ATHENS, Ga.—The largest two-man scoring spree in Florida State history went for naught here last night as Georgia's Bulldogs successfully nursed a slim lead for a 94-91 verdict over the Seminoles.

Guard Hugh Durham and

Don Bates popped in 38 and 34 points, totaling 70 of the Seminoles' 81 points. But their torrid showing couldn't offset Georgia's well-balanced offense. **2ND TRIUMPH**

It was Georgia's second triumph this season over State and leveled the Bulldogs' record at 7-7. The Seminoles, who haven't won on the road, are 8-8.

A smooth-working shuffle of-

defense and the help of two "walking wounded" proved State's downfall. Sonny Poes, who had been feared lost for the game because of a wrenched hip, picked off 10 vital rebounds and fired in 12 points. And Gordon Darrah, testing an aching ankle, led the Georgia attack with 20 points.

All five Georgia starters scored in double figures.

The Bulldogs grabbed a 48-43 halftime lead. State whittled it to one point with five minutes left but Poes sank two field goals from the corner to send the Bulldogs five points ahead of the stubborn Seminoles.

11 FROM FIELD

Durham, the Louisville, Ky., senior who ranks among the nation's top scorers with a 24.2 average, hit a season high against the Bulldogs. The 5-11 team captain meshed 12 of 20 field goal attempts and cashed in 12 of 13 free throws.

Durham held the previous one-game high when he scored 31 points against top-ranked Kentucky in December.

Bates was just as effective. Clicking on his unusual fade-away one-hander, Bates had 20 points at halftime, finished with 34. He and Durham combined for all but five of the Tribe's 43-point first-half effort.

FSU hit 44 per cent of its shots. Georgia made 40 per cent, but got off 23 more cracks at the basket.

REBOUNDED

The Bulldogs outrebounded the Seminoles, 62-53, despite center Dan Boltz' second outstanding rebounding game in a row. Boltz snared 20 rebounds and contributed 12 points.

The Tribe will rest for final exams before meeting powerful Oklahoma City at Oklahoma City Jan. 31.
