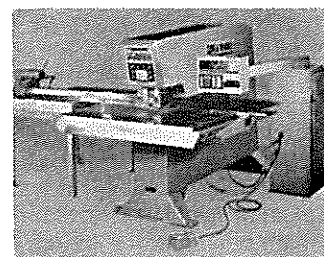

man and kicker (he was voted his team's most valuable player as a senior).

Prior to coming to MSU, Hackett served six years as an assistant coach at Baker College in Lawrence, Kan. While coaching at Baker, Hackett received his master's degree from the University of Kansas in 1979.

MIKE HENNIGAN (Tennessee Tech '73)

Mike Hennigan, a former pro player with Detroit of the NFL when Rey Dempsey was a Lions' assistant, is beginning his first year at Memphis State. He will coach the inside linebackers.

A native of Davenport, Iowa, Hennigan comes to MSU from Western Carolina University, where he was defensive coordinator last year when the Catamounts finished runnerup to Dempsey's Southern Illinois-Carbondale team in the NCAA I-AA playoffs.

Hennigan, who coached two years at Western Carolina, began his coaching career as a linebacker and defensive end coach at East Tennessee State University in 1980.

A 1973 graduate from Tennessee Tech University, Hennigan was an All-American linebacker for the Golden Eagles. He then played professional football seven years for Detroit and the New York Jets.

DEAN LOTZ (Memphis State '68)

Dean Lotz, who played college football at Memphis State, is entering his fourth year as a member of the Tiger football staff. He is MSU's strength coach.

From Titusville, Fla., Lotz was a standout center at Memphis State and after his senior year, signed a professional contract in 1968 with the Atlanta Falcons of the NFL.

Lotz played two seasons with the Falcons, then returned to Memphis and opened the Whitehaven Nautilus Weight Training Center, which he still owns and operates. He is also active in staging weight-training clinics in Memphis and the Mid-South.

FRED MANUEL (Oregon '73)

Fred Manuel, an assistant coach two years at Southern Illinois-Carbondale, has followed Rey Dempsey to Memphis State and will coach the Tigers' secondary in 1984.

At SIU Manuel also coached the secondary and his tenure there was highlighted by the 1983 season, when the Salukis intercepted a NCAA I-AA record 41 passes, including seven in the championship win over Western Carolina.

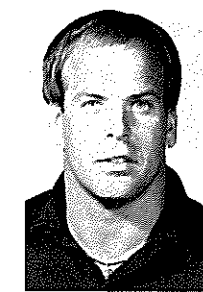

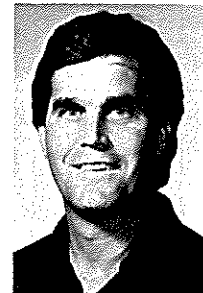

Don Wiggins, a former quarterback at Clemson University, is entering his first year at Memphis State. He will coach the running backs.

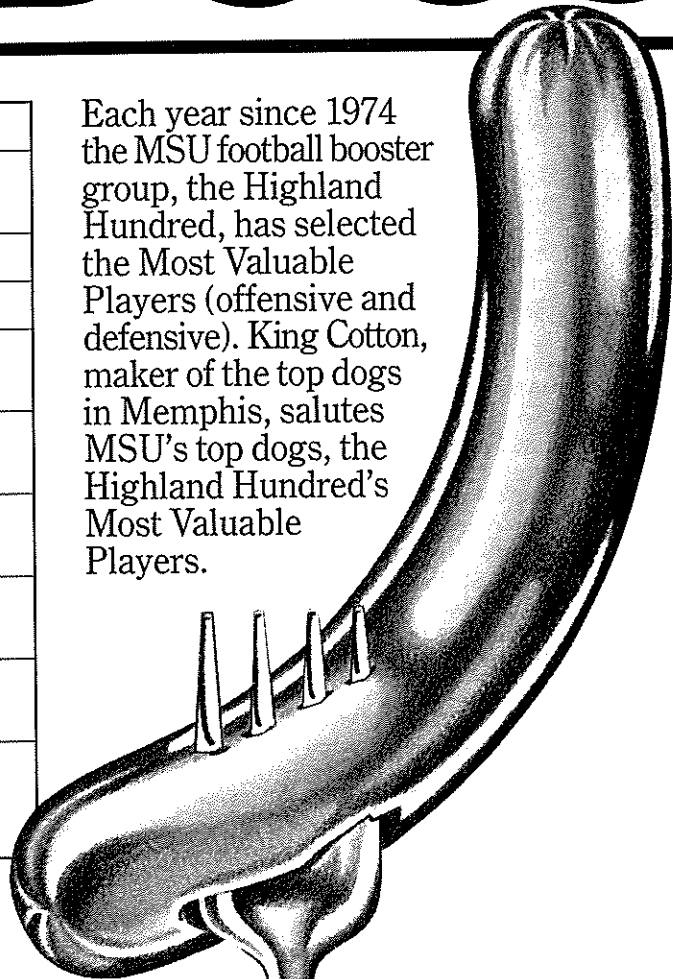
A native of Akron, Ohio, Wiggins comes to MSU from the University of Richmond, where he coached the running backs four years.

