

For Coach Red Lawson's Georgians, the game was a measure of revenge. Prior to last night's game, the Seminoles had copped three straight from the Bulldogs — including a 92-80 triumph in the Senior Bowlegage tourney at Mobile a year ago — and had won eight of 10 clashes with Georgia.

State has a chance to square things later this season when the teams meet in Athens in a regular-season game Jan. 19.

The Seminoles had the misfortune of running into a rag-to-riches shooting story last night. Georgia had hit only 15 per cent of its fieldgoal attempts against The Citadel Friday. Against FSU, the 'Dogs couldn't miss, winding up with a 48.5 shooting percentage.

The Seminoles had one of their better nights from the field, converting 32 of 67 shots for a fine 48.4 reading. But free throws, for the second straight night, were the big difference. FSU hit only eight of 16 charity throws, Georgia 17 of 22.

Seminole chances took a severe turn for the worse when center Dan Boltz took a hard fall just the end of the first half. He suffered a hip injury, rendering him only a brief action after intermission. Boltz had bucketed 12 points in a fine first-half shooting show.

For the second straight night, FSU team captain Hugh Durham — the nation's sixth leading free-throw shooter — failed to bag a single one-pointer. He connected on six of 13 field goal attempts to finish with a dozen points. Forwards Jim Savage and Charles Tinsley collected 13 and 10 points respectively.

State's 11-man traveling squad left soon after the game for the return trip to Tallahassee. They are scheduled to arrive in Tallahassee this afternoon.

Kennedy figured to give the Tribe a couple of days rest before returning to action against the eastern Conference foe LSU at Auburn in home games Dec. 27 and Dec. 29.

The Citadel defeated Miami 98-77, in the final game of the tournament.
