# Teepee Talk

## Watching the Seminoles on Television

Well, it's been three weeks since the last time you were able to see the Seminoles play, right? Remember that ACC opener against Duke back on Sept. 5. Sure am sorry you missed those games with Clemson and N.C. State. They were fun to watch.

What's that you say? You saw those games. And sitting right in your living room, no less. No travel, no expense, no hassle. Just sit back sipping a cold one and watching the Noles. Well how about that!

Ain't television great? Imagine life before the tube brought most every game into our homes. It wasn't that long ago. Television sports has undergone tremendous growth in the last decade. We at Florida State have been on the leading edge. Aside from Notre Dame, no college football program in the land has enjoyed the television exposure that we have at Florida State.

And few teams seem to thrive on the exposure like the Seminoles. FSU's all-time record on television is 51-26-3 since the first showing, in the 1958 Bluegrass Bowl against Oklahoma State on ABC. FSU has

appeared on that network more than any other, with 37 appearances. CBS has televised 11 Tribe contests, WTBS nine and ESPN 13, including a record five in 1989.

The Florida State-Miami game has become an automatic for top billing among the major networks. Last year's thriller garnered the highest television ratings of the year for ABC, while the Michigan game also ranked among the network's top five broadcasts.

But with all that we have, it has created one major problem. Many FSU fans have gotten spoiled. There is a prevalent feeling that if the Seminoles are playing, they must be on TV. And if they're not — it's a crime against society.

Well, this season, in fact, every Florida State football game *is* being televised. Conceivably, a Seminole fan, living in any major market in Florida, could watch all 11 games at home. But please don't look at this as your "right" as a fan. It is certainly anything but. It should more aptly be described as a great privilege, brought about by a successful program, a great athletic conference and good negotiating by Athletic Director Bob Goin.

As evidenced by the number of letters I receive, the rules governing college football television are as misunderstood by fans as any other issue of our day. Many fans, it seems, think no rules or restrictions exist at all. Essentially, it's as if we can just plug in cameras and roll 'em every time we tee it up.

Not so!

Here is my attempt to eliminate some of the confusion you may have regarding the Seminoles on the tube.

Florida State University is a member of two governing bodies that control all college football television. First and foremost is the College Football Association (CFA). FSU is one of 64 Division I-A schools who are members of this body for the primary purpose of negotiating network TV contracts. Presently the CFA and its members have exclusive contracts with ABC and ESPN. Those networks have first choice of which college games to televise each Saturday.

Amazingly, Florida State will likely appear on these networks five times in 1992. Although all 64 schools share in some of the wealth generated by the CFA contract with ABC and ESPN, schools and their conferences who are actually chosen to appear each Saturday get the bulk of the money. Each conference is guaranteed a certain number of appearances, but some individual schools will not be chosen at all this year. The maximum appearances for any one team in a year is six.

Florida State's national network games will likely be Clemson and Virginia (ESPN), and Miami, Georgia Tech and Florida (ABC).

Secondly, our conference, the ACC, is allowed to telecast a game each Saturday. These live telecasts are required to kickoff prior to 12:30 so as to protect the CFA's afternoon and evening window for ABC and ESPN. The ACC has a contract with Jefferson-Pilot, a production company based in Charlotte, N.C. These ACC games can be seen on local stations up and down the east coast and in every major market in Florida.

The Seminoles will make three appearances on this package as games with N.C. State, North Carolina and Maryland have been selected.

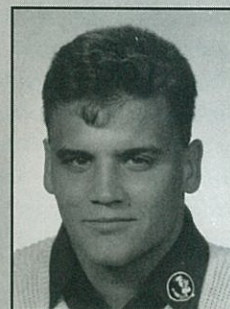
With eight games covered by the CFA and ACC this year, that left only games with Duke, Wake Forest and Tulane uncovered. Here's where pay-per-view comes in. The CFA contract strictly prohibits individual members from putting together a live telecast of their games, unless it is offered on a pay-per-view basis. Thus, those three games are either shown on pay-per-view or not at all.

We are very fortunate to have Sunshine Network as a partner in our pay-per-view venture. Since Sunshine was already prepared to produce our games for a delayed playback, the network went to cable operators statewide and pitched a pay-per-view package for live viewing.

In the end, we have the unique ability to say that all 11 FSU games in 1992 can be seen on live television — eight of those at no charge to the public. I'm not sure that any other program in America can make that claim.

