Handed Fourth Loss By Southerners

Big Tom McLaughlin, who had hit for 20 points in FSU's loss to Mississippl State Monday night, again led the Seminoles, connecting for 15 points on six field goals and three charity tosses before fouling out.

Westhafer, with 10 points, was the only other Seminole able to reach double ligures.
