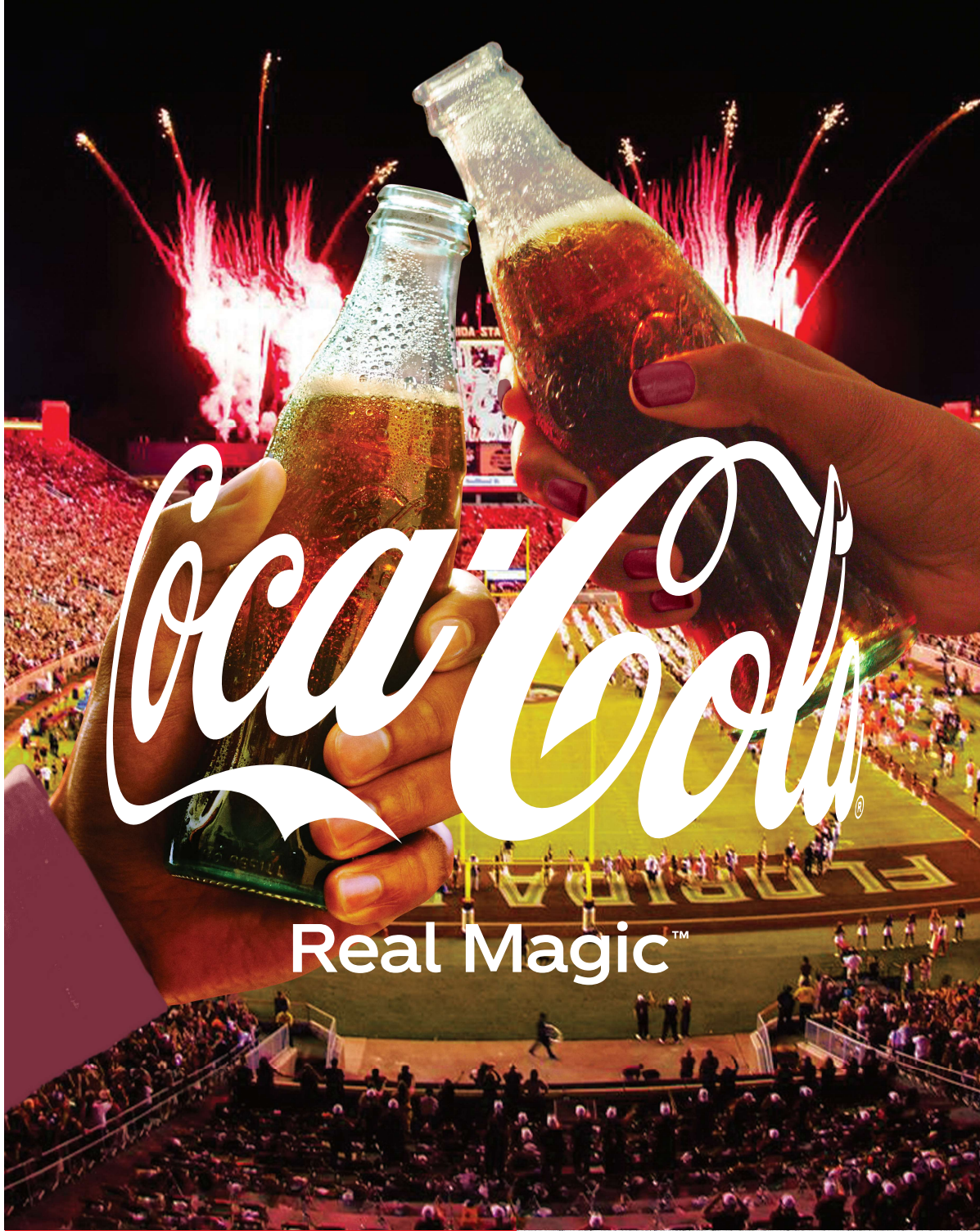

FLORIDA STATE VS. GEORGIA TECH

- Florida State hosts Georgia Tech in a noon matchup. Both teams come into the game with extra time off, as the Seminoles had an open date last week and Georgia Tech hosted Virginia on Thursday night.
- The Seminoles have played the 6th-toughest schedule in the nation so far this season with their first seven opponents combining for a 68.2 winning percentage according to NCAA Statistics.
- FSU is one of nine teams in the nation, and the only team in the ACC, averaging at least 260 yards of passing offense and at least 200 yards of rushing offense per game this season.
- Florida State's average of 5.63 yards per rush attempt is the best in the conference and 10th in the country, and its 1.29 sacks allowed per game is the best average in the ACC and ranks 28th nationally. The last time Florida State rushed for at least 5.6 yards per carry for a season was 2013. The Seminoles have 14 games without allowing a sack in the last 10 years, including two each in 2021 and 2022.
- FSU ranks 2nd in the conference in rushing offense and total offense, with its average of 204.4 rushing yards per game standing 22nd nationally and its 465.0 yards of total offense per game ranking 26th. The last time the Seminoles averaged more than 200 yards rushing per game for an entire season was 2016's 202.3 yards per game. The 465.0 yards of total offense average would be the highest since the 2016 season's average of 466.4.

QUICK HITS

- Florida State ranks 2nd in the ACC and 13th in the country in passing defense, holding opponents to an average of 175.0 yards per game through the air. That would be FSU's lowest pass defense average in a season since the 2013 team's average of 156.6 yards per game. Since that season, only the 2015 and 2017 defenses allowed less than 200 passing yards per game in a season.
- The Seminoles are 3rd in the ACC and 25th in the nation in total defense allowing an average of 332.0 yards per game.
- FSU also ranks in the top-4 in the ACC in third-down conversions, yards per completion, passing offense and passing efficiency. The Seminoles have converted 47.8 percent of their third-down opportunities, which is the 3rd-best percentage in the conference and 24th in the country, while their average of 13.61 yards per completion is 3rd in the ACC and 27th nationally, its passing efficiency rating of 145.51 is 4th in the ACC and 45th nationally and its average of 260.6 passing yards per game is 4th in the ACC and 51st in the country.
