TODAY'S GAME

Today's final regular season game for both the Florida State Seminoles (8-2) and the Gators (8-1-1) has all the ingredients of a classic college football match-up.

Both teams have been ranked in the top fifteen most of the year. Adding to the intensity of this year's confrontation is the fact that Florida has won each of the last four meetings between the two schools. Florida State, looking to reverse the series' recent trend, brings a team with dangerous offensive weapons and a youthful, yet talented defense.

Offensively, both teams rank in the nation's top 25 in total offense with FSU averaging over 415 yards per game and Florida over 399. The Seminoles also average 35.4 points per game, ranking them sixth nationally in that category. However, FSU and UF reach their offensive productions by different means. The 'Noles are powered by a fine offensive line that has paved the way for the squad's 231 yards per game rushing total, a figure that rates 12th nationally. In guard Jamie Dukes, FSU faithfuls believe they have one of the premier offensive linemen in the country. He teams with standout tackles John Ionata and Pablo Lopez to anchor a line that averages 278 pounds per man. Running the FSU attack is freshman quarterback Chip Ferguson who has stepped in for injured Danny McManus and completed 56 percent of his passes for 11 touchdowns. The prime target is all-star candidate Hassan Jones who tops the club with 29 catches for a healthy 21.3 average. Darrin Holliman, a nifty 5-7, 170-pound sophomore is another deep threat who has hauled in 18 receptions. Tight end Pat Carter, a hulking 255-pounder, is a blue chip athlete as well. The running back contingent is deep, young and talented. Senior Cletis Jones is a top notch fullback. Speedy freshman Victor Floyd and Keith Ross and senior Tony Smith have combined for nearly 1500 yards at tailback to further illustrate FSU's backfield depth.

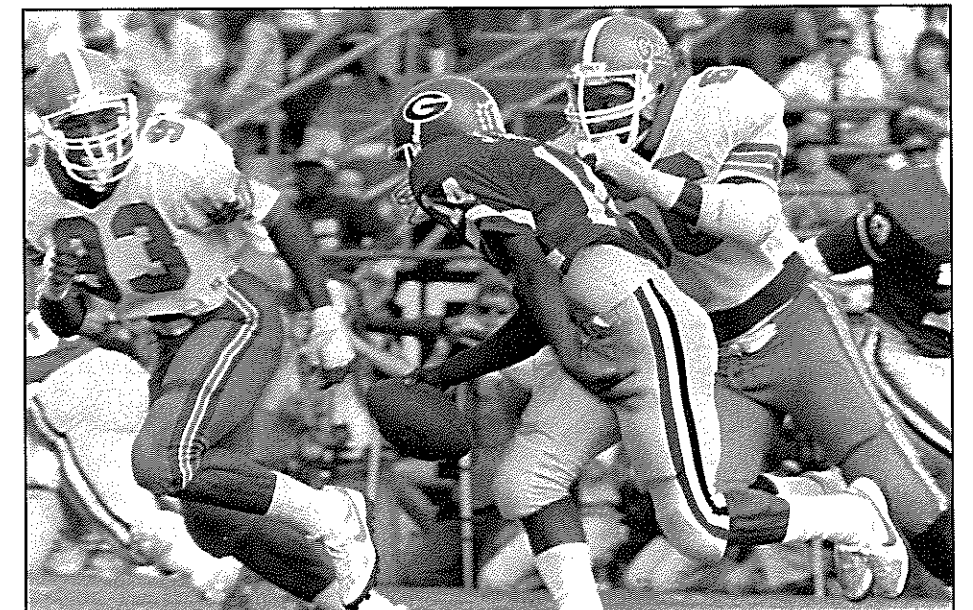
Meanwhile, the Gator offense has relied on its big play capability as well, although the passing game has been the principle mode of attack. Quarterback Kerwin Bell, the nation's fifth-rated passer, has put together a tremendous year, especially considering UF's inconsistent ground game and pass protection. Bell is hitting on over 62 percent of his passes for 2,344 yards and 18 touchdowns.

Aside from fullback John L. Williams, his favorite threats have been long range receivers Ricky Nattiel, Ray McDonald and Frankie Neal, who have combined to snag 65 passes, each averaging well over 18 yards a catch. Bell has also been looking to backs Williams and Neal Anderson with regularity. The senior running duo has totaled nearly 1,600 yards on the ground this year, a figure that exceeds UF's total team ground output. With 61 yards in today's game, Anderson would become only UF's second back ever to gain over 1,000 yards in a season. He and Williams already rank first and third respectively among UF's all-time rushers. Florida's offensive line has had its ups and downs but has gotten strong play from Outland Trophy candidate Jeff Zimmerman and tackle David Williams.

Florida State's defense has the look of a potentially awesome unit. The 'Noles start a veteran front seven and back it up with a youthful secondary. Of particular strengths are the linebacking play of Darryl Gray, Garth Jax, Fred Jones and Paul McGowan. Tackles Isaac Williams and Gerald Nichols have also been impressive, notably against the run where FSU is allowing only 148 yards per game. The secondary starts three sophomores and a freshman. Cornerbacks Martin Mayhew and Eric Williams have combined for seven interceptions. FSU's defense has forced 30 turnovers, 22 by interception.