TIM LONG: Leads "Dempsey's Hogs"

One move in the offensive line has made a great deal of difference in the front wall of the Tigers — the changing of Tim Long from tackle to guard.

"I feel very comfortable playing guard," Long said. "It helps my pass blocking. I also love to pull on running plays."

The change has been instrumental in the rejuvenated Tiger attack, but MSU coach Rey Dempsey says the difference is elsewhere.

"The players got together and decided that they were going to work hard and do it," Dempsey said. "It has been their desire and hard work has really showed during the past two weeks."

Following the Tigers' loss to Ole Miss early in the season, Long and the entire offensive line was baffled . . . the players had the size and strength to blow people off the ball, but were seemingly being dominated at the line of scrimmage.

That has all changed now, however, as "Dempsey's Hogs," the name the offensive line has adopted, has exploded in the last two games to become dominant factors.

Long was not highly pursued as a high school senior, but as a senior in the college ranks, is at the top of his class.

Just four short years ago, Long was a high school senior with mixed emotions about his football future.

Long had the size of most linemen at big name football institutions and came from a school with an outstanding reputation, but just wasn't being heavily recruited. However, things have changed drastically for the 6-6, 307 pounder.

A Memphis State University senior, Long is a highly-touted professional prospect. This high regard by the pros is obviously because of his size and because of his quickness and speed. Long was timed during "Pro Day" at 4.94 seconds in the 40 yard dash. This is especially incredible considering the fact that a scout with the Dallas Cowboys says that 5.2 seconds is outstanding for interior linemen.

Long was one of five linemen, including Pittsburgh's Heisman Trophy candidate Bill Fralic, chosen in US Magazine's "Grid Gods." In that September edition, Long is said to be "potentially awesome. Maybe the

Tiger four-year starter being closely watched by the pros . . . Broke into MSU lineup first game of freshman season at offensive tackle and has developed into standout, while also seeing varsity action at three other positions (tight end in 1982, center in 1983 and guard in 1984) . . . next Joe Jacoby," by combine pro scout Glenn Cumbe.

A native of Cleveland, Tenn., Long was looked over during his years at Bradley Central as Chris White and Dale Jones, both of whom are now Tennessee Vols, received most of the collegiate offers.

Since coming to MSU, Long has enjoyed three outstanding seasons, and is looking forward to another outstanding campaign in 1984. However, it all hasn't been roses for Long with the Tigers. He has also had some up and down times.

"I have played center, guard, tackle and tight end," Long said. "I felt lost a lot during my sophomore year, because I was being shuffled around so much. Now, though, I found a spot and we have a very good line."

A "good line" are not the only words that would properly describe the Tigers' offensive front wall. "Huge and awesome" would have to fit in there somewhere. The MSU starting line averages more than 275 pounds per player.

With their interior line, the Tigers answer the all important question of "where's the beef."

Long is not only big and quick, but also very firm. He is also very active in the weight room, as demonstrated by his 365 pound bench press total. Long currently holds the Power Clean record at MSU with a lift of 360 pounds. This along with the bench press and squats are the three major lifting categories. Long totaled 1195 pounds on the three lifts.

"I didn't really being to lift hard until last year," Long said. "When I came here, I only benched 250. The increase in strength has been a great help to my pass blocking. I credit weights for all the improvements I've made."

Dempsey, who took the head coaching duties at MSU in December following the tragic death of Cleveland native Rex Dockery, installed a new, more wide-open offensive system for the Tigers this season.

"The change in coaches brought an entirely new offense," Long said. "This is the offense that won the (Division I-AA) national championship last year. It is more wide-open and should help my chances in the pros, because we pass a whole lot more. Coach Dempsey proved he could win with it, so we have a lot of confidence in it."

Following consecutive 1-10 seasons, the Tigers went 6-4-1 last season, including wins over Ole Miss, Mississippi State and Vanderbilt. This leads the revamped MSU team to believe in the possibility of post-season play in 1984.

"I am also looking toward the Tennessee game," Long said. "I feel like that is the biggest game on our schedule."

The Tigers' offensive line will be being looked upon to create holes for the outstanding MSU running backs this season and to also give Danny Sparkman plenty of time to throw the ball. While Long is only one of five men that have to do the job up front, he is the biggest and the most experienced and will be looked upon to provide the leadership.

