# TONIGHT'S GAME

## Pirates Meet Eighth-Ranked Seminoles in Ficklen Opener

East Carolina, riding a wave of confidence after an impressive 32-14 season-opening win over rival N.C. State last weekend, returns home to Ficklen Stadium tonight to host the eight-ranked Seminoles of Florida State.

Florida State, which opened its season with a sound 40-16 win over Texas Tech a week ago, becomes the highest ranked team ever to invade Ficklen Stadium. A standing room only crowd of more than 35,000—which would break ECU's single game attendance record—is expected for this evening.

Tonight's game will feature an explosive Florida State offense against a Pirate defense which showed signs of improvement in the win over N.C. State. The ECU defense allowed the Wolfpack only 247 yards of total offense, which was nearly 100 yards better than any performance from last season by Pirate defenders.

ECU's run-and-shoot offense, led by versatile sophomore quarterback Travis Hunter, was equally impressive in last week's win over the Wolfpack.

Utilizing a ground attack on a wet and soggy Carter-Finley Stadium turf, the Pirates rushed for 295 yards and four touchdowns. Hunter was one of five ECU rushers with 50 yards or more on the night, as senior workhorse Anthony Simpson led all rushers with 67 yards.

Hunter, who won the Pirate signal-calling job this past spring, connected on four-of-five passes for 49 yards in the second half to keep the NCSU defense off balance. It was the classic Pirate option game, however, that Hunter ran so well, producing three second-half touchdowns.

Junior tailback Jarrod Moody was the recipient of two Hunter pitchouts that went for touchdowns—a five-yard toss in the first quarter and a 39-yard scamper in the fourth—to seal the win. Moody finished the game as ECU's second leading rusher (57 yards on five carries) and was the Pirates' leading receiver with two catches for 21 yards.

Defensively, ECU was led by its senior linebacking duo of Bubba Waters and Vinson Smith, who combined for 23 tackles. Smith and senior Ellis Dillahunt also added pass interceptions.

"It was a great feeling to earn that victory," said Art Baker in the crowded post-game locker room. "We came from behind twice and proved to ourselves and everybody that this team has a new attitude. We're going to have to enjoy this win for a few more hours and then prepare for one of the best football teams in the country in Florida State."

Baker should know. In 1983, he left his position as assistant head coach at ECU to become the associate head coach to Bobby Bowden at FSU. He helped recruit or coach many of the Seminole players who make up this 1987 squad.

FSU's powerful offense exploded for 30 first-half points as the Seminoles breezed to the win last Saturday over a Texas Tech team that earned a berth in the Independence Bowl last December.

Seminole quarterback Danny McManus (6-1, 199, Senior) had his finest statistical game of his career against the Red Raiders, passing for 275 yards and two touchdowns, while fullback Dayne Williams ran for two TDs in the victory.

Place-kicker Derek Schmidt kicked two field goals and added four extra points to become the school's all-time leading scorer with 287 career points. He is just five points shy of surpassing Tony Franklin of Texas A&M to move into the Top 10 among all-time scoring leaders in NCAA history.

FSU had two defensive players gathering national honors this season. Junior cornerback Deion Sanders was a pre-

season All-America selection in *Playboy Magazine*, while senior linebacker Paul McGowan is expected to be a finalist for the Dick Butkus Award given to the nation's top linebacker. McGowan went over the 300-tackle mark for his career last weekend.

The Seminole backfield was without the services of tailback Sammie Smith, an All-American candidate who sat out the Tech game with an injury. Smith, who led FSU to a 27-13 victory over Indiana in the All-American Bowl with 205 yards rushing during his freshman season, is expected to be in the lineup tonight against the Pirates.

McManus and reserve quarterback Chip Ferguson of Charlotte, N.C., combined for 39 passing attempts vs. Texas Tech. McManus (19-of-34, no interceptions) has a favorite target in Herb Gainer (six catches for 128 yards and one TD), but also looks to receivers Edgar Bennett, Pat Carter and Dexter Carter.

