## FSU to Face Stetson; Bow to Tampa, 76-66

Stetson scored a 67-66 victory over the Seminoles in the first game between the two foes in Tallahassee.

The Hatters bowed to Miami University early this week, while FSU fell before the Tampa Spartans 76-66 in Ta.npa last night.

## MULLEN AND MONTZ

Slick Bill Mullen and his running mate at guard, sharpshooting George Montz, sparked the Spartans to a "Revenge" win over Florida State last night.

Mullen spearheaded a closing drive that i oke up a see-saw battle after Montz had kept the Tampans moving by caging 18 of the Spartans first 57 points. Montz fouled out with Tampa leading 57-55.

The Seminoles, who had fashioned an 80-69 victory over Coach Sam Bailey's club in the first meeting, jumped out in front last night as though they were headed for a repeat. The Indians grabbed a quick 7-2 lead in the early minutes, built up a nine-point edge during one phase of the first half and held a 33-27 lead at intermission.

## SPARTANS BOUNCE BACK

The Spartans bounced back with a bang in the second half, however, to overtake the Indians in the first three minutes. They never relinquished the lead from there on; though FSU tied the count and was within a point of the Tampa team seceral times before Mullen got the stretch drive underway.

Mullen slammed in 17 points to take runnerup honors to Montz for Tampa.

Blonde Bob Hartman and slim Bud Marsee were the big guns in Coach Bud Kennedy's attack, clicking for 19 points apiece. Hartman's sharp passing and Marsee's defensive play were also bl. factors in the Seminole performance.
