TAMPA, Feb. 2 (AP) Hugh Durham found the George B. Howell field house court to his liking last night as he dropped in 13 field goals and added seven of 10 free throws for 33 points to pace the FSU Seminoles to an 84-66 win over the University of Tampa Spartans. Durham, a sophomore from Louisville, Ky., ran his point total to 169 for the past three games and his season's total to 304 points. While Durham was the whole show for the Tallahassee school, Tampa had a "hot-shooter" in Howle Bernstein, who hit the hoops for 27 points-11 of them field goals-and dropped in five ofesix free tosses. Bernstein was hitting from all over the court and made 20 of his points in the final half. The Sparians, who have now lost to every inter-state foe this year, looked like they were going to break their losing streak as they rolled up a 7-0 lead. They held the front margin until six minutes and 31 seconds were left in the first half when forward Joe Westhafer dropped in a bucket to

give FSU a 19-18 lead.

Once in front, the Seminoles found the pace to their liking and never relinquished again, although the Spartans stayed close with them until the start of the second half 1. 1 A. . . FIT.
