

Ray (Swish) Swain and Dandy Dave Fedor zeroed in on the baskets in amazing fashion last night and their Seminole teammates took the cue in a record-setting 90-57 FSU basketball walloping of Furman's stunned Paladins.

FSU celebrated its final home game with the hottest shooting in Seminole history. Hitting 36 of 57 field goal attempts—exactly two of every three shots taken—Coach Bud Kennedy's Tribe closed with a remarkable 63.3 percentage.

HITS 12 OF 15

Swain, the 6-4 Jacksonville junior already firing at a school-record pace this season, poured in 12 of 15 shots. After missing his first two shots, junior Fedor finished with 8 of 11. Together, FSU's top scorers connected on 21 of 36 shots and racked up a total of 51 points, only six less than the Furman team total.

Swain wound up with 30 points, a Seminole season high and one more than Fedor's 29 points

against Tennessee. Fedor had 21 points. Scrappy guard Jack Davis pitched in with 15 points and Jerry Smith, FSU's only senior who started his first game last night, collected 10 points.

It was by far the most convincing triumph of FSU's 12 wins this season, and the biggest point total for the Seminoles since their 100-88 victory over the same Furman team at Greenville, S. C., last year.

Victors in eight of their past 18 games, the Seminoles (12-8) have four games remaining, all on the road. They run into Florida's red-hot Gators at Gainesville tomorrow night.

Hot from the start, FSU last night popped in 10 of 27 first-half shots (70.4 per cent) for a 47-28 halftime lead. After intermission, the Tribe canned 10 of 30 attempts (63.3 per cent) and scored 52 points, their biggest half of the season.

COLDEST NIGHT

Furman suffered its coldest night of the year and its worst setback in several seasons. The Paladins, who brought a 15-8 record into the game, went nearly six minutes before making their first field goal. They finished with 39 per cent from the floor.

With Swain and Fedor hitting, FSU piled up a 12-2 lead before Furman's Jerry Smith (the Paladins' high scorer with 18 points) made the visitors' first field goal with 5:40 gone. Employing a zone defense, Furman called a time out and adjusted to a man-for-man defense when FSU's lead climbed to 17-4 with 6:30 gone.

The defensive adjustment didn't help. FSU started clicking on its "Seminole Shuffle" offense and the lead was increased to 22 points with 3:30 left in the opening half.

Furman cut the margin to 17 points after seven minutes of the final half. But that was the closest the Paladins came.

A crowd of 3,000 urged the Seminoles to hit the century mark after a Swain push shot put the FSU total at 98 points with 50 seconds left. But reserve Ken Strasemeier, playing in his first game as a Seminole, mis-

sed the first foul shot on a one-and-one bonus situation.

A couple of hurried FSU shots went astray before Rufus Ashworth drew a foul with seven seconds left. Ashworth stepped to the line and the crowd roared as his first free throw was on target. But his second attempt was a trifle short, rebounding from the front of the rim, and FSU didn't get another chance to hit the 100-point mark.

Swain's 30-point burst boosted his scoring average from 16.5 to 17.2 points a game. Fedor, the game's top rebounder with 12, is averaging 19 points.

FSU's freshman team closed out its home campaign with a 91-53 romp over Brevard Junior College in the preliminary. Guard Bobby Lovell of Chattahoochee paced Fred Powers' Baby Seminoles with a season-high 40 points.
