

Dave Fedor, Florida State's graceful basketball sophomore from Zephyrhills, has established himself as the most accurate shooter in Seminole history.

Final 25-game statistics show Fedor finished his first varsity year with 214 field goals out of 453 attempts for a single-season FSU accuracy record of 47.2 per cent.

The 6-6 forward added 99 free throws for a season total of 527 points. It is the highest total ever recorded by a Seminole sophomore, topping by 18 the 509 points racked up by guard Hugh Durham in 1957.

A model of poise and consistency, Fedor scored double figures in all 25 FSU games. He bagged 20 points or more in 13 games and scored 28 or more points in five games. He averaged 30 points over FSU's last six games.

Fedor's season average of 21.1 points ranks him among the nation's top 40 scorers and the best five point-producers in the Southeast.

In his tremendous sophomore season, Fedor set six individual records. In addition to his field-goal accuracy and sophomore total-points marks, the 19-year-old southpaw set single-game records for most field goals (16 vs. Miami) and most rebounds (28 against both Jacksonville University and Rollins), and season records for most rebounds (400 for 16.0 average) and consecutive free throws (25 straight in a three-game span against Loyola, Miami, and Georgia).

In the next-to-last game against Miami's NCAA tournament-bound Hurricanes, Fedor tossed in 43 points to tie Durham's one-game scoring record set against Stetson in 1956.

Four of FSU's top five scorers were sophomores as the Seminoles finished with a 10-15 season chart, best since 1956. Five FSU losses were by margins of five points or less and 11 of the 15 losses came on the road.

Senior center John Richter of Gloversville, N. Y., was runner-up to Fedor in both scoring and rebounding. Richter had 270 points and 185 rebounds.

Following Richter were sophomores Jack Davis (231 points) of Hagerstown, Ind.; Ray Swain (206) of Jacksonville, and Rufus Ashworth (176) of Coral Gables. Ashworth missed the last nine games because of a fractured jaw.

Nine members of this year's 13-man varsity squad are scheduled to return next season. Seven of the nine have two seasons of eligibility remaining.
