KNOXVILLE, Tenn. — Two sharp-shooting reserves aided the Tennessee Volunteers to a 74-57 victory over Florida State here last night, snapping FSU's two-game win streak.

Butch Lowery, 5-10 sophomore guard who is the son of Volunteer Coach Emmett Lowery, and Don Reeverts, junior forward, came off the bench to help the Vols rack up their third straight victory against no defense. Reeverts had 15 points and Lowery 12.

Junior guard Hugh Durham salvaged one honor for the Seminoles in their debut, on the road, however, capturing individual scoring honors with 25 counters.

The loss of their two biggest men early in the second half definitely hurt the Seminoles. Center Dan Boltz went out on fouls three minutes after the half. He was followed two minutes later by forward Larry Strom.

The Vols led, 40-31, when

Strom left the game.

Both clubs found difficulty hitting from the floor in the first half. The Vols led, 25-19, after the first 20 minutes.

FSU still had trouble hitting the bucket in the second half and ended the evening with only 17 field goals out of 68 attempts, 25 percent. The hosts connected on 25 of 73 for 34.2 percent from the floor. The Vols also out rebounded the Seminoles, 55-41.

It was Tennessee's 11th straight success against non-Southeastern Conference teams, dating back to 1955.

Bud Kennedy's Seminoles carry their 2-1 record to Gainesville Wednesday night, meeting Florida's Gators in the fourth game of their series.
