SEWANEE, Tenn., Feb. 18—Florida State took an 80-59 victory over Sewanee Friday night, but apparently lost the services of forward Dick Trobaugh for the season in the process.

Trobaugh, slender speedster and clever ball handler, re-sprained his bad ankle, and early indications were that he would be sidelined for the year.

Playing sharp ball as a unit, the Seminoles rolled up their fifth straight victory and 12th win of the season against nine defeats in the opener of the two-game series.

Big Early Lead

Hitting from all angles in the early minutes of the game, the Indians shot out in front 37-7 before Sewanee could get on the move.

The Purple Tigers pulled up to 41-25 at the halftime with a closing spurt, but they were unable to get within striking distance of the high-flying Seminoles.

Wild Bill Weigel, Tom McLaughlin and Dick Kendall sparked the Indians 80-point barrage.

Weigel bucketed nine field goals and four charity tosses for 22 points and high scoring honors. McLaughlin, the big pivot ace, collected 18 and Kendall had 17. Kendall's 17 points gave him a total of 45 markers in his last two starts. He had thrown in 28 against Troy in the opening game of the current five-day tour.