Florida's highly touted defense will get another severe test this week from FSU's offensive speed and experience up front. Florida, owners of the nation's eighth rated defense, tops in the South-eastern Conference, has not faced another team with as much diversity as FSU's presents. The linebacking corp, a source of strength all season, is headed by All-American Alonzo Johnson and seniors Leon Pennington and Patrick Miller, with considerable help from Arthur White, Ron Moten and Scott Armstrong. Johnson leads the team with 99 tackles including 11 sacks and six other tackles for losses totaling 23 yards. The down linemen, led by all-star candidate Keith Williams and Alonzo Mitz has also been effective as opponents are gaining just 129 yards on the ground. The backfield has improved steadily to the point where the unit is allowing only 153 yards per game.

Rounding out the teams are fine sets of special teams. FSU's Louis Berry has averaged nearly 43 yards per punt as compared to the Gators' Ray Criswell, who orbits his boots at a 44.5 clip, the eighth best mark in the country. 'Nole kicker Derek Schmidt leads the team with 96 points as he is 18 of 23 in field goals and perfect on 42 extra point tries. He is the nation's third leading scorer. UF's Jeff Dawson also leads his team in scoring with 70 points as he has converted 16 of 20 field goal attempts.

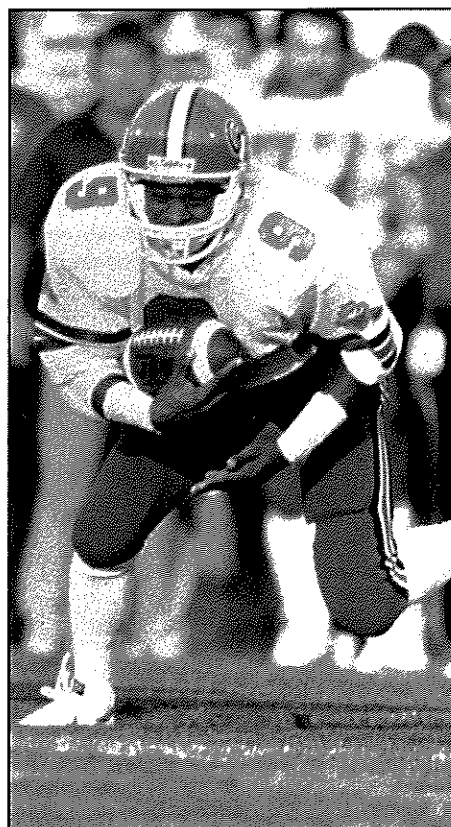

Serving College Athletics

Services

The National Collegiate Athletic Association:

- Maintains a central clearinghouse and counseling agency in the field of college athletics administration.
- Enacts legislation to deal with athletics problems when they spread across regional lines, and member institutions conclude that national action is needed.
- Provides financial and other assistance to various groups interested in the promotion and advancement of intercollegiate activities.
- Represents the colleges in legislative and regulatory matters on the state and Federal levels, covering topics such as Federal taxes affecting college athletics, anti-bribery and gambling laws, television, international competition and Federal aid to education affecting sports and physical education.
- Provides film/television production. The NCAA annually produces special programs for television and National Collegiate Championship highlights films. The NCAA also produces television coverage of NCAA championships not carried by a national television or cable network and provides a library of films containing more than 100 titles. The NCAA oversees the NCAA Television News Service, which supplies television and cable networks with material to increase NCAA sports and championship exposure.
- Sanctions postseason competition and certifies noncollegiate contests to protect the



interests of its members and their student-athletes.

- Compiles and distributes official statistics for intercollegiate football, basketball, baseball and softball.
- Promotes its championship events and all intercollegiate athletics through planned activities of its national office; conducts general public relations in behalf of the Association and its members; publishes The NCAA News and dozens of other publications to advise its members and other interested parties of events and information important to intercollegiate athletics.

