A classy Loyola of New Orleans basketball team manipulated a deft floor game with driving scoring shots for an 80-76 decision over Florida State University here last night. It was the sixth victory for Loyola in six starts in three years against FSU.

Though the Seminoles stayed in striking range, Loyola was in clear command most of the way. FSU had a brief early lead and moved in front again when Ham Wernke stole the ball and fired a crip for a 56-55 Seminole lead just before the buzzer ending the third quarter sounded.

Wernke had his best all-round night. He clicked for 30 points. Though he had 31 in the season opener against Mississippi State, his work last night was better.

Loyola led 18-14 after onequarter of play and 38-35 at the half.

With two minutes left, FSU

pulled within 74-72 range on two free throws by Wernke. But Ronnie Reynoir, brother Gus Reynoir and Eddie Galvin racked crips to give Loyola a decisive eight-point lead at 80-72. Duane Gordon and Wernke got additional FSU field goals to narrow the final count to 80-76.
