

With sophomore sharpshooter Dave Fedor wrapping up a brilliant sophomore season, Florida State's Seminoles closed their best basketball campaign in four years with a 65-39 victory over surprised Georgia here last night.

Trailing 2-0, the Seminoles took the lead on five straight baskets by center John Richter and were never headed.

Finishing with four triumphs in their last six starts, the Seminoles put a 16-13 record in the book, best since the 1956 Tribe compiled a 16-9 mark.

#### REAL SPOILER

The outcome spoiled Georgia's bid for its first winning season in nine years. The Bulldogs finished with a 12-13 record.

Scoreless for the first eight minutes, Fedor warmed up for 16 points before intermission and added 18 in the second half for a game-high total of 34. The prize forward from Zephyrhills led all rebounders with 17.

The Seminoles gave Dave plenty of support. Senior Richter turned in a sparkling performance in his last FSU appearance, getting 19 points, 15 in the first half. Sophomores Ray

Swain and Jack contributed 19 and 17 points, respectively.

Forward Don Keiser led the cold-shooting Bulldogs with 27 points. Keiser's 16-point effort in the last half kept the Seminoles from making it a rout. FSU led, 65-39, at the half and increased the spread to 25 points before Georgia trimmed it to 13 at the final buzzer.

Playing a fine part in a win that avenged FSU's 69-66 loss to Georgia in the December Gator Bowl finale were center Bob Casteel and forward Jim Savage, other seniors playing their last game for FSU.

#### FROM ALL OVER

For the second straight game, Fedor displayed terrific shooting. He sprayed in 11 field goals from all over and hit 12 free throws, running his final two-game total to 77 points. He had tied Hugh Durham's single-game school record with 43 points against eighth-ranked Miami last Saturday.

FSU Coach Bud Kennedy had reason to smile following last night's victory. Scheduled for two more seasons, Fedor finished his first varsity campaign with 527 points (21.1 average) and an even 400 rebounds (16.0 average).

In the process, Fedor established six new school records:

Most field goals, game (16 vs. Miami); most rebounds, game (28 vs. both Jacksonville University and Rollins); most rebounds season (400), most points for a sophomore (527); best percentage on field goal attempts,

season (214 of 453 for 47.2 percent), and consecutive free throws (25).

Hitting 10 straight charity shots last night, Fedor ran a three-game string to 25 straight before missing on his 11th attempt against Georgia.

#### FOUR NULLIFIED

His 11 field goals pushed his season total to 214, only two less than the school record set by Jimmy Oler in 1956. Ironically, Fedor swished in four field goals against the Bulldogs that were nullified by fouls on other parts of the court. The four baskets would have given him the record.

Returning with Fedor next year are Swain, Davis, Roger Freudenstein, Bill Cotton, Bud Whitehead, Tim Edney, and Jerry Smith.