The Pirates and Seminoles have met four times in football with FSU leading the series 4-0. By far the most exciting game was the 1983 season-opener when the Seminoles escaped with a 47-46 win. All four games in the series have been in Tallahassee until tonight, and ECU's Baker is hoping to show his good friend Bobby Bowden around his new hometown.

"We plan to get together and visit for a while before the game," Baker said. "This game will mark the second straight week that we have played a team coached by a good friend of mine as last week we went against Dick Sheridan's N.C. State team. I'm just excited about the opportunity to play such an outstanding Florida State team and for the fans in eastern North Carolina to see this type of atmosphere here in Ficklen Stadium."



# HEAD COACH

## Art Baker



Art Baker, one of the most respected coaches on the collegiate level, begins his third season as head coach of the East Carolina University program.

Baker, who was associate head coach and offensive coordinator at ECU in 1983 and assistant head coach at Florida State in 1984, was

hired as the Pirates' 15th head football coach on December 14, 1984.

Baker's first two seasons as head coach saw the Pirates tackle schedules ranked among the toughest in the nation. Baker's teams faced four bowl participants in 1985 (Penn State, Miami-FL, Auburn and LSU) and repeated the feat in 1986 (NC State, Penn State, Auburn, and Miami-FL). The Pirates were assured of having played the 1986 national champion as they took on both Fiesta Bowl participants, Penn State and Miami, during the regular season.

Baker, with 27 years of intercollegiate football experience, owns a career record of 61-66-5 in 12 years of head coaching experience. Stops include Southern Conference entries Furman (1973-77) and The Citadel (1978-82) prior to ECU. Baker left both Furman and The Citadel with a winning record during his tenure.

The Sumter, SC, native is considered one of college football's top offensive minds. He spent 1984 directing Florida State's high-powered offense as he was responsible for play calling and tutoring FSU's quarterbacks. He also was directly responsible for revitalizing the Seminole running game as FSU averaged 274.6 yards a game on the ground, the fifth best average in the nation and the highest in Florida State history.

It was the option under Baker in 1983 that helped lead ECU to one of its finest seasons ever. The Pirates' "Freeze Option" offense, with Baker calling the plays, ranked 16th in the nation in rushing offense (239.4 yards per game).

Before coming to ECU Baker coached The Citadel in Charleston, SC, for five seasons, compiling a 30-24-1 mark for a .555 winning percentage, second best in the school's history. At Furman, where Baker was head coach from 1973-77, he guided the Paladins to a 27-24-5 record and shared Southern Conference Coach of the Year honors during the 1973 season. That season also saw Baker named Churchman's Coach of the Year.

The 1953 graduate of Presbyterian College (Clinton, SC) began his coaching career in the South Carolina high

school ranks as he was head coach at Eastern McColl (two years), Newberry (two years) and North Columbia's Eau Claire (six years), compiling an impressive 62-37-8 record.

In 1965 Baker went to Clemson to become the head freshman coach. That season saw Clemson's freshmen post a 4-0-1 record and from 1966 through 1969 Baker coached the varsity offensive backfield. In 1970 he moved to Texas Tech of the Southwest Conference as offensive backfield coach, where he remained until becoming head coach at Furman in 1973. The Red Raiders made Sun Bowl appearances twice (1970 and 1972) during Baker's three seasons at the Lubbock, TX, school.

## PIRATE NOTES

### PIRATES ENJOY OPENING SUCCESS

East Carolina quarterback Travis Hunter led the Pirate offense, while a host of defenders enjoyed a fine outing, as ECU defeated in-state rival N.C. State by a score of 32-14 last Saturday in Raleigh.

The Pirates' running game gained more yards (295) than in any contest during the 1986 season, while the defense allowed fewer yards (247) than in any game from last year.


