FSU RALLY FALLS SHORT

Bow to Mercer 69-61 in Macon

MACON. Ga — Florida State University's Seminoles made a great last half bid for their second successive victory over the Mercer Bears, but fell short and finally bowed 69-51 in a fast Dixle Conference basketball game here last night.

Trailing 37-22 at inditine and apparently outclassed by a fast-breaking Bruin five that was playing at its season's peak, the Indians slowly wrested the play away from the Bears and began backing away at Mercer's markin.

McLaughlin Stars

Led by Big Tom McLaughiln, who staged a tremendous offensive and defensive effort in the losing cause. FBU played the favorites off their feet in the final period, outscoring them 39-32 down the stretch.

McLaughlin, who had racked up eight of the Seminoles 32 points in the first half, hit from all angles after the intermission as he piled up seven more field goals and two foul shots for a 24-point total.

FSU just had too for to come back in the last 70-minutes to make the grade as their ineffective first half took its toll.

Maunia Wilkes

In addition to his scoring show. McLaughlin held Bear ace Olenn Wilkes to 15 points, which were compiled on five field goals and five charity tosses. It was the second time this season that Wilkes had been held under 30 points, and on both occasions it was McLaughlin who threw the blanket around the eagle-eyed forward. Wilkes had gotten 16 points in the opening game between the two teams when FSU scored a 57-45 triumph in Tallahassee.

Guard Glenn Cassell matched, Wilkes' 15 points for Mercer, while Bill Weigel took runnerup honors for the Seminoles with 11 points.

Dick Kendall, Whitey Wyman, Ronnie Nettles and Ted Hewiti at turned in fine floor games.

Ronnie Nettles and Ted Hewlit all turned in fine floor games when PBU began driving. Hewlit and Wyman continually stole the ball from the Bears in that terrifle second half.

The victory gave Mercer a season mark of 8-4 overall and 5-1 inside the Dixle loop. The loss was PSU's ninth against seven wins. They are 5-3 in the conference
