

# FSU Rallies to Trip Rollins Tars, 60-57

WINTER PARK—Florida State University's Seminoles, a fine second half team all season, won another one the hard way last night when they came from behind to overhaul Rollins College and hand the Tars a 60-57 setback in an intra-state cage tilt.

Behind 32-21 at the intermission and still trailing 43-39 with only 10 minutes remaining, Florida State finally clawed out a 56-55 lead that they managed to hold through the last 3:56 of playing time.

## HECTIC FINISH

Those last 10 minutes were hectic ones for both teams. After big Bob Whitmer's field goal with eight minutes remaining had put FSU out in front for the first time in the second half, the Tars came right back to turn the tilt into a see-saw battle down the stretch. The lead changed hands nine times and was tied twice in the closing minutes before FSU finally went ahead to stay.

Whitmer, having one of his best nights, and Bob Hartman paced the Seminole rally.

Whitmer, who was deadly with his set shots from the deep corners, rolled up 17 points and did some terrific rebound work along with Tom McLaughlin.

Hartman boosted his season scoring total to 248 points by bagging eight field goals and four free throws for 20 points.

# NUMBER 10

The win was the 10th of the year for Coach Bud Kennedy's Seminoles against only five defeats.

The Tars, who were playing without the services of high-scoring Frank Barker, were paced by Bones Williams and Pete Fay who collected 39 points between them and did some fine rebound work for Rollins.

The Seminoles spurted out in front in the early minutes and opened up a 14-7 lead before the Tars could get moving. With Fay beginning to hit, Rollins got underway and went out in front 18-17 on Williams' layup. Rollins went out front there to pile up its 32-21 halftime edge.
