



The Seminoles fell, 30-73, a 43-point margin to FSU in the season's opener. It was the second victory by Auburn over FSU this season. The Tigers whipped the Tallahassee club, 82-38, two weeks ago in Auburn. Four Auburn players hit in the double figures to carry the load for the winners. Forward David Vaughn, 6-2, was high with 20 points. Captain Henry Hart, 6-1 guard, scored 18, tossing in six of eight attempts from the floor and hitting on six of nine charity tosses.

Hart missed the previous game with FSU with a twisted knee. He was shaken up in the second half last night when charged by FSU's Jim Savage but remained in the game.

Jim Fibbe netted 13 for the winners, and Porter Gilbert had 11.

High for Coach Bud Kennedy's Seminoles was David Fedor with 14 points—all on field goals. The 6-6 forward averaged 17 points in FSU's first six ball games.

But the big man on the court for Florida State was 6-0 guard Jack Davis. He was second in scoring with 13 and played a tremendous floor game with sharp passing and ball-handling plus numerous steals.

Center John Richter, 6-5, was the only other Seminole to tally in the double figures. He had 11.

Forward Ray Swain, 6-4, was the Seminoles' leading rebounder with ten. Fedor grabbed nine.

Gilbert was the leading boardman for the winners snatching nine.

The two teams matched baskets for the first few minutes before Auburn began to pull away behind goals by Hart and Ray Groover and accuracy from the foul line.

It was the sixth victory in seven starts for the Southeastern Conference Club. The Alabamians have beaten FSU in all four of their meetings.

For the fifth time this season, the Seminoles refused to be out-shot from the floor, also netting 28 field goals, but falling behind in free throw totals.

Florida State could sink only seven of 13 free throws, although their accuracy from the floor was a respectable .406 per cent.

FSU meets Jacksonville University in a first round game of the Gator Bowl tournament in Jacksonville. The clash will follow the Georgia-LSU fray, the other initial-round contest.