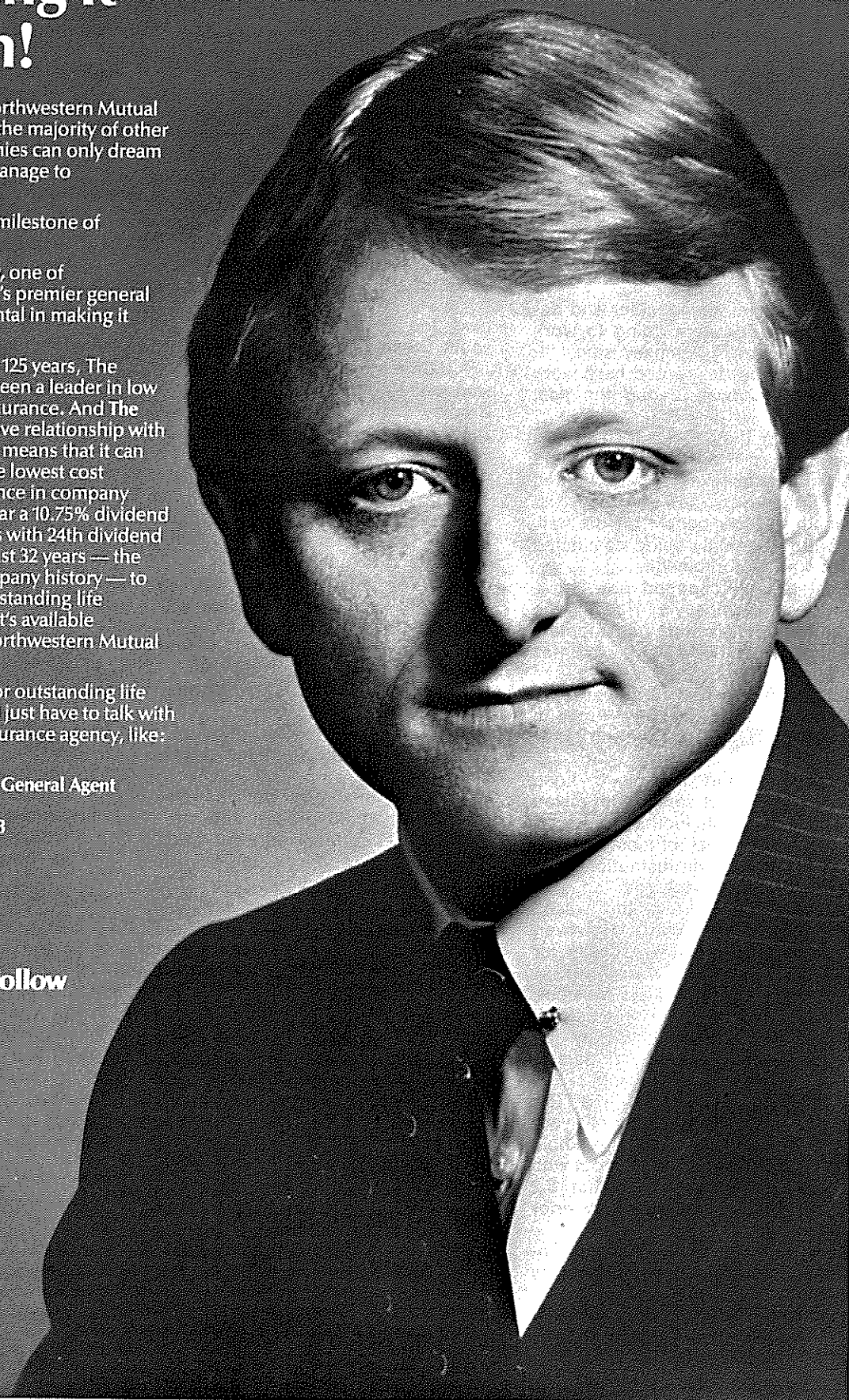

LIBERTY BOWL MEMORIAL STADIUM/REX DOCKERY FIELD

Memphis State's Tigers have one of the finest facilities in the nation in which to play their home football games—Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium/Rex Dockery Field.

The 50,180 seat facility—a memorial to the veterans of World War I, World War II and the Korean War—was built at a cost of \$3.7 million by the city of Memphis and is operated by the Memphis Park Commission.

The stadium features a natural grass playing surface, two spacious locker rooms and a three-level press box.

