

Little Jack Davis came off the bench to ignite the spark and Bill Cotton and Ray Swain supplied vital long-distance baskets as Florida State's basketball team rallied for a 74-57 triumph over Clemson's Tigers here last night.

FSU's freshman team remained unbeaten in the preliminary game, claiming its third straight victory, 47-42, over Chipola JC of Marianna.

Trailing Clemson by 30-27 at intermission, the Seminoles caught fire at the outset of the second half and pulled away in their hottest 20-minute showing of the season. FSU outscored the Atlantic Coast Conference visitors, 47-27, in the final half.

It was the third triumph for the Seminoles, who have been whipped only by unbeaten teams Vanderbilt and Auburn on the road. FSU will try to keep its home record spotless against state-rival Florida in Tully Gym tomorrow night, 7:45.

The Seminoles had trouble with Clemson's zone-press defense in

The lead changed hands five times early in the second half before Cotton's 18-foot jump shot put FSU ahead to stay, 35-34, with 16:50 left. A crowd of 3,200 warmed up as FSU bolted into a 18-point lead with 1:50 left.

Swain was the game's high scorer with 20 points, getting 11 of them after intermission. The Jacksonville junior hit eight of 11 field - goal attempts to give him an amazing season percentage of 70.7 on 29 field goals out of 41 attempts.

Fedor, hitting double figures for the 30th straight game over two seasons, had 17 points and led FSU under the boards with 12 rebounds. Cotton hit 12 points, 10 in the final half, and Long and Davis finished with nine apiece. The Tribe got 32 points from non-starters.

Patterson led Clemson with 19 points, mostly on outside jump shots.

FSU finished with 48.2 per cent from the field and enjoyed its best night in several seasons from the free-throw line. The Seminoles hit 20 of 23 charity shots, including a perfect 13-for-13 in that red-hot second half.

Clemson, suffering its fourth loss against one victory, hit 45.5 per cent from the floor but managed only 44 shots against a multiple defense FSU used for the first time. The Seminoles switched from a zone to a man-for-man defense on signal.

the early stages and fell behind by 28-21 after grabbing a 14-8 lead. A pair of free throws by sophomore Charlie Long and baskets by Swain and Dave Fedor pulled FSU within one point before Clemson's All-Conference guard, Choppy Patterson, hit a field goal for a 30-27 Tiger lead at the halfway point.

It was State's first decision over Clemson in four tries. The team play a return match at Clemson next Monday.

FROSH WINS

In the preliminary, Fred Powers' Baby Seminoles used ball control and free throws to hand Chipola its third setback in eight games. Leading by 25-18 at the half, the FSU frosh took only 11 second-half shots from the floor—hitting four—but canned enough free throws for the five-point victory.

Guard Bobby Lovell of Chattanooga, Tenn., and Sam Butler of Daytona Beach scored 15 and 14 points, respectively, for FSU. Center Harold Clark of Gainesville bucketed 10, eight in the first half. Ronnie Myers led Chipola with 14 points.

Myers stole the ball and hit a solo layup to pare the Baby Seminoles' lead to 39-35 with 4:30 left. But Lovell sank a layup and sub-

sequently added four charity losses to put it on ice.

The FSU freshmen got their

stiffest test here Wednesday in a preliminary game with Florida's Baby Gators.
