

Things may not be so bad for FSU's basketball team next season, after all.

Fans got a long look at several of the Seminoles' younger players in a 120-88 pounding of Rollins here last night. . . . They did better than the older ones.

Take sophomores Bob Ek, Dale Reeves and Wally Dale. Ek (6-2) potted five of five field-goal tries, Reeves (6-7) five of seven, Dale (6-9) five of eight.

Take juniors Charlie Long, Forrest Coogle and Dale Ricketts. Long (6-4) hit on six of seven, Coogle (6-3) on five of nine, Ricketts (6-1) on five of nine.

The Seminoles will graduate such front-line seniors as Dave Fedor, Ray Brown, Jack Davis, Robin Ashworth.

But, in addition to the soph and juniors who showed their muscle last night, FSU can count on some talent from one of its finest freshmen teams. Also available will be six redshirts.

Fedor led seven players who hit in double figures against Rollins, bagging 16 points. Reeves got 15, Long 14, Ricketts 13, Ek 11, Dale 11, Coogle 11.

The Seminoles peddling their season shooting average to 51.2 per cent as they hit 47 of 92 field-goal attempts for 51.1 per cent.

Winless Rollins, 0-11 now, sank only 14 field goals, had a percentage of 32.6.

The victory evened FSU's season record at 6-6, pushed a lead in the all-time series with Rollins to 17-2. Only once in their history have the Seminoles scored

more than 110 points. That was last year against Tampa in a 125-85 triumph. FSU scored 110 against this same Rollins back in '56.

It was a breeze all the way. FSU had 31-26 at the half, broke the 100-points barrier with 2:06 left.

Rollins got nearly half its points on free throws, bagging 25 of 49 chances. Phil Hurt, with 13 points, was the Tars' leader.

The Seminoles had a broad edge in rebounds, 58-to-30. Fedor led with 19.

The 57-points margin of victory provided the most one-sided triumph ever posted by an FSU basketball team.

FSU plays Miami here tomorrow night. The Hurricanes, 7-5 for the season, dropped a 74-63 game to Florida last night.

The freshmen play Pensacola Junior College in a 5:30 preliminary Saturday. A scheduled freshmen game here tonight against Gulf Coast Junior College was cancelled because of illness on the Panama City team.
