RALEIGH, N. C.—North Carolina State's Wolfpack spoiled Florida State University's basketball debut here Thursday night, scoring 88-63 victory. It was the Wolfpack's 13th consecutive triumph.

FSU jumped to a quick 3-0 lead in the early seconds of play against the Wolfpack, last year's Atlantic Coast Conference champions, but the winners stormed back to a 49-21 halftime advantage and coasted in from there. CHECK SHAVLIK

Ron Shavlik, N.C. State's All-American center of last season, was held to 10 points Thursday right.

Bob Seitz and Nick Pond shared scoring honors for the Woifpack with 16 points each but game high went to Tribe guard Jim Oler, who hit with 16 points from the floor and 10 from the free throw line for a total of 26.

N. C. State hit on 41 per cent of its attempts from the floor while FSU bagged only 21 per cent. After trailing at halftime 49-21, the Seminoles outscored the Wolfpack in the final two quarters, 42 to 39.

Nine thousand fans saw the game in Reynolds Coliseum, by far the largest crowd ever to see FSU play.

FSU advanced to the second round of the NAIA in Kansas City, Mo., last season before falling to Beloit, Wis.

FSU faces East Tennessee State in its second out-of-town game Saturday night before returning to Tallahassee Monday night to open its home schedule against the Rollins Tars.