- Florida State has scored on 10 of its 14 first drives of a half this season, with nine touchdowns on those 10 scoring drives. FSU scored touchdowns on its first drive of both halves against Duquesne, at Louisville, against Boston College and against Wake Forest, scored a touchdown on the first drive of the game vs. Clemson and also made a field goal to open the second half against LSU.
- Florida State is one of two teams in the country that is ranked in the top-15 in both kickoff return average and punt return average. FSU is 3rd in the ACC and 8th in the country with an average of 26.00 yards per kickoff return and is 2nd in the conference and 13th nationally with an average of 14.90 yards per punt return. The Seminoles also have the ACC's 2nd-best punt return defense, allowing 3.38 yards per opponent punt return to rank 21st in the country.

QB #13

JORDAN TRAVIS

- Redshirt junior **Jordan Travis** is the leading career rusher among Florida State quarterbacks, with 1,539 yards on the ground and 19 touchdowns. His 19 rushing touchdowns rank 14th overall in FSU history, tied with Jermaine Thomas (2008-11).
- Travis is 322-for-534 passing for 4,335 yards and 32 touchdowns at Florida State. He ranks 15th in school history in passing yards and completions and 18th in touchdown passes.
- Including his 40 rushing yards and 71 passing yards at Louisville in 2018, Travis is one of 10 active players with at least 4,000 passing yards (4,406) and 1,500 rushing yards (1,579) in FBS.
- Travis accounted for three touchdowns against No. 4 Clemson, including a 20-yard touchdown run that opened the scoring. His 24 completions and 42 attempts were career highs. Travis has 11 career games with multiple touchdown passes.
- Travis ran for a season-high 108 yards at No. 14 NC State, including a 71-yard run that set up FSU's first touchdown. It was the second-longest rush of Travis's career (88 vs. Pitt, 2020); the longest run for FSU in 2022; and tied a Dalvin Cook run in the 2016 Orange Bowl for the 6th-longest non-touchdown run in FSU history.