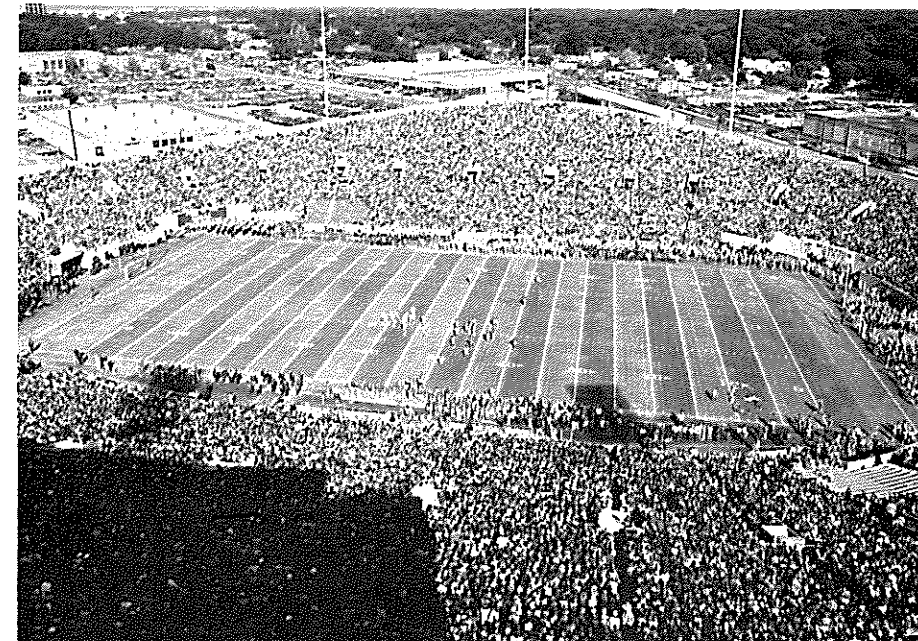
The Tigers inaugurated the stadium in 1965 and in the past 19 years, have compiled a 63-50-1 won-lost record and drawn more than three million fans to their home games.

The playing surface, dedicated last spring as Rex Dockery Field, received a facelift during the summer. The field was resodded and a new sprinkler system was added.

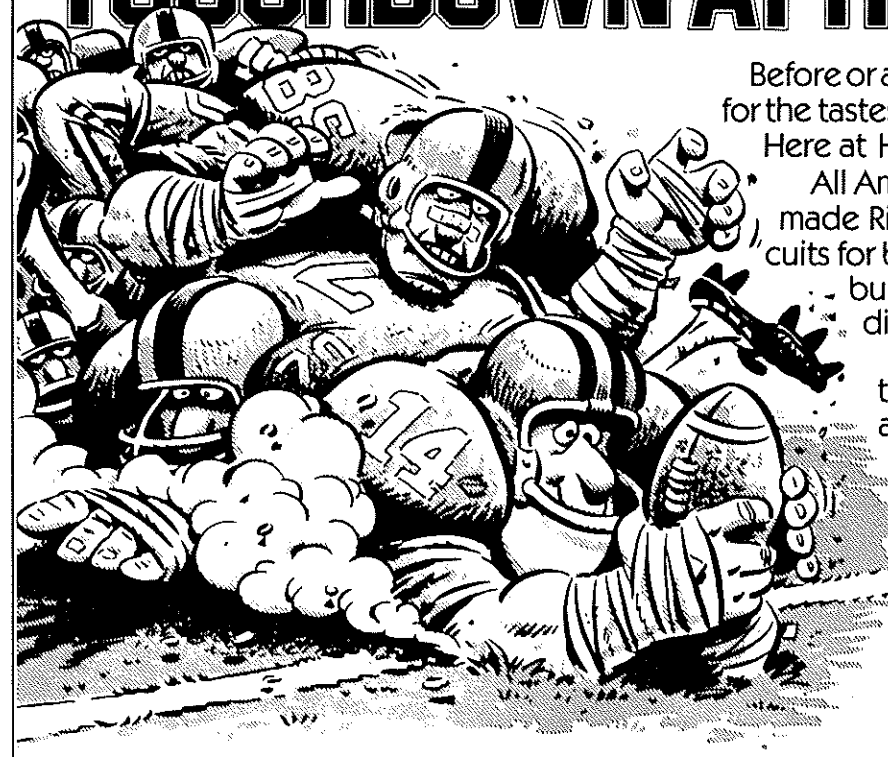
Also, in the spring of 1984 the Coca-Cola Bottling Company of

Memphis added a new scoreboard and sound system to the stadium. The computer operated scoreboard is 100 feet long and stands 23 feet

high. It has a 16x32 foot message center and is the largest scoreboard in the Mid-South.

