NEW ORLEANS, Feb. 19—Four Florida State University players peppered the baskets for 20 or more points, but a record outburst by strong Loyola University shattered the Seminoles' 10-game winning streak, 101-95, here to night.

Thus the New Orleans Jesuits maintained their four-year cage mastery over FSU, winning their seventh straight game in the series, and handed Bud Kennedy's group only their third loss in 19 starts.

Both teams set a blistering pace, but Loyola's lightning-fast center, All-America candidate Eddie Galvin, proved the difference. Galvin meshed 24 points and added valuable rebounding strength in a tense second-half stretch run.

SHARP HITTING

State, connecting on 52 per cent of its field-goal attempts in the first half, took an intermission lead of 52-51. Loyola made good on 43 per cent of its shots.

The rangy Wolfpack started running in the second half and kept the visiting Seminoles off balance with the result that both teams missed more often. The shooting percentages at the end were 43 for Florida State and 39 for Loyola.

Loyola's terrific fast break started clicking in the second half and the 'Pack steadily built up a margin that once reached 15 points. A last-ditch flurry by FSU fell six points short.

OLER BAGS 24

Jimmy Oler bucketed 24 points to boost his team-leading total to 417 points for FSU. Ham Wernke had 21 to hike his 19-game aggregate to 373 points. Forwards Rick Benson and Dick Artmeier pumped in 20 points each to give State four players in the 20-point column.

Loyola's old scoring record was 100 points made against Algiers Navy by the 1951-52 Wolfpack team.

FSU, with a 16-3 record, returns home tomorrow to open a two-game stand against Mississippi State Monday and Loyola in a return game Tuesday.
