

TAMPA—With sophomore dead-eye Charlie Long firing in 30 points and six players hitting double figures, Florida State went on a school-record scoring rampage in a 116-96 victory over Tampa's outclassed Spartans here last night.

FSU's previous school scoring high was set against Rollins in 1955, when the Seminoles racked up a 110-82 triumph. It was the 11th time in history that an FSU team scored over the 100-point mark.

Long, who scored 23 of his 30 points in the second half, matched teammate Ray Swain's 30-point performance against Furman earlier this week. Swain bagged 22 points last night.

Junior scoring leader Dave Fedor made 17 points, guard Jack Davis 15, guard Tim Edney 14, and forward Faurest Coogle 10. Don Boyt paced Tampa with 26 points.

It was Edney who pushed the Seminoles above 110 points. The Montgomery junior dropped in two free throws to give FSU a

111-89 lead with 2:01 left. The Seminoles led 57-48 at the half.

Twice in the late stages the Tribe led by 25 points. The Seminoles hit a season-high 39 field goals, canned a season-high number of free throws (38 of 50). Despite the record scoring burst, the Seminoles took only 73 shots — six less than Tampa — and finished its home schedule with a 10-15 mark.

The Seminoles drive to Miami today, where tonight they face a Miami team that is 19-6 for the season and undefeated in 14 games at home. FSU defeated the National Invitation Tournament-bound Hurricanes, 89-78, at Tallahassee last month.

FSU closes its most successful campaign since 1956 against Loyola at New Orleans next week.
