## **FSU Drops Number 14**

## BOW 93-75 TO TEACHERS

## Six-Nine Center Scores 28 Points

Florida State's Seminoles dropped their fourteenth decision of the season in the West Campus gym last night when a last-quarter romp by Georgia Teacher's College turned a fairly-close ball-game into a 93-75 rout.

The Indians had trailed 41-32 at half-time and 66-58 after the third quarter, after leading only once, in the second stanza.

Georgia's heighth inside and deft passing outside turned the trick, or to be more specific, the southpaw hooks of 6'9" center Randy Whaley, and the slick ball-handling of senior guard Ralph Parsons.

Midway through the second frame when FSU was contesting the issue, the Parson-Whaley tandem figured in 13 of 15 Professor points. That salvaged their half-time lead.

And in the last stanza after the Seminoles' Rick Benson and Bob Whitmer had fouled out, Parsons' passing engineered the fast-break that netted Georgia 18 points in the last eight minutes. Whaley got eight of those.

The amblin' giant racked up 28 markers and FSU's 6'6" Benson found his three-inch deficit a tough one underneath the boards. But he turned in some sharp ball to back up Tom McLaughlin who paced the Seminoles with 27. Tom was hitting with one-handers from outside where his position could help much on rebounding. Lou Fischer, shortest man on the court at 5'10", drove hard and flashed a nice hook.

Some good teamwork on the Seminoles' only real spurt brought them up to 49-43 in the third quarter but Parsons promptly fed Whaley twice underneath to counteract that threat. FSU never made another serious one.

FSU was handicapped by the loss of Duane Gordon who had paved the Seminoles to their lone victory, the upset win over Tampa. Gordon is hospitalized and unable to play.
