

Florida State's streaking basketball team routed Tampa, 123-83 here last night.

The Seminoles went into the game ranked No. 2 in the nation in field goal shooting, having hit 48.7 percent of their shots from the floor. The 82-of-72 effort last night raised their percentage to 52.2, which may overtake Ohio State leader in that department.

FSU's winner of six straight, now hit an amazing 26 of 29 the second half for 90 per cent.

The hot shooters for the Tribe were All-America candidate Dave Fedor, who finished with 38 points, and Ray Swain, who hit for 35 points.

Fedor threw 15 of 20 from the field for a superb 75 per cent. He hit eight of nine from the

free throw line. The 6-6 ace also led the Seminoles rebounding forces with 15 recoveries.

Swain, showing the top season average of all FSU field goal shooters, hit 15 of 18 for 83 per cent last night. He hit all five attempts from the free throw line.

Others turning in top field goal percentages were Wally Dale with four of six, Dale Reeves with four-of-four, Jack Davis, 3-of-5, Charlie Long, 2-of-3, Faurest Coogle, 2-of-2.

Harvey Mallis pushed through 23 points to spur Tampa. John Pellagrino hit for 21.

The Tampans outrebounded FSU, 46-33. Boyt and Chuk Engleking had 13 each for the Spartans, now 15-11 for the season.

FSU had trouble enough in the first half with Tampa.

The host club jumped to a 10-5 lead when Mallis hit a jump shot with 15:11 left in the first half. FSU got the lead for the first time with 8:03 left in the first half on Bob Ek's baseline jump shot. That made it 29-27.

The Seminoles were never headed from then on, steadily increasing their margin. They led by 15 points (59-34) with 3:03 left in the first half, held a 56-42 advantage at halftime.

FSU held 33-point leads four times during the second half. The last time came with 1:13 left when FSU's 5-11 sparkplug Davis hit a twisting hook shot over Tampa's tallest player, 6-10 Gary Kesler, to make it 121-88.

The victory pushed FSU's record to 14-8 for the season. The Seminoles close out at home against Georgia Friday night.
