

WIN 43-24 IN OPENER

Play Choctaws Again At 8

Florida State University's Seminole cagers will go out after their second successive victory of the new basketball season tonight after having copped their opener with Mississippi College 43-24 in the West Campus gym last night.

Coaches J. K. "Bld" Kennedy of the Indians and Lefty Fulton of the Choctaws indicated that they planned few changes in their lineups tonight as the two teams square off in the second game of the series at 8.

Intra-Mural Awards

Intra-mural director Ed Williamson will present intra-mural athletic awards to Seminole students prior to tonight's game.

Last night's tilt, the opening game of the season for both of the Dixie Conference quintets, was a slow somewhat sluggish game between two deliberate ball clubs who showed that they have not yet acquired the eye or range for the basket.

The Seminoles, off to an early lead, piled up the points late in the first half and early in the second half to draw steadily away from the Mississippi five.

Dick Kendall, husky guard, paced the Indians triumph as he poured six field goals and one foul toss through the nets.

Little Lee Benjamin and Wild Bill Weigel were Kendall's chief supporters on the attack with nine points each.

Captain Howard Sessums led the Choctaws with a pair of field goals and four foul shots for an eight point total.

After a see-saw start which saw the Choctaws hold one very brief 4-3 lead, the Indians hit a hot hand. With Kendall, Benjamin and Weigel carrying the load, FSU dumped in 15 straight points to shoot out in front 21-6.

The Choctaws finally broke back into the scoring column with a double-decker just before the halftime buzzer, and trailed 21-8 at the intermission.

That was the ball game, as the Indians inched slowly away from the visitors during the stepped-up second half play.

Big Tom McLaughlin, acting captain for the Seminoles, paced the defensive and rebound play for the Indians before fouling out midway in the second half.