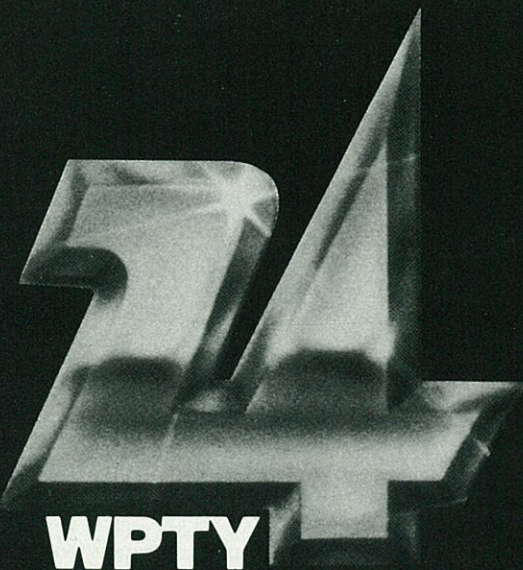

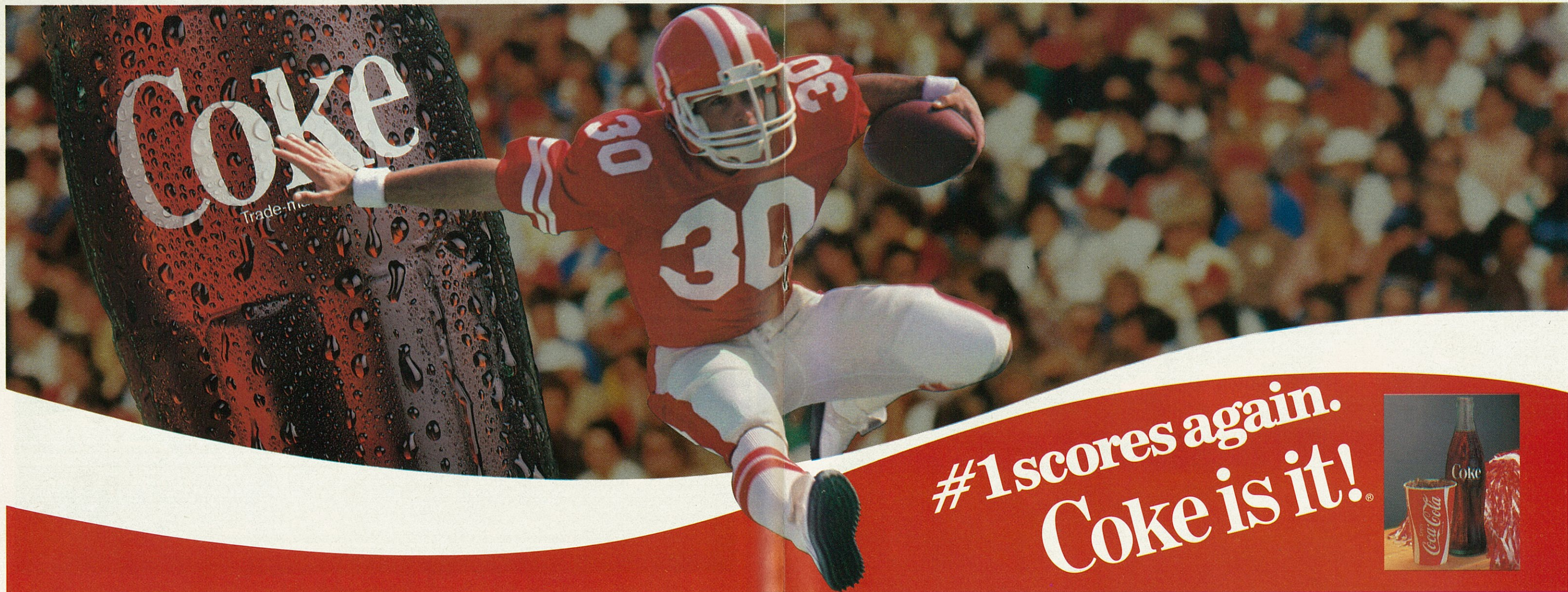

FIRST AID—The First Aid room is located on the West lower concourse directly in front of the elevator. Two mobile units are parked on the North and East concourse. Ambulances are available at the South Tunnel and at Gate 4, located on the West Side of the Stadium.