In any event, enjoy tonight's game here at Doak Campbell Stadium live and in color. And the next time you catch the Seminoles on the tube you'll really know how it came about.

## Tribe Scholar-Athlete of the Week



Brian Xanders  
Linebacker

The Tribe Scholar-Athlete of the Week is senior Brian Xanders. The Tallahassee native carries a 3.1 grade point average into his final year at Florida State University. Xanders, a 6-2, 222-pound inside linebacker, is enrolled in FSU's highly regarded School of Business as a management major.

Business is the track Brian chose to pursue since his first day on the FSU campus. But it has been football that has helped him succeed in the classroom. "The work

ethic you gain on the football field carries over into your schooling," Xanders said. "When we are studying game film, it's a lot like class. It's a learning experience."

Xanders appears to be equally adept at learning on the football field. A walk-on from Lincoln High in Tallahassee, Xanders worked his way up the depth chart with his ability to think on the field.

"Brian was a quick study," said linebacker coach Wally Burnham. "He learned every assignment and tendency very quickly. It was just a matter of time before he gained the physical strength needed to play the position."

Seminole Academic Advisor Mark Meleney has worked with Xanders since his first year in school. "Brian worked with me as a student assistant his first year at

FSU," Meleney said. "I think he got a chance to learn about the rules and regulations of the University. That has helped him as a student."

Xanders is a goal-oriented man, one who takes everything he does seriously. "I have only missed three classes since day one at FSU," Brian said. "I pay close attention and take good notes in class."

Xanders would like to remain in the sports field after graduation. Before he enters the work force, Brian plans to get his MBA. Working in the front office of a professional sports organization or becoming a sports agent tops Brian's list of career choices. It may be sports that helped Xanders in the classroom, but it may be what he learns in the classroom that later helps him in sports.

# The Comeback Kid

Dan Footman Has Overcome Knee Injury to Become a Star

**A**ppearing to be chiseled out of the largest chunk of stone this side of the Acropolis, Dan Footman is cut from a mold that could only read "football star" on the bottom. He throws his 6-6, 280-pound body around opposing backfields like the proverbial bull in a china shop. But this sure-fire NFL star nearly saw his amazing potential shelved two seasons ago. And it is a tribute to Footman's inner strength, and the FSU medical team, that he is racing after opposing quarterbacks today.

Blessed with such athletic talent that he anchored his Hillsborough High School's (Tampa) state championship 4 x 100 team, Footman collapsed after a routine tackle during preseason drills three years ago, grabbing his left knee.

At first, Footman was not that concerned about the injury. Trainers took him from the field and his injured knee was X-rayed and examined by team doctors. Footman assumed all was well with his injury as he waited in his room for most of the next week.

"I didn't really know anything," he said. "I didn't think that it was as bad as it was. The doctor came to the training room and examined me and then I went home for a week and stayed off my feet. A week later, I went to the hospital and had four and a half hours of surgery. That's when I learned how serious it was."

It is not unusual for the FSU medical staff to wait some days after an injury to determine whether surgery is necessary. Team physicians prefer to wait for the swelling to subside and get a good look at the damage before assessing whether surgery, the last resort, must be performed.

Once surgery appeared necessary, Dr. Tom Haney realized it was the worst knee injury he had seen. In fact, just walking normally again was in question. However, Dr. Haney performed the mechanical repairs that put Footman back together. The rehabilitation, however, would depend on the dedication of Footman and the FSU trainers.

While perhaps FSU's most physically imposing and gifted athlete, Footman would begin the comeback with the toughest step of all — overcoming the mental injury.

"My first reaction was bitterness," said Footman. "I was miserable without playing. It just wasn't fair. I would go to class and all these people would ask me about the team and other players and I just did not care. I blamed the coaches for my injury and I had to get over that."

Helping Footman over this largest hurdle was assistant trainer Jack Marucci who was almost a constant companion over the next year.

"His attitude of being mad and bitter about the whole thing is pretty typical," said Marucci. "But he was in pain, too. We, as trainers, try to give him the psychological boost he needs to deal with the injury." Marucci became one of Footman's closest confidants and worked with him every day during the grueling rehabilitation process.

"He came in for about four hours every day," Marucci continued. "We put him in a CPM (Continuous Passive Motion) machine for two hours every morning and two hours every afternoon. It kept his leg moving without him actually manipulating

it. The machine is used to reduce scarring and it keeps the knee from stiffening. The machine was very important to the reconstructive process and surgery."

