

Call Huge pushed in 10 points in the first eight minutes to pack a 19-8 lead, and Florida State's basketball team milled on to a 73-37 victory over Stetson here Saturday night.

It wasn't quite as easy as it sounds, and it might have been a real tussle save for a bushel of Stetson floor errors. Eventually, FSU began making more than a normal quota of mistakes itself.

Huge was hot all the way, however, racking 21 points for the evening. That was eight more than the 6-4 sophomore's previous game high of 13. He also plucked 11 rebounds.

ROUGH LATELY

Stetson had come into this one with five victories in six games, and is unbeaten in six Florida Intercollegiate Conference outings. The Hatters walked out with an 11-9 record.

The Hatters were never closer than four points after the early going. By halftime it was 42-33. Stetson pulled within five at the start of the second half. Then it was pretty much Johnny-bar-the-door.

FSU senior Charley Long slumbered down from his torrid pace of late, settled for 11 points after missing his first seven field-goal until 2:52, remained in the half,

Pete Rogers, who also got 11 for the night, teamed with Huge for the bulk of the early scoring and FSU was away winging. Stetson hit one fieldgoal in the first seven minutes.

After FSU stretched its lead to 24-12 Stetson rallied sharply. With 6-7 Lamar Deaver and 5-11 Floyd Gladden getting four points apiece, the Hatters trimmed things to 26-22.

REEVES HITS

In came Dale Reeves off the

bench with 6-36 to go in the half. He fired through eight of his 10 points for the evening in short order to spark the 42-33 halftime cushion.

On jumpers by Bill Hester and Gladden, Stetson narrowed the score to 48-37 just after intermission. Thereupon Long and Huge hit hard goals, Rogers got a 2-pointer and a pair of free throws, and Long pulled off a fast-break maneuver that made it 54-37.

A couple of times after that FSU led by as much as 30.

Hester was Stetson's high man with 13. Deaver got 10.

FSU led in rebounding, 44 to 33, hit 20 of 63 from the field for 46 per cent, versus Stetson's 28 of 51 for 41.1 per cent.

For once, the Seminoles got the best of it at the free-throw line, sinking 15 of 20 while Stetson dropped in 13 of 24.

It was the Seminoles' 13th victory in 21 games. Next action is here Monday against Centenary.

FROSH ROMP

FSU's freshmen squad romped to an 83-62 victory over Old Southern Food, a Jacksonville AAU team, as Gary Schull pulled down a whopping 24 rebounds.

Bill Phillips, Ken Leakey and Bill Peacock racked 21, 20 and 19 points for the Baby Seminoles. Ed Johnson got 21 for the victors, who held a 37-35 lead at the half.