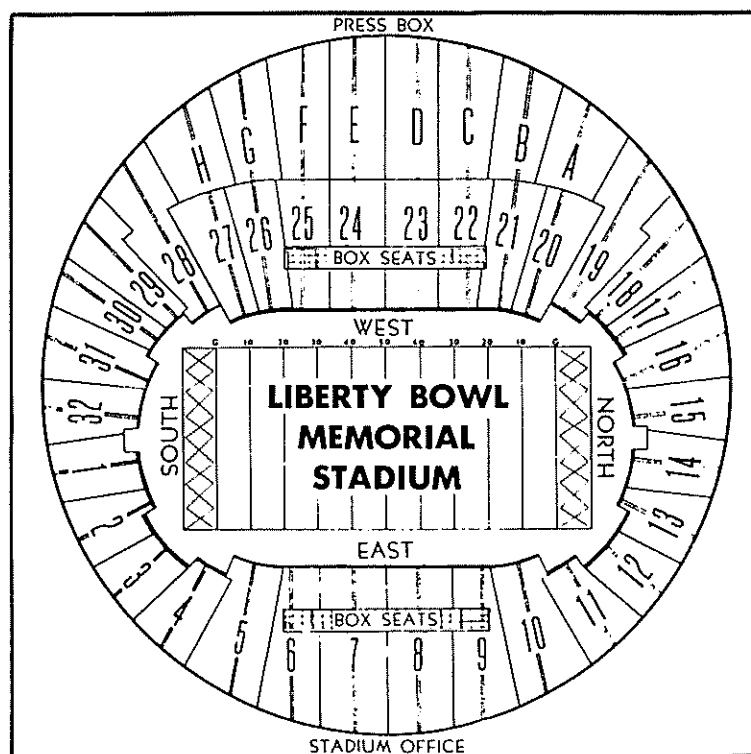
RESTROOMS—Restrooms are located conveniently throughout the Stadium. There are 8 men's and 12 women's restrooms.

Last Week

Florida State improved its 1984 won-lost record to 4-0 with a convincing 44-27 home victory over Temple last Saturday, while Memphis State upped its record to 3-1 with an impressive 23-13 road win over Southern Mississippi.

In the Seminoles' runaway win, defensive back Joe Wessel blocked a pair of kicks to set up two touchdowns and national passing leader Eric Thomas threw three scoring aeri

Tailback Greg Allen, FSU's Heisman Trophy candidate, rushed for 135 yards on 18 carries and scored on a run of 43 yards. The Seminoles led 28-6 at halftime.

Tailbacks James "Punkin" Williams and Jeff Womack and kicker Don Glosson shared the offensive spotlight in Memphis State's victory, with Williams and Womack combining for 240 rushing yards and two touchdowns and Glosson kicking three field goals.

The Tigers trailed Southern Miss 13-10 at halftime but went ahead 16-13 midway in the third period on a six-yard TD run by Womack and never looked back.

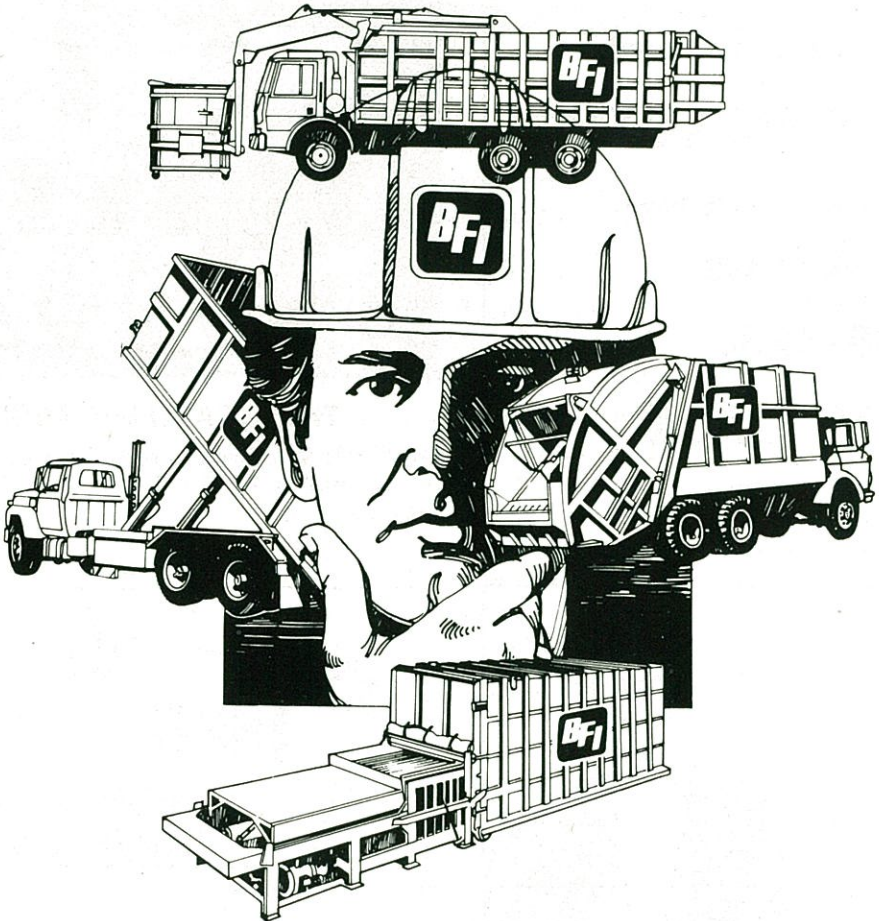

HIGHLAND HUNDRED

In 1958 several Memphis area businessmen gathered one night on Highland Street and formed the Memphis State football booster group, the Highland Hundred.

