Down 31-30 at halftime, Florida State's basketball team hit on 68% of its shots after intermission and dumped Tampa 92-60 in an opener here Saturday night

Providing a big spark was
6-5 sophomore Jerry Shirley,
whom Coach Bub Kennedy dressed out in a familiar number for
his first varsity game

Kennedy gave Shirley, a Mobile, Ala., boy, No. 43. That was the one worn by Dave Fedor the past three seasons. Now a pro with the San Francisco Warriors, Fedor came to be regarded as the best player in FSU history.

Shirley bagged nine of 12 fieldgoal attempts and finished the evening with 21 points.

Charley Long, lone returning starter from last year's fine tearn, sank 14 points and junior Bob Ek contributed 11.

After a cautious start, the Seminoles broke out in a profusion of errors.

At one early point, they held a 26-18 lead. Then Tampa started hitting steadily and finally recaptured the lead at 31-30 on a 3-point play by Chuck Andrews just before the halftime whistle.

FSU players sank only 31 per cent of their first-half shots.

With their hot late going, however, they ended the evening with an overall percentage of 49.4 per cent, just a shade below their nation-leading average of 51.2 per cent last season.

Shirley also pulled down 11 rebounds. Junior center Dala Reeves plucked 12 off the boards as the Sem noiseddima niocetchrthe Seminoles dominated the re-

covery phase throughout.

Dan Boyt, Tampa's 6-8 center, got 13 points and 6-0 guard George Shary had 14.

It was FSU's 21st victory in 30 starts against Tampa down through the years. Tampa returned three starters from a team that went 15-11 a season ago and

lost to FSU by 28 and 21 points
"I'm glad this one is out of
the way," said Kennedy, "Our
boys were just plain nervous out
there at the start. We have so
many players we're counting
heavily on this year who have
never played varsity ball before."

Not a free-fouling team last year, FSU had 27 infractions in this one, but they were well divided an no Seminole fouled out.

The Seminoles didn't capitalize well on their opportunities at the foul line, sinking only 55.2 per cent of the free ones versus Tampa's 68.4 per cent.

FSU plays Valdosta State here Monday night, and Florida here Thursday,

In a preliminary, FSU freshmen beat Manatee Junior College 72-43 as Bill Phillips led with 19 points.
