BATON ROUGE, La.—Florida State seeks to break a four-game road losing streak here tonight when they meet the Louisiana State Tigers, at 8:15.

Last night, the Seminoles fell to a powerful Loyola of New Orleans quintet, 82-56, their fourth loss of the season against two victories.

A general inability to hit from the field and the absence for the most part of star guard Hugh Durham hurt the Seminoles against Loyola. Durham, hobbled with an ankle injury, scored just four points.

The Seminoles made good on only 21 of 80 tries afield for a 26.3 showing, while the Wolfpack hit 29.

62 attempts for 460, and out rebounded the tribe, 48-32.

GAUDIN SPARKS

Forward Pete Gaudin and Jim Hall sparked a first half drive which brought Loyola from behind in the early moments and carried them to a 40-25 halftime margin.

However, guard Bob McLaughlin wound up the night's high scorer for Loyola, scoring 14 of his 21 points in the second half. Gaudin had 18 and Hall 16 behind McLaughlin in Loyola scoring.

Forward Burt Deckel took over the scoring lead for the Seminoles with a 14-point performance. Deckel now has 103 points for the season, and Jim Liteky, who tallied just six points, has 96. Durham is third with 85.