At its inception, the Highland Hundred—now regarded as one of the most energetic organizations in the nation—had just eight members and set its initial goal at a membership of 100. The membership now totals almost 500, representing more than 30 colleges and universities, but Highland Hundred's goal remains the same: to promote MSU Tiger football.

The activities and projects of the Highland Hundred are many and varied, and perhaps highlighted by its sponsorship of the annual Tiger football banquet in December.

The Highland Hundred received national attention in 1972 when it purchased a bengal tiger cub, which was later named TOM (for Tigers-Of-Memphis) and is one of MSU's two athletic mascots. TOM, who is housed at the Memphis Zoo and now weighs nearly 500 pounds, attends all Tiger home football games.

TIGER FANS CHALLENGED BY WRITER

Looking in the newspaper the day after the Tigers' 47-7 wipeout of the Cincinnati Bearcats, this writer came upon a startling quotation from one of the MSU players. What was even amazing to this perplexed sport-scribe was the fact that this opinion was reflected in the comments of the coaching staff also.

While the exact words escape me, the meaning of the message went something like this:

"We thank the fans for their great support."

This seemingly innocent, almost throw-away line should have gone unnoticed amid the usual Sunday morning hyperbole following a lopsided victory. The fact that it didn't, set me to wondering why such a simple, and no doubt sincere, remark should prove so bothersome.

It's not like you haven't heard this kind of thing before. I'm sure there were folks standing off to the side applauding the first time a fella inflated a pigskin and punted it across a cow pasture. I'm equally sure that the kicker turned to the assembled onlookers and said:

"I sure appreciate your support."

It's an arrangement that benefits both parties. The fans appreciate the good athletic performance, and the player is encouraged by knowing that his efforts are recognized and admired.

Everybody gains, nobody loses. We each do our part.

That's what bothers me. Each side is supposed to do its part.

When the players let down their end, we boo, we jeer, we stay away. What happens when we were not doing our part? That is the rub. The innocent comment in that Sunday paper did not match up with what I had seen the night before.

Standing on the sidelines during a game is a different experience. You feel the raw energy and hear the cannon-like explosions as the pads momentum was tangible as the Tigers drove relentlessly, time after time, against the overmatched Bearcats. Quarterback Danny Sparkman set a new passing record, and the entire squad, both offense and defense, put together sixty minutes of solid team football.

It was all a fan could want and more. The margin of victory was forty points. *Forty points!* How many

seasons had we seen where the team went weeks before *totaling* forty points?

I watched the scoreboard as the seconds ticked down, waiting for the roar of approval that would cap the evening and let the team know: *You did all we could ask.*

I turned away from the field to look behind at the Memphis State side of the stadium.

It appeared nearly empty.

I couldn't believe it. My gaze circled the Liberty Bowl. The story was the same. I remembered absently glancing across the field from time to time during the later stages of the second half and noting that there seemed to be fewer and fewer people there as the outcome of the game became inevitable. I dismissed it since many of those people had cheered for Cincinnati during their only offensive spurt at the start of the second half. The rest, I knew, were those attendees who go somewhere on a Saturday night. This week it's a football game, next week it's a movie.

The MSU fans, I knew, were behind the team — literally — behind the Tiger bench, except for the student section across the field who in all colleges find themselves in the corner seats.

The stadium announcer had said that there were thirty-two thousand here. There couldn't have been more than two or three thousand left in their seats at the final gun.

Two thousand spread out in the Liberty Bowl look like crumbs in the bottom of a cookie jar.

The game ended. The jubilant Tiger players carried Coach Dempsey off on their shoulders. It was a sign of unity, of team spirit. Players exchanged "high fives" and backs were slapped.

Maybe that's why the players and coaches felt the way they did and said those nice things. They saw the thirty-two thousand earlier. They heard the cheers and fireworks displays. In the emotional rush following the game, maybe they assumed that everyone else was rejoicing too.

Perhaps they were.

Walking back to cars, sitting in over-packed parking lots, blowing impatient horns in the inevitable traffic jams that they somehow expected to avoid, perhaps they rolled down the windows and shouted "Go Tig-

ers" at one another.

The team will never know.

It could be that the players are grateful that so many even come to the game. It could be that they're used to it.

As an avid and long time sports fan and a follower of Tiger athletics for the seven years I've been in Memphis, it's confusing to me.

