wilhoit, a 5-11 scrapper who e appeared awkward at times, be- o fuddled the taller Florida State defenders for nine field goals. He got them all virtually right under the Seminoles' noses, driving in 1 for layups from all kinds of angles. He added three foul shots for a total of 21.

The 6-4 Weaver tossed the ball for 13 points from the free throw line, missing only four times. He scored 15 in all.

Free shots did it...

The Buccaneers connected on 31 of 45 to overshadow a Florida State advantage in field goals, 21-17. But the Tennessecans had better luck there, too, hitting 30 per cent while FSU made good on just 25 per cent.

The Seminoles' Bob Waits, 6-0 guard, scored 16 points to spark c the losers. Forward Stu Gregory fallied 11 and center Bob Williams chipped in 10. Williams also led FSU's rebounding game with 14. GOT REBOUNDS

with center Herb Edmonds 1 pulling down 21 rebounds, East 7 Tennessee dominated here, too. They got 73 rebounds to FSU's 49. Florida—State; pressing—determinedly for victory No. 1, led at halftime, 34-33, and at one time held a 43-36 advantage in the escond half.

But after a 54-54 deadlock the Seminoles couldn't keep pace with the Buccaneers free throw accuracy.

n Five foul shots made it 61-54 and from there the visitors coast-

ed in for their fourth victory without a loss.

Things were pretty even during most of the first half. FSU managed to take the lead six times. East Tennessee held the advant. tage six times and the score was: tied on half a dozen occasions. QUICK GETAWAY

East Tennessee opened it with five quick ones before FSU could get organized. But then Walts, Tom Garcia and Hugh Durham put FSU ahead temporarily, 6-5.

Some bad ball handling cost them a chance to close the gap. East Tennessee got eight quick points, half of them from Weaver's accuracy at the foul line, and took a 16-12 margin which they kept until Florida State's Waits began hitting from far out.
