

FSU CAGERS BOW 84-43

Handed Fourth Loss By Southerners

HATTIESBURG, Miss.—Florida State University's Seminoles soaked up their fourth straight setback of the season here last night, falling before Mississippi Southern's cage powerhouse, 84-43.

The Southerners, bounding back from a 59-57 defeat at the hands of Dayton's great quintet, rolled relentlessly over the Floridians despite the fact that Southern employed reserves throughout most of the game.

The Southerners used only one regular during the entire first half in piling up a 39-19 lead at intermission.

It was a reserve freshman, Mike Herrington, who paced the attack with eight field goals and five free throws for 21 points.

Tom Bishop, a regular who played a little more than 10 minutes, and Jeep Clark supported Herrington with 14 points apiece.

Big Tom McLaughlin, who had hit for 20 points in FSU's loss to Mississippi State Monday night, again led the Seminoles, connecting for 15 points on six field goals and three charity tosses before fouling out.

Westhafer, with 10 points, was the only other Seminole able to reach double figures.

Florida State and Mississippi Southern will continue their cage series in Tallahassee Friday night with the second of the home-and-home series.