NFL fans leave games early, not college fans.

I've seen the stadium empty out when the team was trailing and now I've seen it when they're winning.

When do we stay for the whole game?

Fan spirit and support is more than tail-gate parties before and horn blowing after.

Coach Dempsey and the players are doing their part.

Isn't it about time we started doing ours?

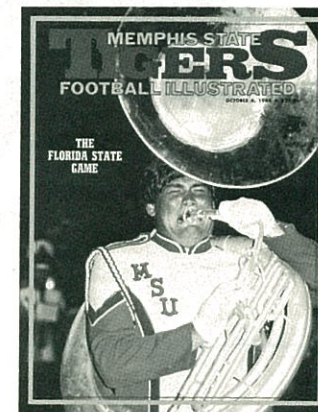

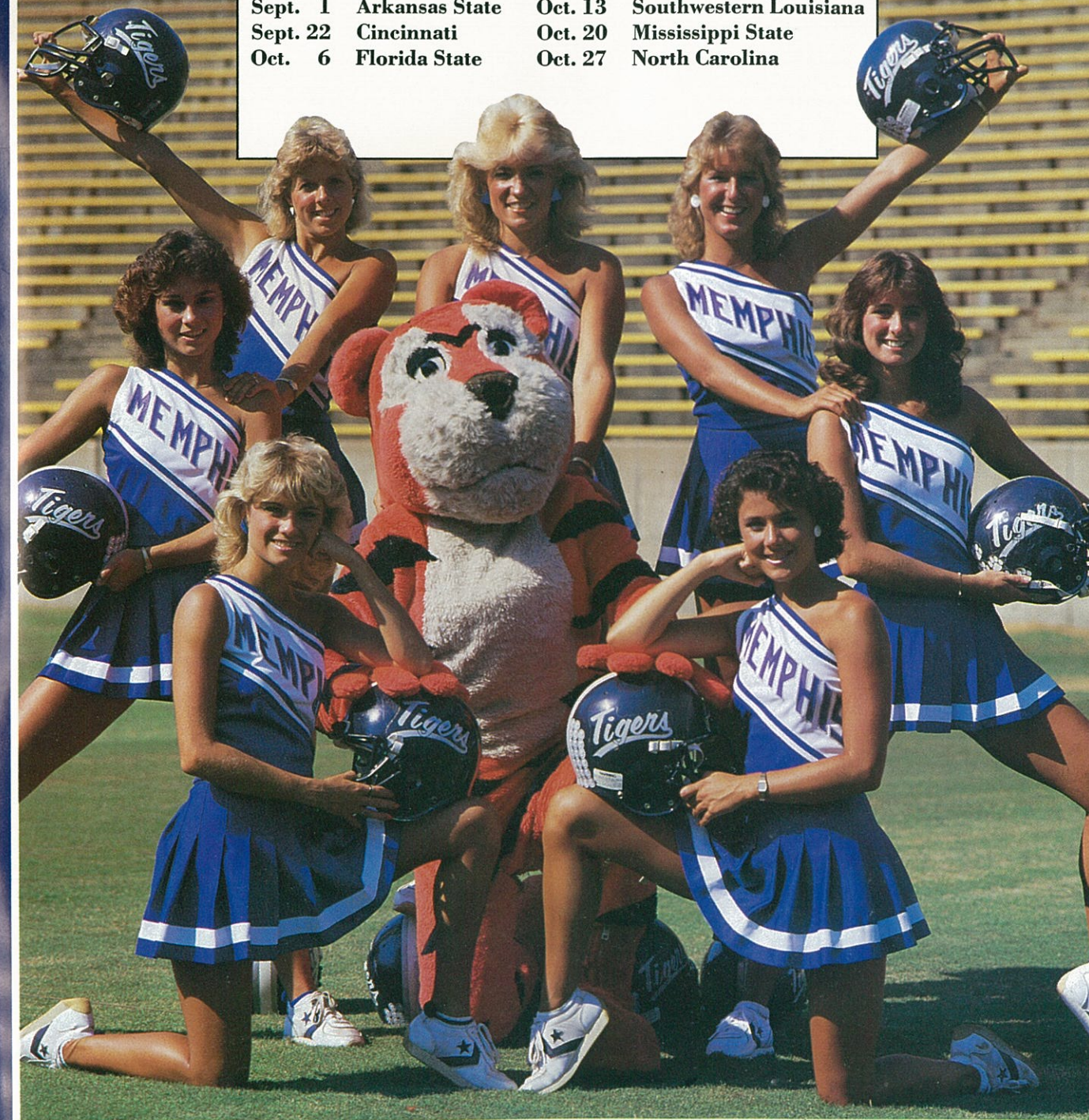
