

Clicking like a precision drill team in "doubletime," a hustling Army team sped away from Florida State in the second half last night and handed the Seminoles their fifth straight loss, 71-62.

Behind at halftime, 32-31, the Cadets caught fire in the first 10 minutes of the second half.

After the score had been tied four times in the first five minutes of the final half, Army pulled in front to stay with 14:06 left, on a criving layup by forward Chuck Darby, 45-44.

LEAD BOOSTED

Buckets by Don DeJardin, Darby, Kouns and Fred Kaiser upped the Army lead to 51-44, and they were never again threatened.

The loss left the Seminoles with a 6-13 mark for the season. Army takes a 10-8 record into their match with Miami tonight in Miami.

Sophomore guard Kouns was the night's high scorer with 20 points, while Darby added 19, 13 in the second half. Senior captain Larry Strom led the Seminoles with 15, while guard Hugh Durham had 14.

The Seminoles gained an early lead and held sizable margins much of the first half. They led

18-5 after 10 minutes, 32-25 shortly before the end of the half when Army closed the gap on baskets by Kouns and Darby and two free throws by center Jim Klosek.

THE DIFFERENCE

Army outgunned the Seminoles both from the field and the foul line.

The Cadets dropped 27 of 68 afield for a .397 showing, while the Tribe hit 27 of 82 for .329. At the foul line, Army got 17 of 21 for .810, the Seminoles eight of 13 for .615.

FSU outrebounded its opponent, 59-57, though leading rebounder Danny Boltz sat out the second half with four fouls. Strom led the Tribe with 16. Klosek of Army was the game's individual leader in this department with 18. Darby had 15 for the victors.

The Seminoles continue their home stand next Wednesday night, when they tackle Oklahoma City, paced by high-scoring center Hubert Reed. Thursday night they meet Rollins here.

FROSH ROMP

The Florida State freshmen broke their season record to 3-2 in the opening contest, downing St. Petersburg Junior College, 81-52.

Bill Archer had 20 and leading scorer Charley Tinsley 17 to lead the Baby Seminoles, while Marcum and Phillips had 10 each for the losers.
