

**TAMPA**—University of Tampa parlayed its hottest shooting of the season with Florida State's coolest to stun the Seminoles, 83-68, before a lively basketball crowd here last night.

The 15-point licking was as bad as FSU has taken in 18 games this season. Highly-regarded Memphis State previously had turned back the Seminoles by 15 in Memphis.

#### **HOT FIRING**

Coach Bob Lavoy's Tampans crammed in 27 of 58 shots from the field for a 45.8 per cent effort. The Spartans hit 54 per cent in the last half.

Seven minutes and 14 seconds elapsed before guard Fred Woodward got FSU its first field goal and the Seminoles finished with but 21 two-pointers in 85 attempts. The Seminoles' 24.7 percent reading was by far their worst of the season and 15 percent below their season average.

FSU, which had trimmed Tampa by five points at Tallahassee Jan. 14, missed twice as many shots from the field—64—as Tampa. Free throws were about even, with Tampa making 29 of 45 and FSU completing 25 of 42.

Dave Fedor, Seminole sophomore, standout, was checked with his lowest point total in 11 games. Fedor finished with 12 points, six in each half, before fouling out.

Soph guard Jack Davis led the Tribe with 15 points, nine of them on free throws. Forward Roger Freudenstein, transfer student who became eligible last Saturday, made a fine debut with 14 points. Ray Swain added 12 for FSU.

All five of Tampa's starters

scored in double figures, with center Don Boyt taking honors with 19. Boyt hit 11 free throws.

#### **ZONE DEFENSE**

FSU trailed, 11-2, when Woodward bagged the first field goal with 12:46 left in the first half. Employing a zone defense, the Spartans raced to a 31-14 lead before FSU trimmed it to 34-24 at intermission.

Fedor fouled out with 8:39 to go and Tampa increased its lead to a bulging 27 points with 3:07 left. Last-minute free throws by Davis shaved the final margin to 15 points.

It was Tampa's most superior showing in 16 games. The Spartans have won four games.

FSU, now 6-12 with seven games to play, will be idle the rest of the week before facing Memphis State (12-2) in a return match in Tallahassee next Tuesday night.