Footman's rehabilitative powers were incredible and within weeks the strength was returning to his knee.

"Dan injured three out of the four ligaments in his knee," said Marucci. "The injury really could not have been much worse, but it's strictly up to the individual to have the desire to return. And Dan definitely wanted this, he wanted to play."

And play he did. An almost unimaginable 11 months after suffering the injury, Footman trotted on to the field to play in last year's season opener against BYU.

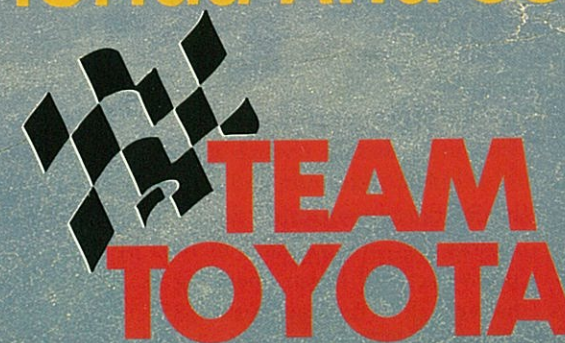
So complete has been his recovery that he has broken records. From the slow process of walking with crutches, then without crutches, then on the treadmill, and the Cybex machine, Footman had put himself in position to be a player again.

# Talking Defense with Mickey Andrews

Mickey Andrews is widely recognized as one of the top defensive coaches in the nation. A former All-America mention as a wide receiver and defensive back at Alabama, Andrews has been the defensive coordinator at Florida State for the past eight seasons. He served the same position at Clemson, Florida and with the Arizona Wranglers of the USFL. Under Andrews, FSU's defense has moved back to the top of the national rankings. As defensive backs coach, Andrews has directed Jim Thorpe Award winners Deion Sanders and Terrell Buckley.

This year, Florida State's defense appears to be as good as any. Loaded with depth and talent, it has been put to the test already at Clemson and N.C. State. Joey Ferolito of the Sports Information Office recently sat down with Coach Andrews, who talked about some of the changes in his defense, and the game itself, over the years. And also about this year's talent-rich unit.

**Q** Each year it seems we have been getting better and better on defense. What are we doing differently, or are we just getting better players?

**A** I think it is a combination of a couple of things. We're getting better players, and when I say that, I mean, we are getting more quality athletes. People that can run. People with more size, speed and agility. The major reason is that these guys are willing to go out there and work and do the little things that it takes to become successful on defense. We have adjusted our scheme a little as we have gone along. What we have tried to do is take our personnel and do the things that will let them turn loose and make plays.

**Q** What have been some of the scheme changes in our defense over the years?

**A** When I first came here, we were very basic. Our emphasis was probably 90 percent on fundamentals and intensity, and we didn't work a lot on different schemes.

We didn't play a lot of different defenses. We didn't play a lot of different coverages. We tried to get a lot of repetitions and improve fundamentally, and in the long run become players like that. As we have been able to recruit more talent, maybe draw a little more talented athlete into our program, then we have been able to expand our scheme. Basically, rather than sitting and reading, we're doing more of an attack scheme on defense, where we're attacking with our defensive front. A lot more pressure, blitzes, man-to-man type coverages. A mixture of zones and combinations. Probably expanding our base as well as our nickel (defense system in sure passing situation that puts five players in the secondary), it doesn't even resemble what we started with eight or nine years ago.

**Q** The game has changed a lot over the years with so many different type of defenses, such as the one-back set. Is it easier to adjust now that we are out of the basics?

**A** Well, there is a lot of difference. There has been a great change in offensive schemes. There are so many more one-back teams. We played Duke, which is primarily a one-back team, although they featured

some two-back offense against us. They want to spread people out and throw the football — a higher ratio of pass than run. Then you get against a team like Clemson, they want to run the football with very few passes involved. They will spread you a little bit, but they want to bunch you up and run the ball inside. Pound, pound, pound, and then put the ball on the corner with the sweep and the option, with maybe not great emphasis on the passing game. Last week (against N.C. State) we went against a team that is real strong on the option. They run a lot more different types of option plays than say Clemson does. They do a great job of spreading you out. Their quarterback is a little more talented as far as pushing the ball down field, more accurate, and that's not taking anything away from the kid at Clemson, it's just a different style of offense.