ECU's offense had four runners with more than 50 yards rushing, while a fifth—Reggie McKinney—was just one shy as he rushed for 49 yards in a balanced attack. Fullback Anthony Simpson led all rushers with 67 yards on 18 carries. Tailback Jarrod Moody added 57 yards and two touchdowns, while third-team fullback George Franklin also added 57 yards. Hunter, who ran the Pirate offense effectively throughout the rainy evening, finished with 53 yards rushing and 53 passing (five-of-nine).

ECU came from behind twice in the game, rallying from 7-0 and 14-13 deficits to win its third game in the past five years over the Wolfpack.

### FICKLEN WELCOMES HIGHEST-RANKED GUEST

ECU will have little time to enjoy its season-opening victory as the Pirates must play host to the eighth-ranked (AP poll) Seminoles of Florida State. The first-ever visit by Bobby Bowden's Seminoles to Ficklen Stadium will mark the highest-ranked team ever to play in Greenville. Miami's 1985 nationally-ranked team was the last team to invade Ficklen Stadium as a member of the nation's top twenty.

The game will also mark the second straight week that the Pirates have faced a team that played in a post-season bowl last season. N.C. State played in the 1986 Peach Bowl, while FSU defeated Indiana, 27-13, in the All-American Bowl.

### ECU IN HOME OPENERS

East Carolina sports a 20-7 record in home openers since the 1960 season. The Pirates dropped a heart-breaker in their Ficklen Stadium debut last season, as West Virginia rallied to score with six seconds remaining to gain a 24-21 win.

### BAKER-BOWDEN CONNECTION

For the past 15 years, ECU's Art Baker has been a head coach on the collegiate level for all but two seasons—1983 and 1984. Ironically, during those two years Baker was an assistant head coach at East Carolina in '83, and associate head coach at Florida State in 1984.

Baker left his post as top aide to FSU's Bobby Bowden after the 1984 season to become the Pirates' 15th head coach.

This will be the first time a Baker-coached team has ever played Florida State. Bowden is 5-1 vs. ECU, with a 4-0 record as head coach at FSU and a 1-1 mark while at West Virginia.

### GEOGRAPHIC BREAKDOWN

East Carolina has 12 players on its roster who hail from the Sunshine State, while FSU has four North Carolinians on its roster.

The Pirates' top two quarterbacks are Floridians, as Travis Hunter hails from Winter Garden, while sophomore QB Charlie Libretto is from Middleburg. Libretto and FSU offensive tackle Pat Tomberlin played on the same Middleburg High School football team in 1984.

### SEMINOLES NOTES

Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden moved into sole possession of fourth place on the active list for coaches last Saturday with the Seminoles' 40-16 win over Texas Tech.

Bowden has currently won 164 career games and is behind only Bo Schembechler (207), Joe Paterno (199) and Vince Dooley (183) on the active list.

While ECU and FSU have not met on the gridiron since 1984, two of the Seminoles' top players have squared off against the Pirates already this year. FSU cornerback Deion Sanders, a preseason *Playboy* All-America selection, and flanker Ronald Lewis were both starting outfielders for the Seminoles' nationally-ranked baseball team that played East Carolina in the first round of the NCAA tournament this past spring. Sanders was two-for-four, while Lewis was 0-for-four as FSU earned the 10-5 win.

FSU place-kicker Derek Schmidt became the school's all-time leading scorer last week as he scored 10 of the 'Noles' 40 points to surpass Greg Allen's mark of 278 career points. Schmidt, who presently has scored 287 points, is just five points shy of moving into 10th place on the NCAA career scoring list. Schmidt currently trails Tony Franklin's (Texas A&M) mark of 291 points.

FSU linebacker Paul McGowan, expected to be a finalist for the third annual Dick Butkus award for the nation's top linebacker, surpassed the 300-tackle mark for his career last weekend.

The Pirates and Seminoles are scheduled to play again next season in Tallahassee on Oct. 15.