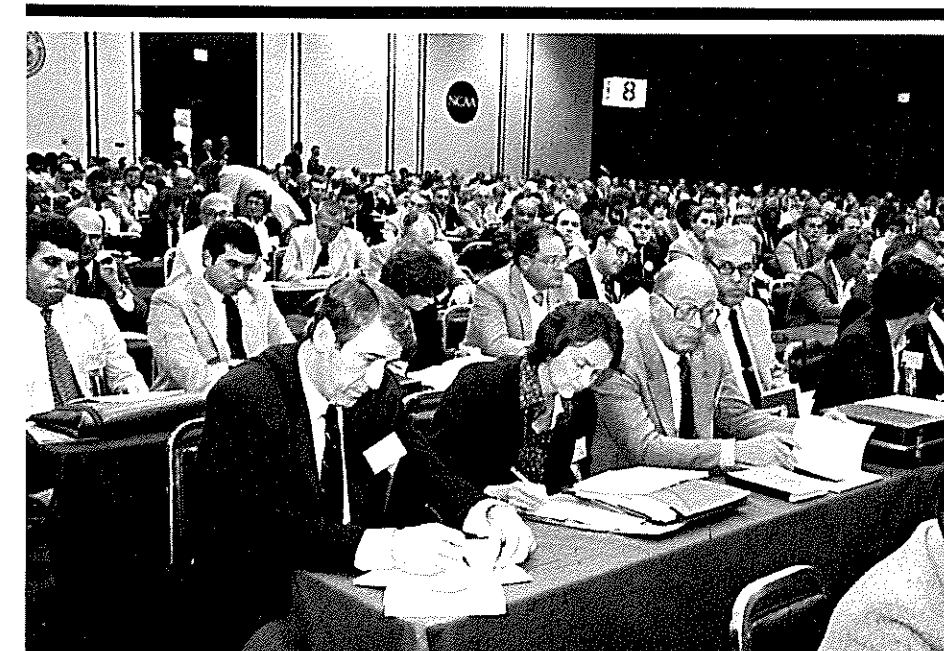
- Establishes committees to draw and interpret playing rules in 14 sports.

Serving Higher Education

Purposes

The purposes of the National Collegiate Athletic Association include these:

- To uphold the principle of institutional control of, and responsibility for, all intercollegiate athletics in conformity with the Association's constitution and bylaws.
- To serve as an overall national discussion, legislative and administrative body for the universities and colleges of the United States in matters of intercollegiate athletics.
- To legislate upon any subject of general concern to the membership in the administration of intercollegiate athletics.
- To encourage the adoption by its constituent members of eligibility rules in compliance with satisfactory standards of scholarship, amateur standing and good sportsmanship.
- To establish and supervise regional and national collegiate athletics contests under the auspices of the Association and establish rules of eligibility therefor.
- To formulate, copyright and publish rules of play for collegiate sports.
- To preserve collegiate athletics records.
- To cooperate with other amateur athletics organizations in the promotion and conduct of national and international athletics contests.
- To otherwise assist member institutions as requested in the furtherance of their intercollegiate athletics programs.

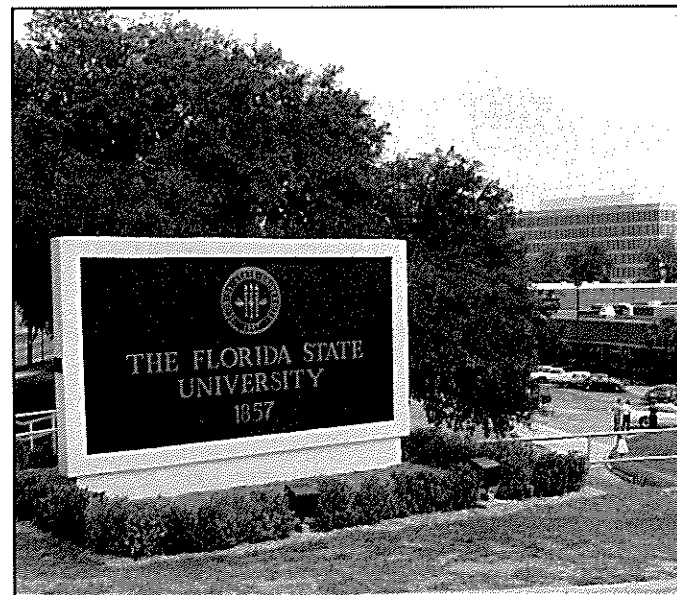
Florida State University, a coeducational institution with an enrollment of 21,500 students, is located in Tallahassee, the capital of Florida.

The beautiful 345-acre campus is wrapped in greenery that combines the blossoms of camellias, azaleas and dogwoods with palm trees and moss-hung oaks. The campus looks enough like Ivy League schools, particularly around its older, Gothic buildings, that several times each winter New York advertising agencies fake summer scenes supposedly shot at Princeton or Harvard. On the west side of campus, the scene is dominated by the contemporary, high-rise science complex.

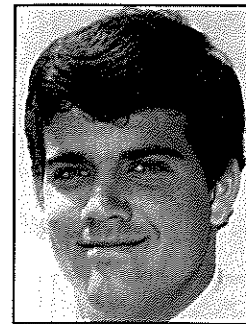
There are more than 1,300 faculty including four members of the National Academy of Sciences. Florida State is one of only five universities in the nation to have its own supercomputer.

Academic programs in the sciences (notably physics, chemistry, biology and meteorology) and the performing arts (music, theater, visual arts and dance) have high national rankings. Other strong departments among the 15 schools and colleges include criminology, hospitality administration, accounting, statistics and interior design. FSU's pre-med program has a much higher than average medical school placement rate for its graduates.

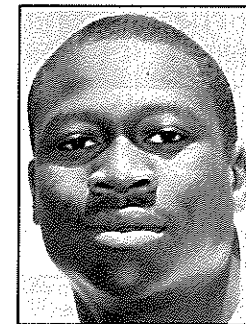
