

FSU Beats Sewanee 85-65 in Comeback

SEWANEE, Tenn., Feb. 18.—The Florida State University Seminoles completed a clean sweep of their two game take series with Sewanee's Purple Tigers here tonight by rolling to an 85-65 decision.

The victory was FSU's sixth in a row in a late season comeback, and gives them a record of 13 wins and nine losses.

Coach Bud Kennedy's Indians got off to a slow start and trailed 12-2 in the early minutes before they started hitting. Sewanee, giving ground stubbornly, led 20-18 halfway through the first half, and the score was tied at 29-29 with five minutes to go before intermission.

At that point FSU hit a hot hand and racked up 10 straight points while holding Sewanee scoreless to gain a 39-29 edge at the intermission.

In the second half the Indians pulled steadily away as the pace proved too much for the Tigers.

Dick Kendall continued his sensational scoring streak, dropping in 20 points to pace the FSU attack. Kendall has now hit 65 points in the last three games.

Larry Dickson with 17 was runner-up to Kendall. Little Lee Benjamin had 15.

Calhoun paced the Tigers with 22.

Seminole Nine To Play Twenty Game Schedule

The Florida State University baseball team will play a 20-game schedule this spring.

The slate, which was released yesterday by FSU Athletic Director Howard Danford, provides for 14 home games and six road tilts.

The Seminoles will open their schedule against Mississippi College, a Dixie conference foe, here March 27 and 28. The final contests on the slate will be against Stetson University here May 19 and 20.

The schedule includes eight conference tilts and games against such non-league opponents as Rollins College, Bradley University of Peoria, Ill., Stetson and University of Tampa.

The Indians will again be coached by Charlie Armstrong, former Indian star.
