

# Hartman Leads FSU to 74-54 Cage Victory

CHARLESTON, S. C., Dec 9—

With Guard Bob Hartman's accurate shotmaking setting the pace, Florida State University's Seminoles opened their 1950-51 basketball season here tonight with a decisive 74-54 victory over the College of Charleston.

Hartman, former Purdue Boiler-maker cager, hit from inside, outside and every where in-between as he racked up seven field goals and five foul tosses for a 19 point total.

It was Hartman who set the spark each time the Seminole attack began to lag, though it didn't take much to get the Florida five going tonight.

## SUPPORTING ROLES

Bob Whitmer, a former teammate of Hartman's at Purdue, looped in 11 points. Bud Scott tallied 10 and big Tom McLaughlin and Dick Trobaugh had eight apiece to lead the supporting roles for Hartman's stellar performance.

McLaughlin, veteran Seminole pivotman, dominated the play under both backboards.

Scott played a fine floor game outside, and Trobaugh, who was acting captain of the Floridians tonight, guided the attack.

Florida State got off to an early lead and hit the halftime ahead 39-21. They kept moving throughout the second half and pulled steadily away despite the fact that Coach Bud Kennedy swept his bench clean and played every man in uniform.

Eason, Charleston's big center, led his mates with 14 points.

Following tonight's game FSU moves down to Macon, Ga., Monday night where they meet the Mercer Bears in a Dixie Conference game.
