

GREENVILLE, S. C.—Florida State's revived Seminoles topped the century mark for the second straight game and smashed a Memorial Auditorium record here last night in a 105-98 victory over Furman's Paladins.

Coach Bud Kennedy's sophomore - loaded Seminoles spilled Rollins, 101-58, last Thursday. Last night's barrage produced the eighth 100-point-plus game in FSU history, but never had the Tribe scored that many in successive games.

BETTERED RECORD

The 105 points bettered the previous one-team local record of 96 points set by Furman in a triumph over South Carolina only last week. It was the 26th game in Greenville's two-year-old Memorial Auditorium.

The seven-point FSU decision hiked the Seminole record to 8-13 with four games to play. Last year's Seminoles won eight games in 23 starts.

Sophomore whiz Dave Fedor put in his second straight iron-man role for FSU. Fedor scored 29 points and pulled in 19 rebounds. His totals for the last two games reads 56 points and 47 rebounds.

FEDOR STARS

In 21 games this season, Fedor has poured in 413 points and grabbed 328 rebounds for averages of 19.7 and 15.7 respectively.

The 6-6 Zephyrhills product had good support from four other Seminoles. Starters John Richter and Jack Davis and front-line reserves Roger Freudenstein and Jim Savage all finished in double figures. Savage bagged 19 points.

The game was tied several times before Richter hit a three-point play to give the Seminoles a 72-69 edge with 12:17 left. After that, FSU pulled ahead by 11 points with Furman trimming it to seven in the last minute.

Furman, which enjoyed a 50-49 halftime lead, got two-figure scoring from all five starters. Center Dag Wilson, a 6-5 stand-out, tossed in 33 points and speared 22 rebounds.

A crowd of 1,100 braved snow and ice to see the game.

FG MARK

The Seminoles meshed a record 44 field goals in hitting 44 of 98 shots from the floor (43 per cent). The 1955 Seminoles held the single-game field goal record with 39 against Florida Southern.

With 29 field goals in the last two games, Fedor has pulled within reach of a new all-time single-season record. Fedor has 172 field goals, 21 less than the 193 collected by Bob Hartman in 1951.

Playing .500 basketball in their last 14 games (7-7), the Seminoles move to Charleston today for a Monday night clash with The Citadel.