N.C. State is very well coached. They put a lot of pressure on you. You're seeing all those different looks — one week you

# A Look Back

*Nugent Reminisces About Early Years at FSU*

**C**oach Tom Nugent and wife Pam are returning to campus this weekend for a joyous reunion with the first three teams that he coached at Florida State. Coach Nugent, who led the Seminoles from 1953-58, was recently called at his Indian Harbor Beach home and asked to reflect on his early years at FSU.

**Q** Of your years in coaching, did you have a period you considered the best?

**A** "Without a doubt, my happiest and most exciting were at Florida State."

**Q** What were some of the highlights of those years?

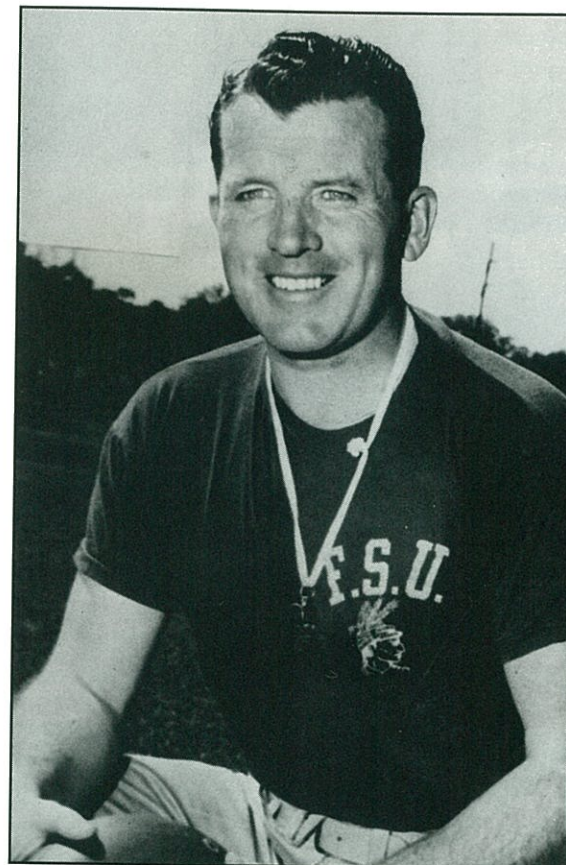
**A** "I came to Tallahassee after successful years at V.M.I. We had beaten FSU the previous season, 28-6. The Florida State Athletic Council spelled it out when they gave me the job as head coach. They wanted big-time football and they wanted it in a hurry. Immediate future opponents were already scheduled, including Georgia, Auburn, N.C. State, Miami and Georgia Tech, among others.

"My responsibility was to rapidly prepare for the battle. They gave me a head start with a vastly improved budget, an enlarged coaching staff and scholarship program. We had a total of 70 scholarships."

**Q** Did you have many veteran players?

**A** "At the end of spring practice (my first year), which was an intense, physically demanding program, we had a total of 17 men. They were a tough and inspired group.

"Approximately 45 new players were recruited for that first squad and most of them survived a wild, driving preseason. The majority were freshmen, but we also

had a number of junior college graduates who were eligible to play. The junior college players added some maturity and they were good athletes."

**Q** What are your most vivid memories of those early years?

**A** "(In 1953) we took a shellacking in our opener against Miami but came back to beat Louisville. That same year we had an emotional upset win over V.M.I., a veteran outfit which had walloped FSU the year before. In late season, we had a smashing victory over N.C. State and two more wins in our final two games.

"We had five victories in a 10-game season and the future looked much brighter.

"The following year (1954) we opened the season with a tough loss to a strong

Georgia club. Then, battered and bruised, we lost our second game. After a memorable 'get right' party, which everyone on that squad will remember forever, that courageous group won eight games and was selected to play in the New Year's Day Sun Bowl game.

"We lost, but the Seminoles were established forever as a 'big-time' team. I'll never forget that dedicated squad and our loyal and talented coaching staff."

**Q** Many funny stories are often told by your coaches and players about those early years. Do you have one that stands out?

**A** "In the (1955) Sun Bowl game, Lee Corso put us temporarily in the lead with a great run for a touchdown. On the play he was seriously injured, carried from the field, and taken to an El Paso hospital.

"Following the game I hurried to the hospital to see Lee, but was told that he had signed himself out, even though his leg was broken (a fractured fibula). He

was nowhere to be found.

