MIAMI—All-America candidate Jim (Hot Rod) Hundley scored only seven points but a balanced West Virginia quintet rolled to an easy 78-69 victory over Florida State University in the Orange Bowl basketball tournament here yesterday afternoon.

Jimmy Oler, FSU's high-scoring pint-sized guard, continued the terrific pace he started in the Carrousel Tournament at Charlotte, N. C., last week and led both teams with 24 points.

Four Mountaineers hit double figures. They were able to get easy shots at crucial moments and never trailed the Seminoles. Stu Gregory backed up Oler with 12 points and Bob Ward hit 11 for FSU.

Coach Bud Kennedy's Seminoles take on Santa Clara tonight at 7:30 in a consolation game. Santa Clara bowed to Columbia, 76-73, in overtime yesterday.

who lost to Tulane and Miami in first round games, will open today's play at 2:30. Tulane and Miami clash at 4. Columbia and West Virginia battle after the FSU-Santa Clara game tonight. Finals are set for Friday night.
