Each team lost two players on personal fouls in the fleroely-contested game, which gave FSU a 3-2 lead in their intrastate cage rivalry with Miami.

The Seminoles have won 18 of their past 20 games against Florida intercollegiate teams.

FSU hopes to notch its 20th victory against Stetson in a first-round District 25 NAIA tournament clash at Taliahassee Monday night. Georgia Teachers and Mercer vie in the other first-round scrap at Florida High gym.
