

TIGERS TAKE OPENER

Sewanee stretched its winning streak to six in a row Friday night with a 43-35 victory over the Seminoles in the West Campus gym in a non-conference game that was marred by the slow, defensive play in the second half.

The Purple Tigers, riding a sizeable lead from the opening minutes on, were content to play a holding game most of the second half to protect their margin against an Indian five that was badly off all night.

It was only the second setback of the season on their home floor for the Seminoles, who had won seven out of eight previous starts in the spacious West Campus court.

Paced by forward Bob Logan, who was hitting from all angles in the opening minutes, Sewanee shot out in front 14-4 at the five-minute mark and were never headed.

Logan Hits Regularly

Logan continued to rip the cords regularly as the Tigers pulled away to a 24-9 lead late in the opening half before FSU started to make a contest out of the rout.

Seminole floorman Ronnie Nettles came in at that point and threw the blanket around Logan for the remainder of the tilt, holding the Tiger sharpshooter scoreless from the field for the re-
