TAMPA—Florida State took an undisputed lead in the Florida Intercollegiate Basketball Conference by racking Tampa, 89-67, here last night, as guard Jimmy Oler riddled the Spartans with 34 points.

For the Seminoles, it was their 13th straight FIBC triumph over a two-season span. Last year they wrapped up the first champlonship of the young conference by sweeping all 10 of their FIBC starts. Last night's victory moved their FIBC record this year to 2-0, versus 2-0 for Miami.

The triumph was the third straight for the Tribe after two opening losses.

Oler ran his point total for five games to 124, an average just under 25 per. Tampa contained the driving guard fairly well during the first half but he erupted in the final portion for 22 points. Oler hit 12 field goals and 10 of 11 free throws in getting his 34. Dick Artmeier, hitting seven of eight charity shots, had 23. Gary Wold, again playing center as sophomore Bob Williams satiout his second straight game with an injury, dropped in 14. Bob Ward hit seven in the final five minutes.

Both teams were exceptionally proficient from the foul line, FSU parking 21 of 23 and Tampa 23 of 27.

The Seminoles led at halftime, 40-33. They were never behind.