## Celebrating 130 Years

Students from every academic major have a chance to become stars on the highwire or flying trapeze by participating in the Flying High Circus, the only one of its kind in the nation.

Florida State academic programs extend well beyond Tallahassee. The FSU Marine Laboratory is located on the Gulf of Mexico, 45 miles away. Students participate in professional training programs at the Asolo State Theater in Sarasota and the Burt Reynolds Institute for Theatre Training in Jupiter. The Panama City Campus of Florida State offers upper-level courses which lead to bachelor's and master's degrees. The Center for Professional Development and Public Service, housed in the Florida State Conference Center on the edge of campus, manages educational outreach activities from Pensacola to Miami. In addition, Florida State maintains programs of study in England, Italy, Costa Rica, Switzerland, Yugoslavia, the Panama Canal Zone and even the People's Republic of China.

The physical growth of the University during the Sliger administration is best evidenced by such additions as the new wing of the Rovetta Business Building, the University Union expansion project, the new Paul A.M. Dirac Science Library Building, the Panama City Campus, the Jeffersonian Village Green project at the College of Law and the new building for the FAMU/FSU College of Engineering, now under construction.

Florida State is setting the pace as higher education in Florida prepares to enter the 21st century. And President Sliger takes pride not only in the academic programs and facilities of the University, but also in the people—students, faculty, alumni, administrators and staff—who make Florida State a successful monument to learning.



Florida State is the University which boasts of such diverse assets as the world's most powerful supercomputer and the greatest all-collegiate show on Earth, the Flying High Circus.

Located in Tallahassee, the capital of Florida, FSU is a public, coeducational university and a senior member of the State University System.

About 23,500 students representing all 50 states and more than 100 foreign countries work toward more than 250 different graduate and undergraduate degrees in the 15 schools and colleges of Florida State. The colleges of arts and sciences, business, communication, education, engineering, home economics, law and social sciences combine with the schools of criminology, library and information studies, music, nursing, social work, theatre and visual arts to make FSU a nationally acclaimed university.

The Florida State campus, located just a few blocks from the state Capitol, is one of the most beautiful in the southeast. Traditional Gothic-style structures combine with the latest in modern architecture, all brought together by an array of oaks, pines, palms, dogwoods and azaleas. The natural beauty of the 347-acre main campus mirrors the picturesque features of the surrounding North Florida region.

Florida State was founded in 1857 as the Seminary West of the Suwannee River. Name changes over the years included Florida State College and, in 1909, Florida State College for Women. Governor Millard Caldwell signed a bill in 1947 which again made the institution coeducational and named it Florida State University.

Today, Florida State faculty and administrators generate more than \$35 million annually in external funding to supplement state sponsorship of research. In addition, almost \$13 million in private gifts was raised through the FSU Foundation during the past fiscal year. These contributions from alumni, friends, corporations, the university community and charitable foundations are for the sole benefit of Florida State's academic programs.

The FSU Supercomputer Computations Research Institute has attracted international attention to the University, home of the world's fastest supercomputer. The ETA 10 has the capacity to perform 10 billion calculations per second.

The Tandem Van de Graaf-Superconducting Accelerator Laboratory in the Department of Physics houses two powerful atom smashers and has been ranked in the top four in the nation by the National Science Foundation.

The University's location affords excellent research and internship opportunities in government, law and the social sciences. The reputation of Florida State's research programs, the expertise of its more than 1,500 faculty members—including four members of the National Academy of Sciences—and the quality of the graduate students involved in research represent major strengths of the University.

Programs in music, dance and theater at Florida State have earned well-deserved national recognition. The visual and performing arts exhibited and produced on campus offer students and the community a wealth of enrichment opportunities.

Student activities at FSU create an important balance between the classroom experience and the personal life of the individual scholar. Honors programs, student government, intramural sports and more than 200 organizations are available for student involvement.
