

An overflow crowd in Tully Gym last night saw Florida State whip the University of Florida cagers 80-62, in what was the first win over the Gators in Seminole basketball history.

The win also marked the first time that the Florida hoopsters had been beaten by a state team since 1953 when Miami turned the trick. Previous to last night's loss, the Florida basketball team has beaten 24 straight state foes.

#### GATOR STREAK

Florida had bested the Seminoles in the four games they had played up till last night.

The last two times the Gators won was in 1956 and 57 when they won by two and one points respectively.

The win gives Florida State a 3-2 mark for the season with other triumphs being over Spring Hill and Furman. The losses came at the hands of Kentucky and Wake Forest.

For the Gators, it was the second defeat of the season, the other one coming by way of a 66-63 loss to Georgia. They hold victories over Erskine College, Stetson and Rollins.

The Gators, guided by Coach John Mauer, utilized the fast break most of the evening, but the taller Seminoles were able to stay with Florida and control the backboards besides.

#### TINSLEY HIGH

FSU Sophomore Charley Tinsley was high scorer for the night as he dunked in 19 points. FSU Coach Bud Kennedy said, "Tinsley played a real good game for a sophomore."

Most of Tinsley's points came on tap-ins as he was on the boards most of the night. He nabbed 11 rebounds.

Hugh Durham, senior guard for the Tribe, hit for 18 points as his 24 point average took a little dip. He hit on 6 of 7 foul shots for an .857 average.

Jim Savage who was a surprise starter for the Seminoles, got 17 points. Center Bob Sherwood also got 17 points as he led the Gators in scoring. He was also the game's top rebounder with 16.

The Gators stayed with the Seminoles for the first 10 minutes as they used a tight man-to-man defense. With five minutes gone in the game the Gators were leading 24-20. The game was relatively even until the end of the third quarter when the Seminoles scored 10 points in the final 10 minutes to win the game.

Florida came back fast in the second half, but could not match the Tribe point for point. The closest the Gators ever got in the second half was 10 points and they did that with ten minutes left in the game.

Savage hit on three in a row following a set by Durham and then forward Jim Liteky contributed five points and the Seminoles were never stopped.

Coach Mauer had to abandon his two platoon system in favor to spot substitution as he had to leave his top men in the game to keep up with the Seminoles.

#### DEFENSE TOUGH

The fast break used by Florida was spoiled by the ballhawking of Durham and Don Bates who stole the ball consistently all during the game.

Mauer said, "FSU played a very fine game, they have improved a lot from last year. It was a good team, to good for us."

Florida State's Kennedy remarked, "That ball club that took the court against Florida was one that wanted to win, and they did. It was an extremely fine team effort. We are playing better as a team every game we play."

"The difference tonight was that our inside men were hitting, and if you want to beat a team like Florida, your inside has to be tough."

The Seminoles inside men, Dan Bolts at center, and Tinsley and Savage at forwards, accounted for 41 points. Bolts pulled down 13 rebounds before fouling out in the second half.

#### TRIBE DOMINATES

The Tribe outshot the Gators from the floor and from the free throw line. FSU hit on 30 of 37 field goals for a .811 average. Florida dunked 23 out of 30 for a .767 mark.

From the charity line the Seminoles made 22 of 25 which averaged .880. On the other hand Florida made 10 out of 20 attempts for a .500 average.

Florida also led in total rebounds 72-65. The Gators had weak rebounding as Mauer was closest to the boards with 14.

In the first half, FSU took a 10-0 lead. FSU's 10-0 lead was broken by Florida from 17-3, but FSU took a 21-19 lead at the half.

The Gator 21-19 lead was considered the turning point in the game, but the Tribe was able to come back.

undefeated in four games. It was the first regular season game for the junior Tribe.

FSU's Rufus Ashworth was the game's top scorer as he dumped in 24 points. He was followed by forward Ray Swan and center Dave Fedor who both got 13.

Gil Farley, 6-5 forward, was the high man for Florida as he threw in 16 points. Guard Neal Cody got 12 for the Baby Gators.

The pattern of the game was the same from the start. The hustling FSU frosh, coached by Tom Garcia, former FSU basketball and baseball stars took advantage of every miscue by the Florida frosh.

The Junior Tribe grabbed a quick 6-0 lead and never fell behind. The FSU team led 45-25 at the half.
