

## Drury Defeats Seminole Club In 57-50 Clash

Having enabled the Drury Panthers to win their first basketball game of the season, the Florida State Seminoles of Tallahassee tonight will endeavor to shatter the six-game winning streak of the SMS Bears.

The game is scheduled for 8 o'clock, or thereabouts, at the SMS fieldhouse.

Some consideration was given to the cancellation of the game due to the sudden death of A. W. Briggs, the SMS physical education director. However, Mrs. Briggs expressed the wish that the game be played as scheduled. Coach A. J. McDonald said,

Florida State had a four-game winning streak when it came to Missouri Monday. First Central, then Drury knocked over the Hoosier-dominated Seminoles. The Bears have their turn tonight, with McDonald planning no marked change in the lineup that already has bested such competition as Missouri Valley, Emporia State, Baker University, Tahlequah, Okla., twice, and the Guatemala Olympians.

Drury hung a 57-50 defeat on the Florida club, leading all the way after the first six minutes of scrimmaging. The Panther advantage was 24-15 at halftime, but twice the Seminoles narrowed the gap to 3 points during the forepart of the last half.

With just 10 minutes to play, Drury was only 36-33 ahead but at the 5-minute mark they had a 47-33 pull, and it was 50-40 with 3 left.

Steady Bill Hanks was Drury's top marksman with 19 points while big Tom McLaughlin, who figures to give the Bears' Bill Lea a rough defensive assignment, hooped 18 for the Seminoles—13 in the stretch half.
