

Using a fast break for the first time this season, FSU built up a 14-1 lead in the first seven minutes. That's when J. B. Searce Jr. jerked his starters and ran in five freshmen. One of them, Bo Warren, hit a 6-footer from the side for the Profs' first field goal with 2:15 left in the first quarter. It was 18-6, FSU, at the first stop.

Wernke hit three consecutive long push shots early in the second period to send the Seminoles on a 14-point spree during which the Profs didn't scratch. At one point, two minutes before the half, FSU had a 25-point bulge at 37-12. It was 37-16 at intermission.

The Teachers warmed up, and how, in the third quarter, scoring 25 points to FSU's 14, while the Seminole lead down to 10 points at 51-41. Jerry Westhafer came in a minute before the third quarter ended. His three buckets early in the fourth quarter helped the Tribe keep pace with the Profs. FSU went into a solid freeze with 1:10 left.

Wernke led the PSU scoring with 17 points, 12 of them coming in the first half. Benson and Oler dropped 13 apiece. Chester Webb, the Profs' agile sophomore center, was the game's outstanding player, however. He got 18 points, 15 in the last half, to spark the late Georgia Teachers drive.