RB #3

TREY BENSON

- Twice this season - against Boston College and Duquesne - FSU's three primary running backs have scored a rushing touchdown.
- In the season opener against Duquesne, **Treshaun Ward** (127), **Trey Benson** (105) and **Lawrance Toaffil** (101) became the first trio of Seminoles to rush for 100 yards in the same game. Ward scored two touchdowns, while Benson, Toaffil, **Rodney Hill** and quarterback **Jordan Travis** also scored on the ground.
- Travis ran for 108 yards at No. 14 NC State, his fifth career 100-yard rushing game. It is just the 5th time in school history - and first since having five players in 2012 - that FSU has four different players have at least one 100-yard rushing game in a single season.
- Benson's kickoff return touchdown against BC was FSU's first since the 2013 BCS National Championship Game against Auburn (Kermit Whitfield). It was Benson's first career kickoff return and he is one of 19 players with a kick return touchdown this season.
- The return was just the third in school history - and first in the 73-year history of Doak Campbell Stadium - to open a game. Eddie McMillan and Tamarick Vanover both took the opening kickoff back at Miami in 1971 and 1992, respectively.
- On offense, Benson carried the ball 10 times for 78 yards, with touchdown runs of 15 and 36 yards. He is the first player in FSU history with a kickoff return touchdown and two offensive touchdowns in the same game. Benson's 15-yard touchdown capped a 94-yard drive, FSU's longest of the season.
- He finished with 177 all-purpose yards against the Eagles - 93 KO return, 78 rushing and 6 receiving.