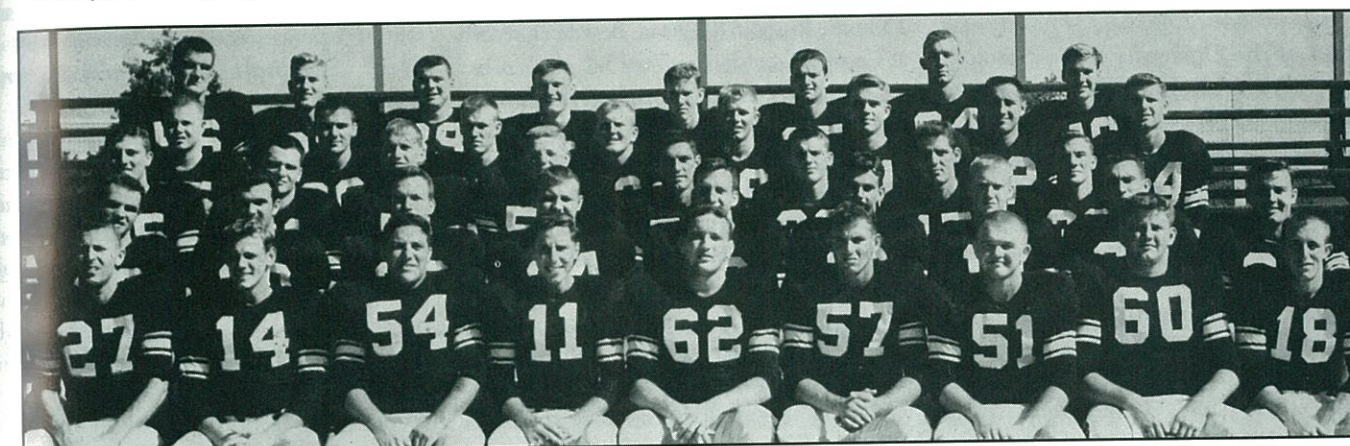
"Later that night, my assistant coaches talked me into going across the nearby Mexican border into Juarez. They knew that I was very depressed after losing the game.

"Low and behold, on the stage in one of those wild border town night spots, there was Lee Corso, his leg in a cast, dancing with a buxom Mexican chorus girl. I nearly attacked him. Corso, now an ESPN College Football GameDay commentator, and I still chuckle over it."

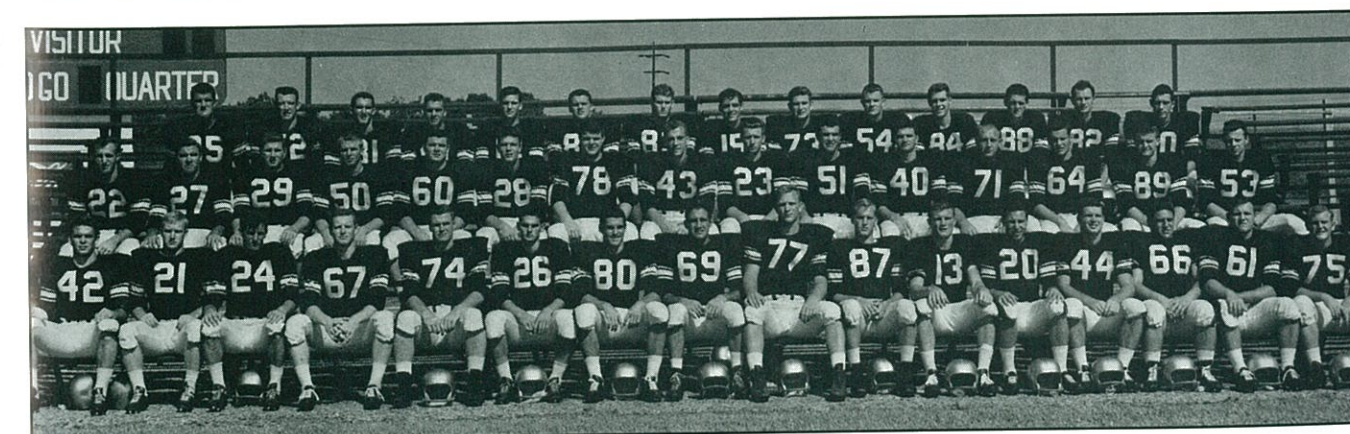
