


#### FLORIDA STATE vs. LOUISIANA


- Florida State moved up to 20th in both the AP and Coaches polls this week after its 38-3 win at Syracuse, which was FSU's ACC-best fourth 30-point victory this season. The Seminoles are the only P5 team with two 30-point wins on the road and one of only four P5 programs along with Ohio State, Tennessee and Georgia with three 30-point victories in conference play.
- FSU is the first ACC school to allow 65 or fewer passing yards to back-to-back conference opponents in records dating back to 2000 (62 at Miami, 65 at Syracuse; the two lowest passing outputs among ACC offenses this season) and the first team to hold consecutive FBS opponents to 65 passing yards or less since Appalachian State in 2019.
- During its current three-game winning streak, Florida State has outscored its opponents 124-22 while outgaining them 1,516-612 in total offense. The Seminoles are averaging 235.0 rushing yards and 270.3 passing yards per game while holding opponents to 95.7 rushing yards and 108.3 passing yards per game. Florida State has completed 72.1 percent of its passes and is 15-of-16 on red zone opportunities in that stretch.
- FSU leads the nation with seven touchdown drives of 90+ yards and is 2nd nationally with 15 touchdown drives of 80+ yards this season. The Seminoles also rank 3rd in explosive play rate differential, trailing only Georgia and Ohio State, with an offense explosive play rate of 16.62 percent that ranks 6th nationally and a defense explosive plays allowed rate of 8.98 percent that is 12th in the country (via ESPN Stats & Info).

#### **QUICK HITS**

Florida State is one of four teams in the nation that ranks in the top-20 in both total offense and total defense, along with Georgia, Ohio State and Alabama. Florida State, Georgia and Ohio State are the only teams ranked in the top-10 in yards per play on offense and defense. The Seminoles are 10th nationally with an average of 6.89 yards per play on offense and 10th with an average of 4.62 yards allowed per play on defense. FSU is 11th in the country allowing an average of 293.6 yards per game on defense and 16th in the country with 477.1 yards of total offense per game.

FSU is one of four teams in the country, and the only team in the ACC, averaging at least 260 yards of passing offense and at least 210 yards of rushing offense per game this season. Of the three ACC teams averaging better than 260 yards of passing offense, the next-closest rushing offense is North Carolina's 163.9 rushing yards per game.

Florida State is 1st in the ACC and 2nd in the country in pass defense, holding opponents to an average of 155.0 yards per game through the air. The Seminoles also are 1st in the ACC and rank 7th nationally holding opponents to an average of 5.9 yards per pass attempt.

Florida State has scored on 14 of 20 first drives of a half this season, with 13 touchdowns on those 14 scoring drives for a total of 92 points. The Seminoles lead the ACC and are tied for 2nd in the country in touchdown rate on opening drives of a half (via ESPN Stats & Info).

FSU has rushed for at least 200 yards in five straight games, the program's longest streak since starting the 1995 season with six consecutive 200-yard games. The Seminoles lead the ACC in yards per rush and rushing offense, with their average of 5.53 yards per rush 11th nationally, and their average of 213.6 rushing yards per rush 11th nationally.

Florida State is one of two teams in the country that is ranked in the top-25 in kickoff return average, punt return average and punt return defense. FSU is 7th in the country and 3rd in the ACC with an average of 24.77 yards per kickoff return, is 2nd in the conference and 17th in the nation allowing an average of 3.38 yards per punt return and is 3rd in the conference and 22nd nationally with an average of 11.83 yards per punt return.

Florida State's defense has held opponents to an average of 129.6 yards of total offense in the first half, with opponents gaining only 55.9 yards rushing and 73.7 yards passing in the first 30 minutes. The Seminoles are outscoring opponents 195-81 in the first half and have held seven opponents to three or fewer first-half points.

Mike Norvell is 18-5 (.783) in November, including 2-0 this season, with an average margin of victory of 40.6-25.5.





# QB #13 JORDAN TRAVIS

- Redshirt junior Jordan Travis became the second player in school history and first since Red Parish in 1949 with a rushing, passing and receiving touchdown in the same game when he accomplished the feat in FSU's 38-3 win at Syracue. Travis completed 21-of-23 passes against the Orange for a career-best 91.3 completion percentage; it was his fourth consecutive game with at least three touchdowns and one or fewer turnover, joining Jameis Winston as the only FSU OBs over the past 15 years to do that.
- In the first half at Syracuse, Travis was 17-for-18 passing with two touchdowns, completing the final 12 passes of the half, his most consecutive completions in his career topping his 11 straight completions to start the
- Louisville game this year. Twelve Noles caught at least one pass against the Orange.
- Travis became the 13th 5,000-yard passer at Florida State in the win and enters the Louisiana game with 5,088 passing yards at FSU; he is 11th in program history with 41 touchdown passes and 13th with 377 completions.
- on the ground, Travis is FSU's leading career rusher among quarterbacks, with 1,563 yards and 20 touchdowns. His 20 rushing touchdowns rank 12th overall in FSU history, tied with James Wilder Jr. (2011) and Mark Lyles (1976-79).
- Including his 40 rushing yards and 71 passing yards at Louisville in 2018, Travis is one of nine active players with at least 5,000 passing yards (5,159) and 1,500 rushing yards (1,603) in FBS.
- Travis was 10-for-12 for 202 yards and three touchdowns at Miami, one of four games this season he has tied his career high passing touchdowns.