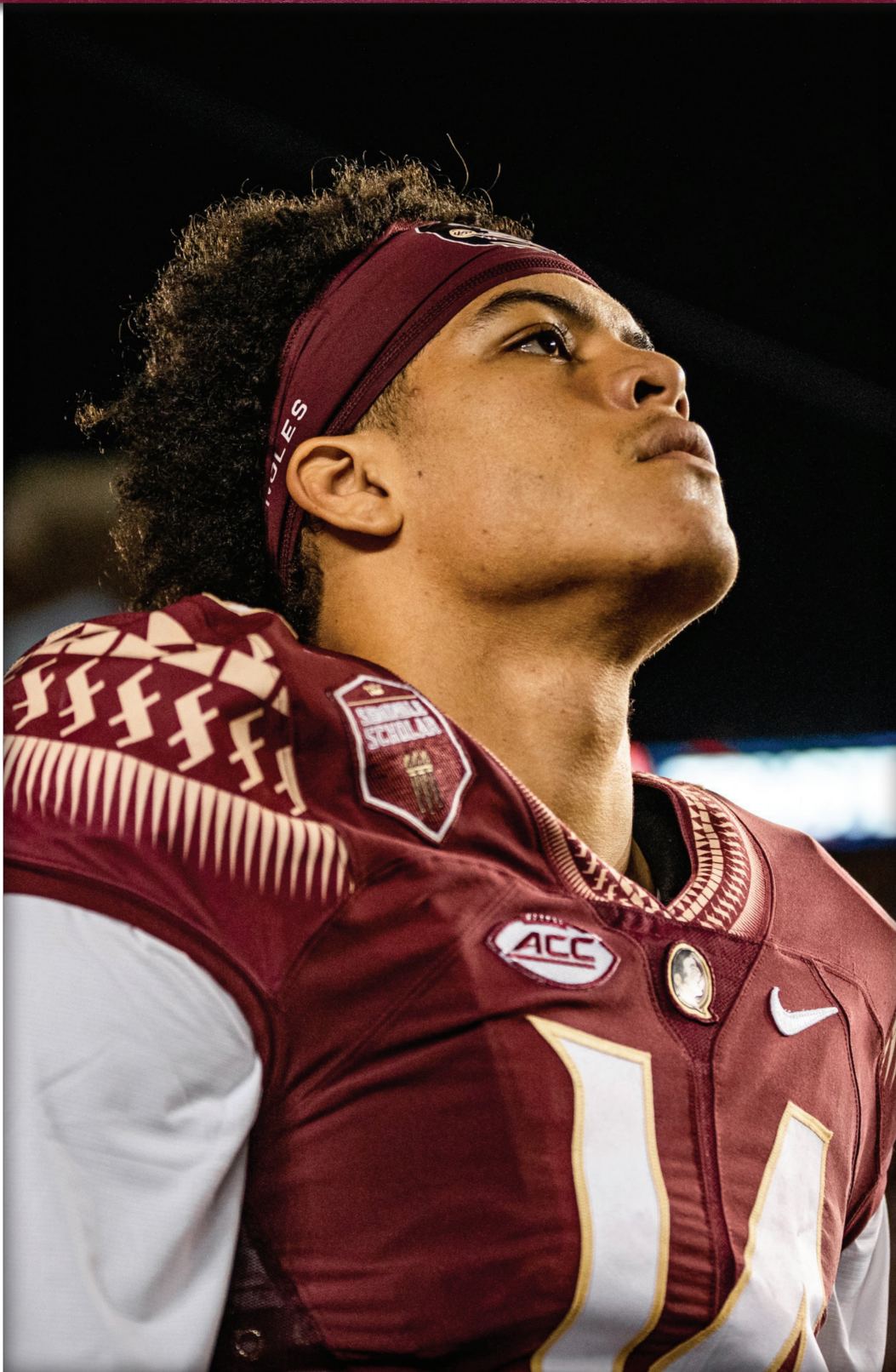

JOHNNY WILSON

- Florida State had five different leading receivers in the first five games this season. **Johnny Wilson** has had at least a share of the team lead in receiving yards four times, most recently on six catches for 75 yards vs. No. 4 Clemson.
- Wilson is 3rd in the ACC and 32nd nationally with 18.22 yards per reception.
- At Louisville, Wilson was named ACC Receiver of the Week after setting career highs with seven catches, 149 yards and two touchdowns, both in the fourth quarter of FSU's 35-31 win. Wilson's 149 receiving yards are the 2nd-most in a road game this season in the ACC.
- Wilson caught a 69-yard pass from **Tate Rodemaker** against the Cardinals, the longest play in both players' career. On the next play, Wilson caught a 10-yard touchdown.
- In the fourth quarter, Wilson caught a two-yard touchdown from Rodemaker on 3rd-and-goal that proved to be the game winner.
- Wilson's 149 receiving yards are the most for any Seminole receiver since 2019 and the 2nd-most in FSU's 23-game series against Louisville (Kermit Whitfield, 172 in 2015).
- Against Wake Forest, Wilson caught six passes for 85 yards and a touchdown, his team-high third of the year. Wilson leads FSU with 27 catches, 492 yards and 70.3 yards per game.



LB #15

TATUM BETHUNE

- **Tatum Bethune** had a season-high 14 tackles at No. 14 NC State, the most for a Seminole this year. It was Bethune's ninth career double-digit tackle game and his second at FSU (10 at Louisville). Bethune had 2.5 tackles for loss against the Wolfpack, tying a career high.
- Bethune leads FSU's linebackers with 49 tackles and is 2nd with 6.5 tackles for loss. Bethune also recovered a fumble at Louisville, the first of his career.
- Bethune's 10 tackles at Louisville pushed him past 200 for his career. He enters the Georgia Tech game with 234 career tackles.
- Bethune has started all seven games for FSU. He had seven solo tackles against LSU, with 1.0 sack and 2.0 tackles for loss. Against Duquesne, Bethune had one of the Noles six tackles for loss and one of five pass breakups. He added a TFL and QB hurry vs. No. 22 Wake Forest.