   Travis is top four among ACC quarterbacks in yards per completion, yards per attempt, points responsible for, passing efficiency, passing yards, total offense, completion percentage, passing touchdowns and passing yards per game. He has completed at least 60 percent of his passes in 10 rib lis last 14 games.


# RB #3 TREY BENSON

- With 230 rushing yards at Syracuse, Florida State has rushed for over 200 yards in five consecutive games, its longest streak since opening the 1995 season with six straight.
- The Noles have six 200-yard rushing games this season, including a season-high 406 yards against Duquesne that is the 3rd-most for any Power 5 team this season. FSU leads the ACC with 213.60 rushing yards per game and 5.53 yards per carry.
- In its current streak, FSU ran for 206 yards against No. 14 NC State and No. 4 Clemson, who both entered the game in the Top 20 in rushing defense; 246 yards
- against Georgia Tech; and 229 yards against Miami, who allowed just 113.5 rush yards per game. Syracuse was allowing 141.1 rush yards per game before FSU ran for 230.
- Trey Benson is 2nd in the country, averaging 7.37 yards per carry, He has run over 100 yards and set a career high in three consecutive games after rushing for 163 yards on 18 Carries (91 ypc) at Syracuse. It was the most rushing yards for a Seminole in an ACC road game since Dalvin Cook's 225 at Syracuse in 2016 (Cook was also the last player with three consecutive 100-yard rushing games). Benson's 163 yards are the
- most for an ACC player on the road this season.
- nost to an Acc payer of the road this season.

  On November 5, Benson ran for 128 yards and two touchdowns at Miami; against Georgia Tech on October 29, Benson had fil rushing yards and two touchdowns in his first career start. He was named the ACC Running Back of the Week for both games, the first Seminole to win the award in consecutive weeks.
- Benson and Lawrance Toafili are tied for the team lead with five rushing touchdowns. Benson's final run at Syracuse gave him 166 all-purpose yards for the game and 1,000 for his career.





# WR #14 JOHNNY WILSON

- Florida State has had seven different players lead (or co-lead) the team in receiving yards this season after Ja'Khi Douglas caught three passes for 43 yards at Syracuse.
- Johnny Wilson is 2nd in the ACC and 9th nationally with 19.7 yards per reception. Wilson leads FSU with 33 catches, 649 yards and five receiving touchdowns.
- At Louisville, Wilson was named ACC Receiver of the Week after setting career highs with seven catches, 149 yards and two touchdowns,
- both in the fourth quarter of FSU's 35-31 win.
- Wilson caught a 69-yard pass from **Tate**Rodemaker against the Cardinals. On the
  next play, Wilson caught a 10-yard touchdown.
  In the fourth quarter, Wilson caught a twoyard touchdown from Rodemaker on 3rd-andgoal that proved to be the game winner.
- Wilon's 149 receiving yards were the most for any Seminole receiver since 2019 and the 2nd-most in FSU's 23-game series against Louisville (Kermit Whitfield, 172 in 2015).
- Against the Yellow Jackets, Wilson caught a 78-yard touchdown from Jordan Travis, the longest catch in Wilson's career and Travis's longest completion. It was FSU's longest offensive play of the season and the longest pass for the Noles since a 91-yard completion in the 2019 Sun Bowl.
- Wilson led FSU against Georgia Tech with 111 receiving yards, his second career 100-yard

# JARED VERSE

- Defensive end Jared Verse leads FSU with 13.0 tackles for loss and 6.5 sacks, leading the ACC in sacks per game (0.72) and TFL per game (1.44). After missing the previous game-and-a-half due to injury, Verse had 2.5 tackles for loss and 1.0 sack against No. 22 Wake Forest. He played just 23 snaps against the Demon Deacons.
- Verse is 9th nationally in tackles for loss.
   He is the only player from the ACC and one of three from a Power 5 conference with

#### three games of 2.5 tackles for loss this season.

- At Miami, Verse had a 12-yard sack and returned a fumble 10 yards, the first fumble recovery of his career. FSU's four takeaways at Miami were a season high. Verse added a six-yard sack at Syracuse and was one of three Noles to lead the team with four tackles.
- In a breakout game against LSU, all three
- of Verse's tackles were behind the line of scrimmage 2.0 sacks and 2.5 tackles for loss. He also blocked a field goal in the second quarter, FSU's first since the 2020 season opener against Georgia Tech.
- In his FSU debut against Duquesne, Verse had the Seminoles' only sack and 1.5 tackles for loss. The Albany transfer - one of the top newcomers of the 2022 class - has 18 career starts.




